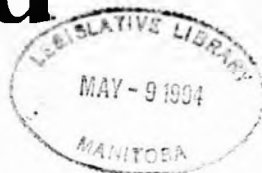

## New Plant Proposed 250 New Jobs Possible



Local logging contractor Marc Guimond is in the process of setting up an organization to bring an OSB plant to this community.

Capital cost of the project is expected to be in the region of \$50 million, 250 new jobs would be created.

OSB, Oriented Strand Board, is a chip board with the structural qualities of plywood. Chip board (wafer board) comes in three grades, the familiar board, with chips randomly arranged, and two varieties of OSB, either with chips in the outside layers "oriented" in one direction to give additional strength, or with both the inside and outside layers arranged in opposite directions. This grade is structurally equivalent to plywood and is rapidly gaining acceptance as a plywood substitute.

In the Northern United States and Canada the preferred raw material for OSB is trembling aspen (white poplar) To support a \$50 million project approximately 400,000 cu. m. per year of poplar would be required. (This is close to the volume of pulpwood currently used by the Abitibi newsprint mill).

The actual size depends on the volume of poplar available. If it is found that sufficient raw material is available the resource could support a \$100 million project and create more than 400 jobs. However in Marc Guimond's opinion this is not likely.

Guimond has been work-

ing with Rea Poulin Snell, of the St Georges Economic Development Committee, on the project. They have completed a pre-feasibility study, have met with government officials and Abitibi Price Woods Department Management. They have also had discussions with manufacturers of OSB and have been told that the viability of an OSB plant is almost 100% dependent on availability of raw material. The spruce and fir "peelable logs" needed for plywood is in increasingly short supply and the construction industry is looking to OSB as a replacement.

Consultants will be selected next week to carry out a market study and to determine the availability of wood supply. They will use the provincial governments GIS computer data bank of satellite photographs of the area to

determine the age and volume of poplar within a 150 mile radius of Pine Falls. The study is scheduled to be completed by the end of January.

The location of the plant has not been determined, but according to Guimond, will almost be within the Local Government District of Alexander. The facility will need a 200 acre site, a rail spur, and will have to be located on a Class 1 highway.

One of the side benefits of the OSB project will be better management of the forest. With the harvesting of another species more options will become available in planning the renewal of the forest. Logging operating costs will also be reduced in areas where both softwood and poplar are harvested because the infrastructure to support softwood logging e.g. logging roads will already be in place.

## New National Park Proposed For Manitoba Lowlands

Government of Manitoba Press Release

The Manitoba government had moved a step closer to creating another opportunity for a national park in the province, Natural Resources Minister Albert Driedger has announced. A feasibility study will soon be conducted focusing primarily on options for national park designation in the Long Point and Hecla/Grindstone areas of the Low-

lands region. The Long Point area is unique because of its diverse vegetation and varied land forms, while the Hecla/Grindstone area displays tremendous habitat and wildlife diversity. Manitoba has determined that the Little Limestone Lake area should be excluded from consideration as a national park because of a very high mineral potential.

## Well Known Children's Author Visits Powerview and Pine Falls Schools

On November 15, 1993 students in Powerview and Pine Falls were among thousands of children across Canada to enjoy a visitation by an author or illustrator on tour during Canadian Children's Book Week, November 13 - 20, 1993.

In Manitoba non-fiction writer Valerie Wyatt visited eleven schools in Southern Manitoba. Ms. Wyatt visited Mme Lambert's grade 6 science class in Powerview and Ms. Morash's grade 3/4 class in Pine Falls.

Ms. Wyatt began by providing the students with an overview of her books and giving the students some information about her background and why she came to be a writer of science books for children. Her first book Inventions: An amazing investigation came about as a result of a telephone call from her publisher. It is an amazing investigation into all sorts of inventions which most of us take for granted being a part of our every day life. To make her point Wyatt asked, "Have you ever thought of how you would keep your underwear up if no one had invented elastic?" Everyone was intrigued when they heard the story of hoe the Indians from South America dipped their bare feet

in sap from the rubber tree, heated it up to form a semi-permanent rubber sole which was actually the predecessor to our present day sneakers.

