Ralph Nespov wins Lac du Bonnet golf tournament

The 46th annual Lac du Bonnet Open Golf Tournament was held at Pine Falls on Sunday, August 25th. Tournament participation was slightly down this year at 72 entries. The hot, humid weather didn't deter Ralph Nespov, who shot a 38 on the front nine and 34 on the back 9 to end up 4 over par at the beautiful Pine Falls golf club.

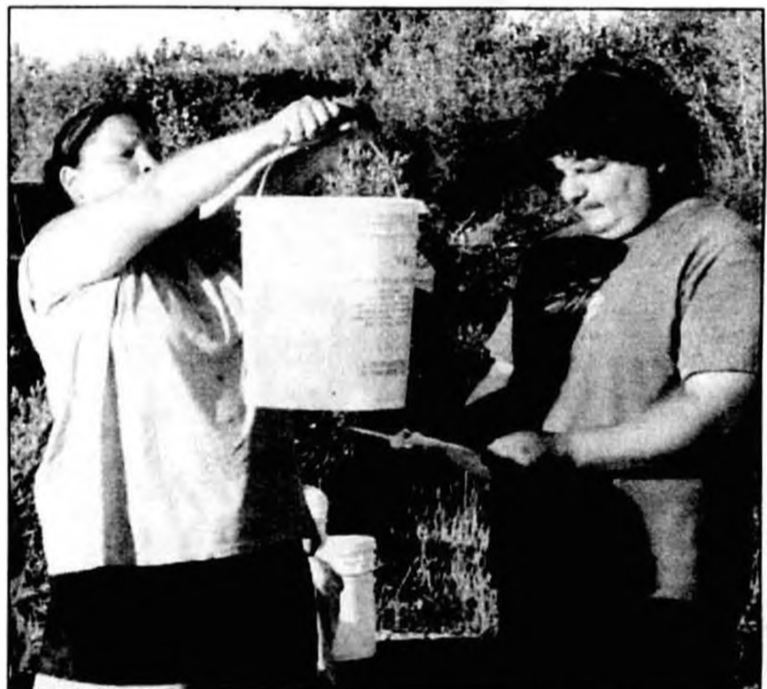
"I got so busy watching Ralph, that I forgot about my

own game" says proud father, Joe Nespov who took home top honours in 1992, 2000, and 2001.

As well as winning the Lac du Bonnet open, Ralph, a former Lac du Bonnet resident also took home the equally prestigious Ron Sydorko Memorial Trophy. This cup was donated by the Dr. Bob Rutherford family in memory of long time Lac du Bonnet resident and avid golfer, Ron Sydorko, who lost his battle

with cancer in January of 2001.

The Lac du Bonnet open is the oldest tournament in the area. It is notable that Mr. Glen Butchart, the only charter member still golfing, has been in every tournament since his first game at 12 years of age. TJ Starr demonstrates why she was the winner of the Women's Strongman competition held during the LBR Treaty Days



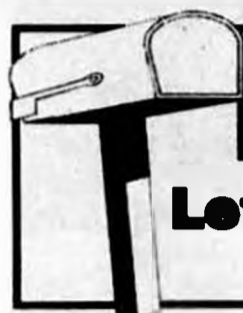

Pine Falls - Two and half years later

At the start of 2000, an advisory council of four councillors and a chairman was set up by the Company (Tembec, Pine Falls Operations) and administrator hired. Following is their mandate established at that time:

1. To maintain services in Pine Falls - as set out in the caveats registered to all private property by the Company.
2. To investigate a method for assessment appeals.
3. To revise the 2000 budget

as presented by the Company if necessary.

The Company also increased service charges (taxes) by approximately 50% at the start of 2000.

It is time for a report card.

1. Services have been maintained at approximately the same standard as the past 10 years, except for the sewer system. Problems with the sewer system have increased. No improvement.
2. Council seems to have in-

vestigated all ways for Pine Falls to become a free town or amalgamation with other areas. A citizen vote directed the council to discuss amalgamation with Powerview only. There has been no other citizen input. After early meetings, talks broke off with Powerview and other avenues were considered by Council. The result would be extremely unwise to join with Alexander. The idea of an R.M. of the Winnipeg River is the agenda of a few people whose vision is not realistic. To remove an

area along the Winnipeg River from Pine Falls to McArthur Falls from the R.M. of Alexander would require 7 to 10 years and ruin Alexander. This plan has been pushed by the Pine Falls Advisory Council and Administration. It is not practical or reasonable for Pine Falls and will fail.

