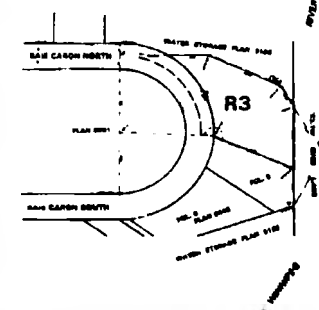

# AECL Nuclear waste disposal hearings to start in March

PINAWA - The Nuclear Fuel Waste Management and Disposal Environmental Assessment Panel announced that public hearings on AECL's waste disposal concept will begin next March. The Panel is reviewing AECL's concept for deep geological disposal of Canada's nuclear fuel waste.

AECL to provide additional information on the long-term safety of disposal. Such a request is common in Canadian environmental assessment practice and is part of the assessment process.

AECL's concept is not site-specific and AECL does not have the mandate to recommend any specific sites.

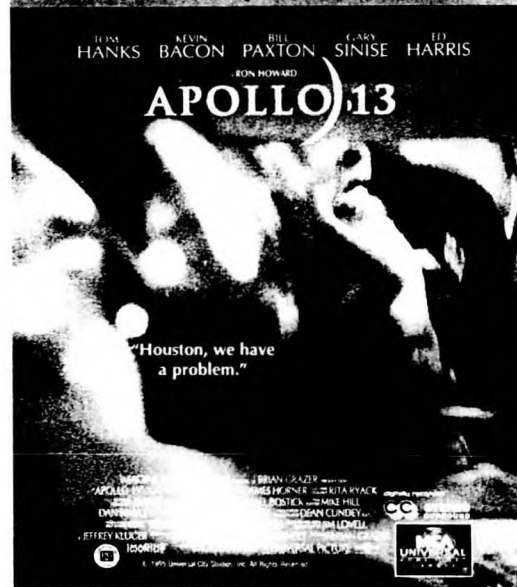

**Advantages**

- Because a home-based business requires less startup money, I won't have to pay rent, have a separate business telephone, buy office furniture, buy separate tools and so on.

- Because I can use my time better, I won't have to spend time travelling to and from my work, I can use small and large blocks of time as they become available during my daily schedule.

- Because I can still do things I have to or want to do at home (childcare, farm work, housework).

- Because I can be close to the comforts of home, it feels safer and more comfortable to be near the familiar things of my home.

- I can be close to my family. For example, my spouse and I can talk or be close when we please, my children can see what I do, and I can keep track of what they do. It can bring us closer together.

- A home-based business is less of a commitment. If I'm not sure I really want to do this, or if I'm not sure I can make a go of it, I won't risk so much when I try it at home.

- With the business at home, it's easier for other family members to help out. For example, my spouse can answer the phone for me.

- I can do better work when I work for myself, be-

cause then I can be sure that things are done right.

- I can feel pride in the business and have prestige in my community.
