# Keith Clark Takes Over Pine Pharmacy

Keith Clark became the new owner of Pine Pharmacy on Tuesday February 1. He said he wants to carry on in the same tradition established by Fred Welsh; "health first, business second."

Born in Winnipeg in 1960, Clark moved to the family farm in Melita with his family in 1962. He graduated from high school at 17 years old and entered the University of Manitoba. After two years in chemistry he switched to

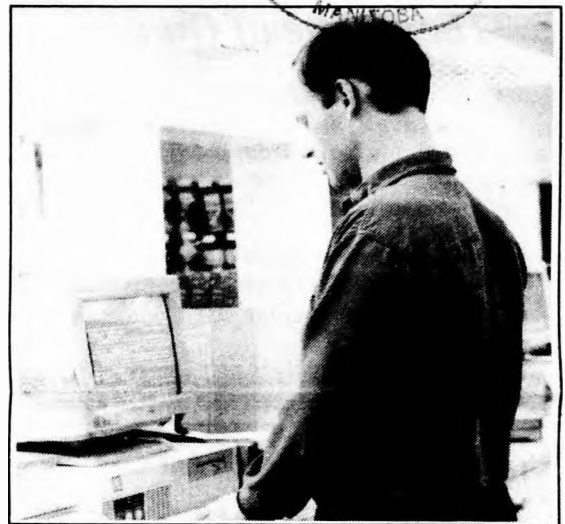
pharmacy and graduated in 1984.

He heard from other pharmacy graduates of "this unique person" in Pine Falls who was looking for a pharmacist. He telephoned Fred Welsh, came out to Pine Falls on April 27, 1984, and began work at the pharmacy in May. He said of Welsh, "he treated everyone absolutely equally, no matter who they were."

He said his first impression of Pine Falls was that

there were more trees, it was beautiful, but a little bit intimidating after the wide open prairie of South Western Manitoba.

Clark said he likes the small town atmosphere of this community. On the family farm outside Melita his nearest neighbour was two miles away. But he said the community atmosphere of Melita is quite similar to Pine Falls.

## Powerview Hires Dog Catcher

The Village of Powerview has hired its own dog catcher. Rick Brown, of St. Georges, began enforcing the village Dog Control By-Law on February 1.

Prior to assuming his new duties Brown took a one week course from the Humane Society in Winnipeg. He will be patrolling the village once a day and will be responding to any complaints from the public.

The Village has a contract with the Winnipeg Humane Society. Dogs caught at large in Powerview will be taken to Winnipeg, and held for five days. Owners will be required to pick up their dogs in Winnipeg. A fee of \$75 will be payable.

### First Responders

First Responders 1992,

have worked very hard in order that a Rescue Unit, manned by volunteers be available to residents of Victoria Beach, and all of Ward one, of the L.G.D. This emergency unit is located in Victoria Beach, and due to its close proximity to the residents of the beaches area, volunteers can attend quickly, and stabilize a seriously ill, or injured patient until the arrival of the Pine Falls Ambulance. The age and mileage on the rescue wagon prevents its use in the transporting of patients, as insurance rules do not allow this.

Through the help of dedicated volunteers, the van, donated by Pine Falls Ambulance, has been given a face lift, with a new paint job, and decals. The equipment used was placed in the van by the same volunteers. To date some 35 calls have been received, and answered, from as far away as Gull Lake. Some of these were definitely life threatening. The care and treatment given by the first responders, until the arrival of the ambulance, saved a number of lives.

The rescue unit is a volunteer project, and financial support is needed. Associate membership can be obtained through Diane McCaw at 756-2571. Non removable, registered to purchaser, identification stickers are also available at the nominal cost of \$5.00. These stickers, to be used on your appliances, (microwave ovens) stereo equipment or computers are sold as a method of raising funds. Cash donations would also be appreciated, and later in the spring, donation boxes will be placed in all retail outlets in the beaches area. Please consider giving this very worthwhile unit your support.....your own life may someday be saved because you did!

### Sports Medicine Corner

Nosebleeds are common sports injuries and can occur because of contact in virtually

every sport. The amount of bleeding from the nose that can occur can range from minor to profuse. Unless the mechanism of the injury indicated a serious facial injury, nasal bleeding is usually easy to control.

What to do: Do not pack the nostrils, but let the athlete sit and lean forward to keep blood from draining down the airways. Next, have the athlete pinch his or her nostril shut. This will control most bleeding. An ice pack or a cold pack applied to the nose may help stop the bleeding. The athlete should be encouraged to sit up and lean slightly forward. Tilting the head back should not be suggested as this may allow blood to enter the lungs, which may lead to choking.

The by-law provides for penalties from \$10 for failure to purchase a licence, fines of \$25 to \$500 for permitting a dog to bark or howl, damage property or failure to remove excrement from property other than the property of the owner and up to \$1,000 for interference with, or obstruction of, a dog catcher or peace officer.
