Pine Falls/Powerview Graduation Ceremonies

Powerview and Pine Falls Collegiate Graduation took place Thursday, June 29, 1995 with a total of thirty-five grads this year.

The day started off with a short church service at 1:00 pm in the Powerview Church.

Ceremonies began at 4:00 pm in the Pine Falls Gym with *Multiple Choice* (the local barber shop quartet) singing O'Canada.

Greetings were said on behalf of the Pine Falls School Board by Ria Poluin-Snell, followed by greetings from the Agassiz School Division, Cheryl Hamilton, Pine Falls Paper Company, Fern Pitre, and from Superintendent of Agassiz School Division Waldo Klassen.

Awards and Scholarships were then presented as follows:

Order of the Eastern Star Award - Pine Falls Chapter (\$100) awarded to a deserving student who has achieved success through perseverance and hard work - Ian Kemball.

Winnipeg River Lions' Scholarship (\$300) awarded to a student who has demonstrated excellence in academics and extra-curricular and community activities and who is entering post secondary studies - Kelly Pinnell.

Great Falls Women's Institute Award (\$50) awarded to a student in their final year of high school who has exemplified attitudes of excellence in academics and citizenship - Mae Albay.

MLA Book Prize for Citizenship awarded to a student who has demonstrated exemplary contributions to school and community - Chantelle LaFreniere, Kelly Pinnell.

Chartered Accountants Award (\$200) awarded to a student with an average above 80% in university entrance subjects who is entering university and has shown leadership in school and community affairs - Marnie Tardiff.

Winnipeg River Women's Institute (\$50) awarded to a student proceeding on to post secondary education in social services, child care or education - Vanessa James.

LGD of Alexander

Scholarship (\$500) awarded to a deserving student residing in the LGD of Alexander and who will be entering a post secondary institution, has shown excellence in citizenship and has achieved standing with the top five of the graduating class - Dominique Avanthay.

Village of Powerview Scholarship (\$500) awarded to a deserving student residing in Powerview entering post secondary institution - Chantelle LaFreniere.

Town of Pine Falls Scholarship (\$500) awarded to a deserving student residing in Pine Falls and entering a post secondary institution - Kelly Pinnell.

L'Oeuvre de Bourse (\$500) awarded to a student in the French Immersion Program, who has achieved high academic standing and preferably is taking post secondary education in the French language - Dominique Avanthay.

Canadian Parents for French Award (\$100) presented to a student in the French Immersion Program, who has achieved high academic standing and preferably is taking post secondary education in the French language - Dominique Avanthay.

The Principal's Award (\$100) presented to the student who has made the most outstanding contribution to the school and the community - Chantelle LaFreniere.

The Winnipeg River Historical Project Group Award (\$500) awarded to a student who will be continuing their education next year in the field of history or social sciences - Vanessa James.

The Agassiz "Top Student Award" (\$200 and medal) awarded to a student with the highest average in five university level courses - Dominique Avanthay.

The Ralph Logan Memorial Scholarship (\$300) awarded to the student who has the highest average in Science and Mathematics and is entering post secondary education - Jason Carriere.

Chown Centennial Scholarship (\$500) awarded to the student attending the

University of Manitoba who has a minimum average of 80% in five university credits - Marnie Tardiff.

The C.C. Irvine Memorial Scholarship (\$500) presented to the graduating student with the highest academic average in university entrance courses and proceeding on to post secondary education - Dominique Avanthay.

The Governor General

Bronze Medal (Honorary Medal) awarded to the student with the highest average - Kelly Pinnell.

Eunice Cyr and Jack Shwaluk were the guest speakers again this year. They did a wonderful job. Eunice spoke on "niceness" while Jack spoke on "good class, bad class".

Diplomas were presented followed by the Valedictory

Voices of Tomorrow

First graduation from new Anicinabe High School

The Sagkeeng High School celebrated not only its first year in a beautiful new building, but also the first year of a very new educational policy. With an emphasis on quality rather than quantity while at the same time meeting the social needs of students, the school hopes to graduate students who have both the social and academic skills to enable them to succeed.

