PAPER KINGS TO PLAY IN HTHL THIS SEASON

On September the 18th the two executive members of the Kings attended a meeting with a proposal to enter the H.T.H.L. After a lengthy discussion with the executive members of the H.T.H.L., Barry Cyr and Laurent Raymond left with a good feeling about what was said. On September 22 Gerry Fender the President of the H.T.H.L. called the Kings executive and made it official. "The Pine Falls Paper Kings will play the 95-96 season in the Hanover Tache Hockey League."

Without all the details worked out, the Kings will play 12 home games and 12 games away. The regular season will start about mid November followed by playoffs in February running through March.

The H.T.H.L. is made up of 8 teams, Ste. Anne Aces, Steinbach Huskies, Niverville Clippers, St. Jean, Ile Des Chenes, Grunthal, La Broquerie and Pine Falls.

Excited about the new season the Kings will hold a mini camp about the third week in October. All eligible players are welcome to attend including any volunteers that can aid in hockey operations. So all you players get off the couch, get that bag of chips out of your hand and start getting in shape!

MANITOBA MODEL FOREST OFFICE OPENS

David Iftody, MP, cut through the grapevine Friday, September 29 officially opening the new Manitoba Model Forest Office and gaining first hand experience with the projects of the Model Forest at the same time.

The vine cutting ceremony was part of a day long tour for Iftody of model forest projects and communities.

"I wanted to see for myself what the Model Forest was all about," said Iftody. "Visit the sites where research was being conducted and meet some of the people behind them."

Iftody was recently appointed to the Natural Resources committee and after hearing through the grapevine what the Model Forest was doing wanted to find out first hand.

Iftody began his tour in Lac du Bonnet where he discovered that hundreds of reports about Model Forest projects were being produced next door to his Lac du Bonnet constituency office on the

presses of the Lac du Bonnet Leader.

Pinawa was the next stop on Iftody's voyage of discovery. There he met with members of the community involved with the Model Forest's Demonstration Woodlot and visited Ironwood Trail, a project funded by the Model Forest in partnership with the Deep Water Science Academy.

While visiting Flying Pigment Design in Pinawa, Iftody discovered copies of the yet to be distributed Manitoba Model Forest Annual Report and new Project Map brochure, both fresh from the printer.

Slated for distribution this week, Iftody acquired his own copies before continuing his tour.

Following the vine cutting ceremony and presentation of a cheque for more than \$118,000.00 accepted by local directors on behalf of the Manitoba Model Forest, Iftody met with caribou researchers and had a crash course in Global Positioning System and Geographic Infor-

mation System technology.

The satellite technology is being used to accurately track caribou, map forest stands and map other prominent features and project locations within the Model Forest. The technology has allowed for the development of the most up to date and complete Forest Resource Inventory in the Province.

"It's obvious the Model Forest is doing more than looking at the resources of the forest in this region," observed Iftody. "It's helping to protect natural resources for all of Manitoba, all of Canada for that matter."

Iftody concluded his tour by touring the Pine Creek Trail and visiting various regeneration and harvesting projects throughout the Manitoba Model Forest Region.

He toured the Eastern Ontario Model Forest October 2nd, 1995 with more than 50 other Members of Parliament.

The Eastern Ontario Model Forest is located outside of Ottawa.

DIGITAL GOLF

Golf can only be played during the summer months in a climate such as ours.

For this reason, personal computer golf games are very popular with the golf crowd. And, a game that golfers will certainly take to is The Skins Games, from Interplay.

The Skins Game is a

Microsoft Windows based game. The suggested system requirements are a 33MHz or better 486, Windows 3.1, 6 megs of RAM, 5 megs of free hard disk space, a Soundblaster compatible sound card, and a minimum of a double-speed CD-ROM drive. The game will run on a single-speed CD-ROM, but the action will be jerky.

The installation routine is a simple Windows based function. And, once the game is installed, the user manual offers a page dedicated to those that just can't wait to play the game. Following the instructions on the page will allow you to get out on the course and knock some balls around. But, as in any other program, you should read the whole manual to get a complete understanding of how the program works.

