# Jack Schwaluk tops poll

233 people voted in the Pine Falls Merger Committee election last Friday. The election - to elect a seven-member committee to represent Pine Falls in negotiations with a view to a merger between Pine Falls and Powerview - was contested by a total of eleven candidates. Brian Ryall had been nominated as a candidate but withdrew before the election.

The 433 eligible voters were able to cast up to seven votes each. A total of 1589 votes were cast out of a possible 1631, thus not all those who voted voted for seven candidates.

The newly elected council will be undergoing an orientation process before getting down to serious negotiations. The first meeting, with Powerview, Tembec and Intergovernmental Affairs officials, will take place on Wednesday, December 13.

This past Friday, MP Bev Desjarlais presented three recipients with the Queen's Golden Jubilee Award. Presented were Diane Dube of St. Georges, Jean Dupont of St. Georges, and Ken Ellison of Seymourville. "It is very nice to recognize people who work so hard and contribute so much to their communities. It is a real pleasure to present these medals to each of you today", said Desjarlais.

The Queen's Golden Jubilee Award is to bring national recognition to the many thousands of "unsung heroes" who work tirelessly throughout the United Kingdom to help their fellow citizens. The award is both an illustration of importance. The Queen places on community and voluntary services dedicated and committed teams, groups, and individuals and an opportunity for everyone to nominate and celebrate the invaluable contributions they make to our communities.

Diane Dube of St. Georges, Manitoba is a wife and proud mother of three girls who have all gone on to become teachers. Over the years Diane has con-

tributed greatly to her community and is very happy to do so. Diane taught school in Sagkeeng and was a school trustee for eight years. She was also a council member for the R.M. of Alexander for four years, she was the founder of LePetit Soleil (mini school), she was also a founding member of the St. Georges Library, a member of Comite Culturel, Winnipeg River Brokenhead Community Futures, Manitoba Model Forest, President of the St. Georges Community Club, President of the Economic Development Corporation and a catalyst for the St. Georges beach renovations and mini Golf, the historical walkway, construction of the Fort Bas De La Riviere and the 55 plus condos. "I am very surprised by today's presentation and very pleased to accept the award," said Dube on being presented the medal and certificate of achievement.

Jean Dupont of St. Georges, Manitoba ran the family farm with his brother for many years, and has contributed greatly to the St. Georges Museum. He has worked tirelessly as the Museum's curator over the years and continues to do so. He is also a member of the St.

Georges Historical Society, and has served on the council of Local Government District of Alexander. "Your pea's that you make from hand even the silk screening on the bags that you use, have made their way to many parts of Canada. I have presented them as gifts to dignitaries, and such, and have told them of the pride and history of the St. Georges Peas" said Desjarlais. "I am very happy and surprised by the award, I just didn't expect it" said Dupont.

Ken Ellison of Seymourville, Manitoba has taught school in the northern area for 26 years. He has seven children and has been married for 34 years. He is a retired principal of Wanipigow School, and contributes his time and energy to sit as a member of the school committee, Manitoba Model Forest, East Side Round Table and the Northeast Regional Health Board and Seymourville Council. "I have been retired since 1994 and I am more busy now than ever. Seymourville has a good strong core of volunteer's and all of those people are wonderful to work with." I am very surprised to be receiving this award", said Ellison.

Sagkeeng Junior High.

Evans Coffieman, originally from Accraghana, West Africa, was invited to Sagkeeng by Principal, Allan Courchene to come teach and share some of his songs and dance that are native to his culture. Mr. Coffieman was able to teach all the students from grade five to eight a very unique dance within the week he was here.

He said the dance he taught them was a combination of his African culture and international dance routines. Following each dance routine the students also presented a musical number that Mr. Coffieman was able to teach the students.

He brought with him fifteen drums that he taught all the students to play. They all learned three unique drum beats, not only did they learn to dance, to this

drum, but they learned to play it too.

