Lac du Bonnet RM plans to annex part of LGD "Tax grab" says Reeve Danwich

The Rural Municipality of Lac du Bonnet is seeking to annex the Bird River Area and to extend its western border to include the MacArthur Falls Generating Station (now part of Ward IV of the LGD of Alexander).

At a council meeting Nov. 29 the RM passed a resolution to petition provincial Rural Development Minister Len Derkach to approve the annexation.

Borders of rural municipalities can be changed by the minister responsible. This can happen by mutual consent of the municipalities involved. It is an infrequent but normal process. A growing town, for example, expanding into a rural area will seek to annex the

area which has become part of the town.

But the annexation by the RM of Lac du Bonnet is not with the consent of the LGD of Alexander.

LGD Reeve Ken Danwich said "we will protest for sure. We've spent a lot of money up there. We think we've been awfully good to the people there."

He said they (the RM) seem to be very disorganized. "They don't seem to know what they're going to annex," he said. "What they're looking for is a tax grab"

Danwich said the proposal has to go to Derkach first, but the LGD plans to force the process to a municipal hearing - "Then we will all be spending money on law-

yers" he said, "and only lawyers will benefit."

"They talked to us about it a little while back" said Danwich, "but we didn't take them seriously." He said they should have talked to the LGD before they took the step of passing a formal resolution. He said he hates to see bad feelings between the municipalities.

Sandy Kapeluch, LGD Ward IV councillor agrees with Danwich she said they're looking for the Ward IV taxes, but wonders what they would do for the area.

She also doubts that the area would get fair representation in the RM where councillors are elected at large instead of under a ward system.

Gilbert Labine - The man with the golden touch

That very summer, 1924 he flew up to Great Bear Lake in the North West Territories, and while there showed his keen prospector's nose for a hot property by spotting from the air strange pinkish colours in the rocks along the shore. LaBine speculated that these colours might be cobalt bloom, which would indicate the presence of cobalt and silver, as it did in the mines at Cobalt, Ontario where he had first worked. The season was too late for prospecting, so he flew back up the next summer to the same place. It is at this time that LaBine showed his true genius as a prospector. He had, years before, studied

geology at the Haileybury School of Mines near Cobalt, and while there was shown samples of pitchblende ore by one of his teachers. Pitchblende was highly prized at the time as the source of radium used in the treatment of cancer. It took huge amounts of pitchblende ore to produce one gram of the precious radium, which was therefore worth far more than gold. There were only two known sources of pitchblende in the world - in Czechoslovakia, and in the former Belgian Congo. Now LaBine knew from his studies that pitchblende was found in conjunction with silver and cobalt, and he also knew how to recognize it, by

its colour (black) and its weight (heavier than lead). He was one of the few prospectors in Canada who could recognize pitchblende ore. So when he found a heavy piece of black rock the size of a plum near the patch of cobalt bloom, he was sure he had found pitchblende. He promptly staked 2 claims on the spot, later known as LaBine Point, and went on to explore the surrounding area with an eye to staking more claims. Time was of the essence, because other prospectors were also getting interested in the area. At one point he came across a party of prospectors actually camped on the very spot he planned to stake, and cooking their supper there. But they were only looking for gold and had no interest whatsoever in other funny looking rocks, so they moved on.

The money Gilbert LaBine had raised from sale of stock in Eldorado Gold Mines in Manitoba was used to bankroll his new mine at Great Bear Lake, which he also called Eldorado Gold Mines, even though no gold ever came

out of it. This mine, as well as producing the prized uranium, had an added bonus. It also had huge amounts of high grade uranium ore. Now uranium was considered a worthless by-product at the time, used only as a paint additive in pottery making. LaBine however, with his golden touch, had the foresight to stockpile most of it, with the excess being dumped into Lake Ontario at his radium refinery at Port Hope. It may still be there for all I know. When World War II broke out and the Allies started work on the atom bomb, the value of this uranium was suddenly realized. LaBine's mine was the only North American source of uranium, so the Canadian Government expropriated it from LaBine in 1942, renaming it Eldorado Mining and Refining Limited.