You will initially be offered a choice of playing either a regulation golf game or a skins game. In a skins game, each hole will be worth a certain amount of money, with the amount increasing on holes 7 and 13. Each player plays one ball. If two or more players tie for low score on a hole, the prize money is added to the next hole or 'skin'.

When one player beats

another on a hole, then they win all the accumulated money.

When you choose to play skins, you may also determine the starting bet. There are also default amounts that correspond to the amounts offered on televised skins games. For club selection, you may use a pre-selected bag of clubs, or you may customize the club selection.

The graphics shown in The Skins Game are actual photos from the Bighorn Country Club. If you like your games to be photo-realistic, then this one is for you. When you are at the tee, you are looking down the actual fairway from Bighorn. Very impressive. When you are at the tee, a human voice will describe not only the difficulty of the hole, but may also offer advice on how to best play that hole.

Placing the cursor in the upper portion of the screen will show the position of the flag. A compass on the screen also indicates the wind direction and speed. The Skins Game will recommend the appropriate club, but you may override this decision at any time.

The map button will

produce a detailed map of the current hole including fairway and green contours, distance to the pin and your lie. So, now that you know where the pin is and what the layout of the hole is, you are ready to drive the ball down the fairway.

You use the aim indicator to direct your drive according to wind speed and direction. When you click on the golfer (an actual picture of a golfer), the swing bar indicator will allow you to select the distance that the shot will carry, and whether the shot will hook or slice. Clicking on the swing bar when the indicator is right on zero should produce a straight shot. Very much the actual game of golf, driving and putting accuracy depend a lot on practice.

When the ball is driven down the fairway, you are susceptible to the normal maladies of golf such as bunkers, the rough, and out of bounds shots. This is a little too much like a real golf game. And, as in the other graphics displayed in The Skins Game, the pictures of the rough and other obstacles are also totally realistic.

When you reach the green, you will be informed as to the distance from the ball to the pin, and the direction of slope of the green. The direction that the green breaks is also shown. Sink a good putt, and you will receive applause from the 'gallery'.

Other options available in The Skins Game include asking your caddy for tips on how to avoid Bighorn's roughs and ravines. You may also specify if 'gimmies' will be allowed. If not, all putts must be completed.

For those cold winter days when you would like to be out on a golf course, why not choose the next best thing...a few rounds at Bighorn Country Club. The Skins Game is distributed by Interplay, 17922 Fitch Avenue, Irvine, Ca 92714.

COMMUNITY HEALTH WATCH - The flu

"What is the Flu?"

Influenza is the proper name for "the flu." It is a highly contagious disease caused by a virus. You may experience symptoms much like having a common cold, but flu symptoms are much more serious. They include: fever, headache, body aches, and pains, weakness, sneezing, sore throat, cough and sniffles. And people with the flu are frequently bedridden for 5 - 10 days.

The real dangers of influenza are the complications that can arise from it. True influenza leaves your body weak and open to other infections. The influenza immunization program provides influenza vaccine to individuals who are at risk of complications.

Influenza vaccine is provided to the following risk groups:

Adults and children with chronic cardiac or pulmonary disorders (including

bronchopulmonary dysplasia, cystic fibrosis and asthma) severe enough to require regular medical follow-up or hospital care.

People of any age who are residents of nursing homes and other chronic care facilities.

People 65 years of age and over.

Adults and children with chronic conditions such as diabetes and other metabolic diseases, cancer, immunodeficiency (including HIV infections,) renal disease, anaemia and hemoglobinopathy.

Children and adolescents (age 6 months to 18 years) with conditions treated with acetylsalicylic acid for long periods.

Health care and other personnel who have hands on contact with people in the high risk groups previously described.

Household contacts (including children) of people at high risk who either cannot be vaccinated or may respond inadequately to vaccination.

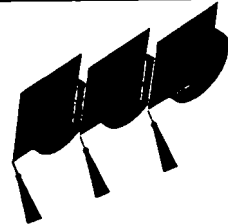