Sagkeeng Chief Jerry Fontaine referred to the new philosophy in his address to the graduating class and its emphasis on quality, not quantity. "We have to come back to the very basics of teaching - to respect and to love each other." He said. "If we don't we lose not only the basic teaching of the Anicinabe people, but one of the basic human values.

Sagkeeng teacher Liz Gray said it was a great honour to be speaking at the graduation of Melodie Abraham and Kevin Pepin. "Those who have had the opportunity to know these individuals during this school year will recognise that there is great potential in both of them." She said.

Speaking to Kevin, who demonstrated considerable acting talent during the school year, but intends to follow a career in teaching, she said - "Kevin. In the world of acting, or the world of anything, talent will get you in the door, but an ability to work with people and create a positive environment is what will keep that door open. You've got all that Kevin. Whatever you choose to do in the future these motivating qualities you have, your gifts, will take you a long, long way."

Turning to Melodie, she said.

Melodie Abraham received the \$500 George M. Guimond Personal Care Home Award which is awarded to the student who best displays qualities of perseverance.

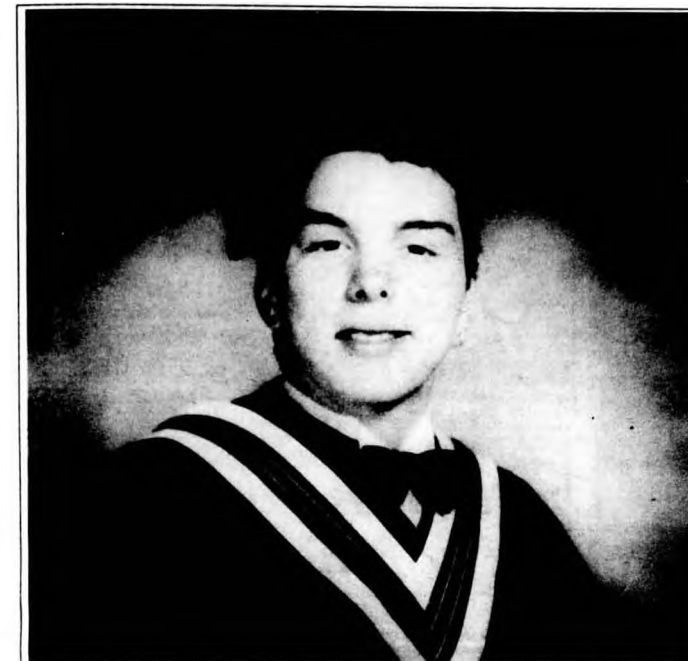

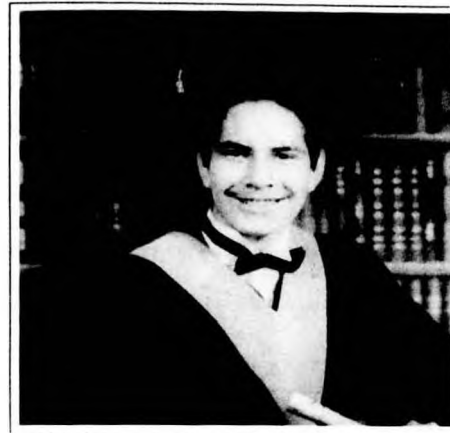

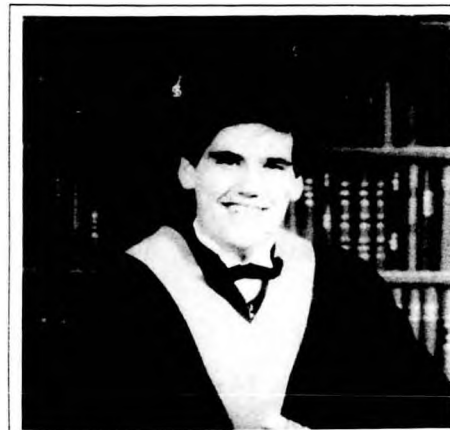