3. The Administration refused to consider any idea of assessment appeals. This position was unreasonable as this has been done previously.

4. Nothing appears to have been considered re the preliminary budget.

Pine Falls is a company town and has been for 75+ years. The Company controls the town through the caveats registered through the Land Titles office against all private property. There is no other governing authority over private property in Pine Falls. The Advisory Council gets its authority from the Company. We do not have a mayor. Pine Falls is not a public municipality like Powerview and does

not fall under the Municipal Act. The Pine Falls Council were ill prepared for their responsibilities and it appears that they did not receive proper instruction. Council contacted a lawyer for advice and proceeded with a questionable subdivision, attended many meetings out of Pine Falls including a 5 person trip to Toronto, and made an offer to purchase the Catholic Priest's house in Pine Falls. At latest word, this has not been finalized. Priced approximately \$28,000.00. Reason for purchase - business purposes. I ask - what business purposes? We have not been privy to any business plan for Pine Falls. Also this building is on Company leased land and the lease terminates in 2005 or 2007. At that time the townsites would obtain the property at no cost.

It appears to me (having attended several Council meetings) that the Administrator has far too much influence on Council. Private agendas have gained far too much importance and preference over the wishes of the taxpayers of Pine Falls. Council has pushed the Winnipeg River R.M. plan without any financial studies or interviews with the taxpayers of such an area.

By the end of December, 2002, the imposition of the Advisory Council plan by the Company will have cost me approximately \$1,900.00 - completely wasted. We are now worse off than we were two and half years ago. It is time for the Advisory Council and Chairman to resign as of October 23, 2002. It is also time for new people and a different vision for the good of Pine Falls.

Thunder Mountain water slides open

The biggest water slide park in Manitoba opened in Grand Marais last weekend. Judging by the squeals of delight the kids were having a great time - but so were the adults.

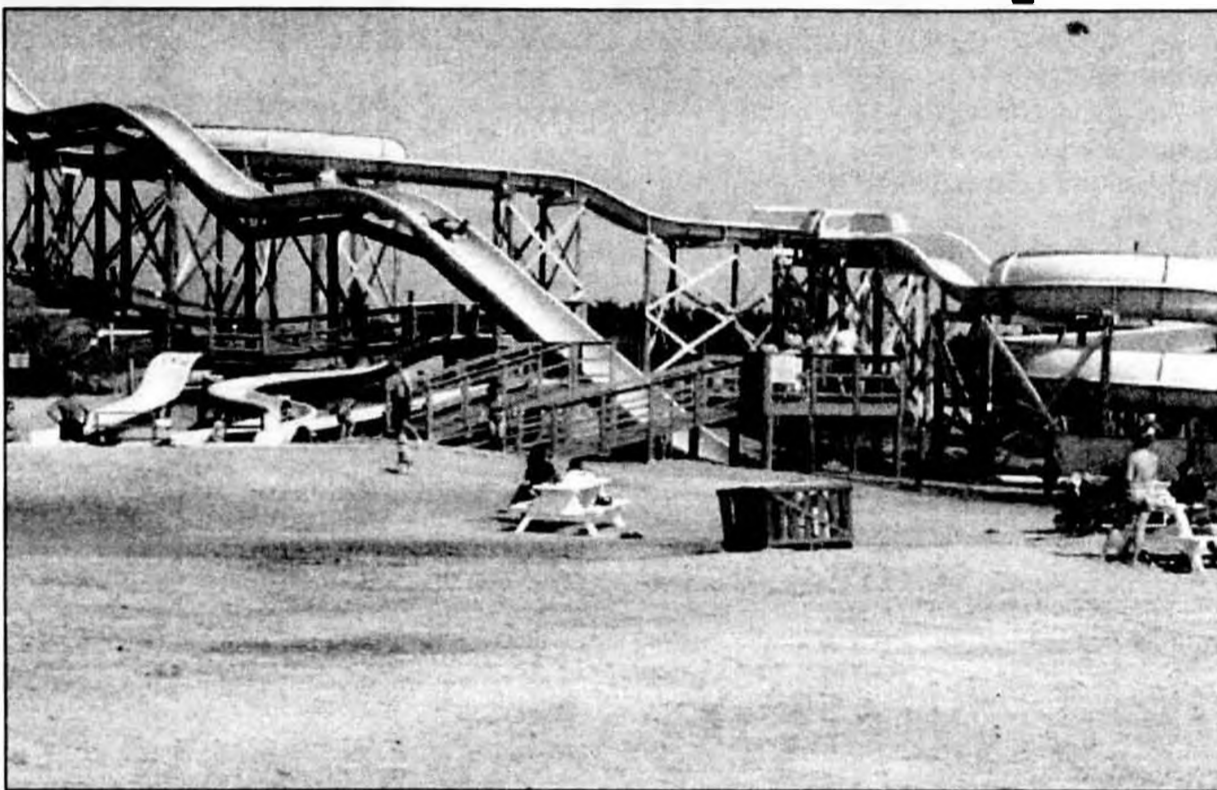
The seven blue slides on the face of a giant artificial sand dune together with the cries of the children, picnic tables and large colourful umbrellas gives the feel of a day at the beach.