When the war was over LaBine, as if to prove his strike at Great Bear Lake wasn't a fluke, went on to discover and develop another profitable uranium property on Lake Athabaska in Northern Saskatchewan. And once again, a little mine in the Bissett area was a major source of fund-

ing. While working on the Eldorado Gold Mine near Long Lake, LaBine had become involved with another property in the area, the Gunnar Gold Mines at Beresford Lake. This mine, staked by LaBine's old partner William Walton, Willie Quesnel of Manigotagan, and the brothers Leo Seaberg and Gunnar Berg (after whom the mine was named) had turned to LaBine for financing, and LaBine was put on the Board of Directors. The Gunnar Mine operated from 1933 to 1942, when it closed due to lack of ore, and the manpower shortage. Once again however, as with the Eldorado, the Gunnar shares were never cashed in by the shareholders. Therefore when LaBine needed financing for his new mine in Saskatchewan, he used the assets of these old Gunnar shares, which he had access to as a director of the company. He named his new mine Gunnar Uranium. Any shareholders who had been smart enough to hold on to their original Gunnar shares, at a time they weren't worth the paper they were printed on, suddenly found themselves rolling in money when the value of the stock skyrocket-

eted from 20 cent a share to \$23, practically overnight. There are reports of people having whole drawersful of the old stock, and cashing in on the bonanza. One such person was the prospector Willie Quesnel and his family. I actually attended United College (now the University of Winnipeg) back in the '50s with Willie Quesnel's son Wally, who was benefiting from the family's good fortune. Rumours always circulated around Bissett that the mine Carpenter John Hafidson was another lucky shareholder. His granddaughter Lenore Berscheid, when contacted about this said she didn't know anything about her grandfather's windfall, but his son Orville Hanson verified that both he and his Dad profited through the sale of their old Gunnar stock. Whether people like the Seaforth shareholders enjoyed a similar bonanza when LaBine developed his radium mine using their assets is not recorded, but it seems likely that at least some of them did. Once again, the words of Stephen Leacock best describe what these lucky shareholders must have felt like. In this excerpt Jefferson Thorpe, Mariposa town barber, had been holding on to some shares of Northern Star stock, even though their value had plummeted. Now his tenacity is about to be rewarded: "And then - well, that's just the queer thing about the mining business, Why, sudden as a flash of lightning, it seemed, the news came over the wire to the Mariposa Newspacket, that they had struck a vein of silver in the Northern Star as thick as a sidewalk, and that the stock had jumped to seventeen dollars a share, and even at that you couldn't get it! And Jeff stood there flushed and half-staggered against the mirror of his little shop, with a bunch of mining scrip in his hand that was worth forty thousand dollars!" (from Sunshine Sketches of a Little Town, by Stephen Leacock)

Bissett, Gilbert LaBine was able to bring into production two of Canada's leading uranium mines. Without Eldorado and Gunnar in Manitoba there would have been no mine at Great Bear Lake, and no uranium rush in Saskatchewan, leading to the development of the whole complex of mines around Uranium City which greatly added to the Post War prosperity of the country as a whole, and Saskatchewan in particular. And without the secure source of uranium from Great Bear Lake it is quite possible that the Allies might never have developed the atom bomb, or very likely would

have been beaten by the Nazis in their race to build it during the war. What a difference that would have made, both good and bad, to recent history.

And all because Gilbert LaBine was a man with the golden touch.

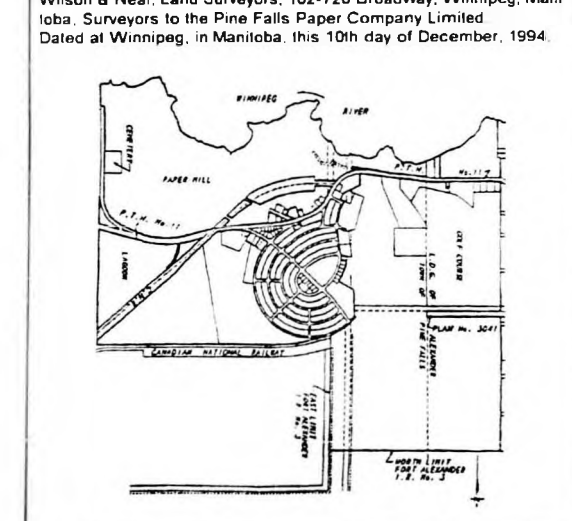
