**More mines expected at Bissett**

**Easy access, provincial incentives make Bissett area attractive**

Hugh Wynne, Mayor of Bissett, and a drilling contractor, says there is an excellent chance of a new mine in the Bissett area.

"There is probably at least one or two mines that haven't been discovered yet. There are literally hundreds of gold occurrences in this area." He said.

Wynne said exploration has been picking up since Rea Gold announced it's decision to reopen the San Antonio mine. He estimates that there are more than 50 people engaged in exploration right now, but expects a dramatic increase next summer.

He said Manitoba is the best place in Canada to invest in exploration because of the Provincial governments Mineral Explo-

ration Program.

The most likely places for mineralisation in the Precambrian Shield are in what are known as "green stone" belts. The green stone belt at Bissett begins at Rice Lake, on the West Shore of Lake Winnipeg and ends in Ontario at Pickle Lake, 70 miles East of Red Lake. Most green stone occurrences are found in remote locations accessible only by air. The advantage of the Bissett area is the fact that it is accessible by road and is reasonably close to Winnipeg. Thus more of the exploration dollar is spent on actual exploration.

Wynne said most outcrops of the host rock were thoroughly explored years ago, but new tech-

niques have been developed to assist in identifying deposits covered by overburden. The process is a combination of biological and chemical analysis, and geophysics. Vegetable samples are taken and analysed for trace elements - even gold will dissolve in groundwater over a period of thousands of years. Where higher than normal concentrations are found, movement of groundwater and the geophysics of the area are taken into consideration, and a drilling program developed. The process enables areas under swamp and muskeg to be explored.

Three major exploration projects are currently underway. Tudale Exploration is using the above technique. Golden Pocket

Resources has a drilling program six miles south of Bissett, in the Gold Lake area, and Sangold resources has a drilling program and bulk sampling program in an

area immediately east of Bissett.

Hugh Wynne said there is more exploration underway than there has been for twenty years.

**Wayne Moneyas Acting Chief at Hollow Water**

The vacancy created by the recent election of Hollow Water First Nation Chief Rod Bushie to the position of Chief of the Assembly of Manitoba Chiefs has been filled Band Councillor Wayne Moneyas. Moneyas had the highest number of votes at the last band council.

At a band meeting September 11, the community decided not to hold a by-election at this time. Regular elections will be held in January next year.

## Reminder Notice of Public Hearing

**APPLICANT: The Manitoba Public Insurance Corporation**

**APPLICATION:** The Manitoba Public Insurance Corporation (the Corporation) has applied to The Public Utilities Board (the Board) for approval of the Corporation's 1998 rate bases and premiums charged with respect to compulsory driver and vehicle insurance. The application is being filed pursuant to The Crown Corporations Public Review and Accountability Act and The Public Utilities Board Act.

**RATE IMPACT:** The Corporation is requesting approval for basic Autopac rates effective March 1, 1998. Together with modifications to vehicle classification systems and other Autopac program components, as established by the Corporation, the proposed rate adjustments represent an increase in written premium revenue of \$9.4 million, or 2.5 per cent, for the period March 1, 1998 to February 28, 1999. This increase in revenue results from the following rate adjustments to policies issued between March 1, 1998 and February 28, 1999:

- 2.0% special increase to help fund the rate stabilization reserve;
- Experience-based rate increases and decreases to individual classes ranging between +15% and -15%, resulting in an overall average increase in vehicle insurance premium revenue of 1.0%;
- Classification offset increases ranging between +0.1% and +19.9% (average 3.6%) to achieve revenue neutrality from the implementation of changes to vehicle rate groups;
- Modification of the formula for calculating the short rate charge on policy cancellations, resulting in a reduction in vehicle insurance premium revenue of 0.25%;
- Changes to eligibility rules for the merit program to provide discounts to all qualifying individuals on vehicles owned by limited companies, resulting in a reduction in vehicle insurance premium revenue of 0.25%.

The Corporation is also requesting Board approval for a continuation of the previously approved special rate stabilization reserve rebinding increase of 4%, currently included in basic Autopac rates.

Application of the proposed rate adjustments will result in the following average premium revenue adjustments by major vehicle use category:

Major Use	Number of Vehicles	Increase/Decrease
Private Passenger	578,000	2.7%
Commercial	47,000	-5.7
Public	7,000	-8.8
Motorcycles	7,000	14.9
Trailers	80,000	15.2
Off-Road	24,000	14.6

The overall impact of rate adjustments on the total vehicle population will be as follows:

- 139,000, or 18.7% of vehicles will receive a rate decrease. Most decreases will be less than \$50 with the maximum decrease being \$605;
- 7,000, or 1.0% of vehicles will receive no change in rate;
- 312,000, or 42.0% of vehicles will receive a rate increase of \$20, or less;
- 203,000, or 27.3% of vehicles will receive an increase between \$20 and \$50;
- 54,000, or 7.3% of vehicles will receive an increase between \$50 and \$80;
- 28,000, or 3.7% of vehicles will receive an increase greater than \$80 to a maximum increase of \$374.

The actual change in an individual's premium will vary depending on the owner's claim experience, driving record, insurance use, territory and vehicle rate group. The cumulative effect of those rate adjustments will all fall within the \$ amount described above.

The Corporation is also asking the Board to approve rates for short term policies to be effective March 1, 1998. In addition, the Corporation is proposing to introduce a service fee of \$15 for document searches and requests for historical information on vehicles.

No changes are proposed to driver's licence premiums, fleet rebates and surcharges, time payment fees or existing service and transaction fees.

## Red tape reduced for small business

More Firms Now Qualify to File Sales Tax Returns Less Frequently

As part of its efforts to reduce red tape for small businesses, the Manitoba government is allowing more firms to file sales tax returns less frequently, Finance Minister Eric Stefanson has announced.

Effective Oct. 1, businesses reporting under \$210 tax in an average month will be allowed to file sales tax returns semi-annually instead of monthly. Previously, only businesses reporting an average of less than \$70 tax were allowed to file semi-annually.

"The goal is to reduce the sales tax administration burden for more businesses," said Stefanson. "Beginning next

month, a greater number of businesses will be able to file just two semi-annual sales tax returns each year, instead of 12 monthly returns."

Businesses now qualifying for semi-annual returns, based on tax reported over the last year, are being notified of the change by Manitoba Finance. These firms can choose to remain monthly filers by signing and returning a declaration they will receive by mail.

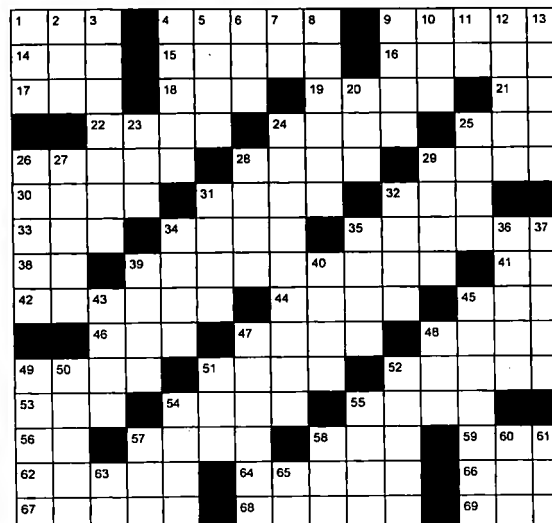