The most popular of the seven slides turned out to be the Speed slide - nicknamed the "Bullet" - a one-way (down hill) roller coaster where you can get up to speeds of 75 kmph riding on a thick plastic toboggan. Also very popular were the "white water rafting" slide using plastic one, two or

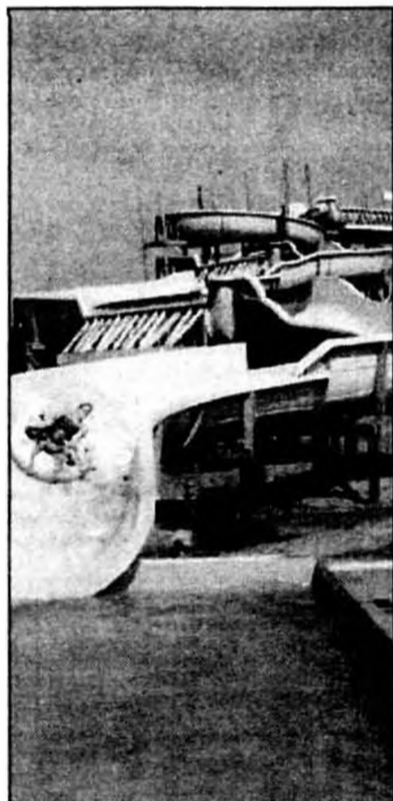
three man tubes. Most people favoured the one-man tubes.

The younger children preferred the three Kiddie Slides. They are much shorter so you don't have to climb all the way to the top of the hill every time. If you just want to relax while the kids have fun you can rest in a 100 person warm-up tub, where the temperature is kept at about 100 degrees Fahrenheit.

Thunder Mountain closed down in Brandon on Labour Day 1999, and reopened in Grand Marais August 22. It will close for the season on Labour Day, September 2. The park employs fifteen people, nine of them life guards on two shifts - a total of 30 summer jobs.

Input from tourism stakeholders vital

"A regional tourism strategy can only be successful with input from the stakeholders," said Mary Greber of Winnipeg River Brokenhead Community Futures Development Corporation (CFDC). The Regional Tourism Steering Committee is currently preparing a strategic plan for tourism development for the North Eastman region, and the committee will be hosting a series of consultation workshops as a means of getting input.

The development of a regional tourism strategy is part of a major initiative being undertaken by WRBCFDC to assist with the development of a regional approach to economic development, including tourism development.

"As a first step, we coordinated and hosted a Regional Economic Development Symposium, 'Looking Beyond', in October 2001. The symposium helped to increase understanding of economic development principles and approaches, considered some of the potential economic development opportunities for the North Eastman region, and examined the benefits and the challenges of working together as a region to advance sustainable community economic development."

Following the symposium, a Regional Strategic Planning Working Group and a Regional Tourism Steering Committee were established. The Regional Tourism Steering Committee has been working hard to develop a draft outline for a regional tourism strategic plan. Initial inventories and an analysis of tourism events and attractions have been drafted. "There's much more to be included, and that's where we need stakeholders input" said Ron Funk, committee rep for Eastman Regional Development Corporation.

Once developed, the tourism strategic plan will feed into the overall regional economic development strategy being prepared by the Regional Strategic Planning Working Group. This will in turn provide direction for the development of a regional marketing strategy.

Anyone interested in tourism development are invited to participate in the upcoming tourism consultation workshops to provide their input into the development of the regional strategic plan for tourism development.