When talking about her book "Weatherwatch", she showed the students a LP record and asked them if they had ever seen a snowflake that large. As it happens, the largest snowflake to be recorded was actually this size.

The major portion of Ms. Wyatt's presentation was focused on her most recent title "The Science Book for girls and other Intelligent Beings." She explained that she had originally intended this book to be on electricity but when she went to the children's workshop on the topic she found that out of 19 participants only 2 were girls and she began to wonder why. When she asked the boys why there were no girls there, they replied that they were afraid of electricity. When she asked the girls why they were there, they replied that they were unable to get into the workshop of their choice. It was then that she decided that there was a need to write a book especially for girls to try and keep them interested in science and to show how science is really a part of our everyday lives.

Ms. Wyatt conducted a number of experiments with the students. The first was to determine which of three breakfast cereals would stay crisp the longest. One lucky student in each of the schools was able to have to have a second breakfast by testing the cereals at regular intervals. Both classes determined that out of Cheerios, Cornflakes and Crispex, Crispex remained crisper the longest.

The best "head stander" in each class was asked to come forward for the next question which was "Can you swallow food up?" While one student was standing on his/her head another fed a banana. In both schools the results were the same, the answer is yes! Both of the classes had many, many questions to ask and all of them were answered except for the inevitable "How old are you?" A particularly attentive student in Powerview had noticed that Ms. Wyatt's birthday was on November 14, the day before. When the session ended in Powerview, Ms. Wyatt was thanked on behalf of everyone and was presented with a cake while everyone sang "Happy Birthday".

After the readings Ms. Wyatt thanked everyone for her wonderful warm welcome.

# DO YOU KNOW WHICH PHONE WIRING YOU NOW OWN?

In the past, as a single-line telephone customer, all inside phone wiring in your home, outbuilding or business was the property of MTS, and only MTS was authorized to maintain and make repairs to that system

As of June 1, 1993 the Public Utilities Board approved the transfer of ownership of inside phone wiring, and phone wiring extending from a main building to an outbuilding, to the property owner. As a result, you now have a choice in determining who will maintain and repair your inside telephone wiring - MTS, yourself, or an independent contractor. MTS owns and will continue to own the outside wiring extending to the pedestal or pole.

**KNOW YOUR PHONE WIRING**

There are two types of phone wiring. **Inside wiring** runs from a telephone jack in your home, office, or outbuilding (barn, garage, workshop, etc.) to a protector located inside or outside the building. This protector is called a NID (Network Interface Device). **Outside wiring** is any wiring that runs between buildings on the same property and connects to a NID.

**EXTENSIONS TO OUTBUILDINGS**

Normally, when you have a phone extension in an outbuilding, the wiring will go directly from your home or office to the outbuilding, or from NID to NID. You now own this wiring.

In some cases, the wiring for the extension runs from the outbuilding NID to the main pedestal/pole. MTS continues to own this wiring.

**ADDITIONAL LINES TO OUTBUILDINGS**

The wiring for line(s) in an outbuilding is normally provided by extending the wiring from the main pedestal/pole to the NID on the outbuilding. MTS owns this wiring.

In some cases, it may be more cost-effective for MTS to add the second line by extending the wiring from the NID at the house or office to the NID at the outbuilding. As it is a separate line, MTS will own this wiring.

If there is already an extension in the outbuilding, and you require an additional line in the outbuilding as well, MTS may install the new circuit through the existing wire, if it has spare capacity. MTS will assume responsibility for this wiring, since it now carries a second line with a new telephone number.

MTS will provide a new circuit to an outbuilding, if requested by the customer. Standard installation and monthly access rates will apply.

**TWO OPTIONAL MAINTENANCE PROGRAMS**

For protection against unexpected repair charges we are offering two optional maintenance programs, **Wire Watch™** and **Wire Watch Plus™**. Property owners and/or tenants of multi-tenant buildings may subscribe to these plans.

As a courtesy, MTS will continue to provide free repair services for inside wire until May 31, 1994.