Mr. Coffieman also shared with the students a very interesting message that the students proudly displayed at this concert. "To be shy, is to shut the door, to open the door, is to shine."

The Junior High Chief, Cheyenne Gerard, presented Mr. Coffieman with a beautiful handdrum, that is native to the aboriginal culture. Obviously touched by the gift, Evans Coffieman promised to return to the community soon.

# Blues beat Arborg 7-3

Welcome to the greatest show on ice... The Lac du Bonnet Blues!!!

The Blues currently sit in second place in the south division of the South Interlake Hockey League (SIHL), second only to arch rivals Stonewall.

Last Saturday (Dec. 7th) on home ice advantage, the Blues handed a humbling 7-3 blow to the Arborg Avalanche.

Blues goalie Shane Hintz had to be sharp after allowing the Avalanche to draw first blood on a break away goal twelve minutes into the period. Arborg goalie Chirs Bergman did everything but stand on his head to shut out the Blues, but was no match for firepower Dwight Hirst in the slot with just over five minutes left in the opening period. Josh Abraham assisting.

The Blues went ahead three minutes later when Devon Turner, coming out of the penalty box, intercepted a clearing pass from Brendan Arsenault and found himself all alone when he scored go ahead goal. The Avalanche were not to be outdone, managing a power play goal from a screened point shot that closed out the first period scoring with only 22 seconds left.

Dwight Hirst once again opened the offense on an assist from Jayson Abraham at nine minutes into the second period.

Hirst continues to be unstoppable from the slot, proving he has one of the best shots in the league. "No one has a chance when Hirst is in the slot," confirmed Blues goalie Shane Hintz.

Jayson Abraham assisted on a goal from Sean Reynolds that com-

pleted the Blues second period scoring with another magical turnover created by the never ending checking abilities of Devon Turner.

The Blues retired the second with a comfortable 4-2 lead, recording 24 shots on goal to Arborg's 10.

Arborg came out watching the third period as Lac du Bonnet romped to a 7-2 lead on goals scored by Jay Griffith (Josh Abraham:Jayson Abraham) Sean Reynolds (Jayson Abraham:Devon Turner) and an unassisted effort from defenseman Clint Lorteaux.

The Avalanche finally showed some life late in the period after concurrent penalties from three Blues defencemen opened the door for a second Avalanche power play goal with a minute and a half remaining in the game. Shane Hintz had allowed one goal over the final two periods against Arborg's 20 shots.

Head Coach Jeff Siefried was beaming after the game. "We've always done okay in this league, but we now have a team that can go over the top. We have two great goalies (Donovan Henzel, Shane Hintz). We have the best goaltending in the league."

Longtime manager Curtis Dancyt had similar words. "We have a very balanced team. We have the ability to prevent goals, while at the same time the ability to score goals," referring to firepowers Dwight Hirst and Jason Abraham.

The next home game is 7:00 p.m. December 21st versus first place Stonewall. I know where I will be, what about you??!!

attending SIHL meetings. In order for them to accept us I offered a \$200.00 payment to each team that traveled to Lac du Bonnet for games," said Dancyt. The SIHL teams had never before travelled outside a 45 minute range. "It was impossible to get them here without some incentive," added Dancyt.

The Blues first two seasons were learning years (1997-1999). "The best team I ever saw was the 1999-2000 team," said Curtis. But the team did not accomplish what Curtis had destined for them. Curtis admitted some of the reasons were his own fault, "The team entered the provincials while at the same time playing in the league playoffs. In 1994 Curtis started a three year long process of securing the Blues acceptance into the South Interlake Hockey League (SIHL). "I sold the team and I sold the Town by

- = Intermediate stage - minimum 15 months
- = Full stage

- Your supervising driver must have a valid licence and be fully licensed for three years.
- You are limited in the number of passengers you can carry.

Fig. 1. Head Puppet

**Santa Puppet**

**Materials**

- two 9 inch x 10 inch pieces of terry towel
- 4 inch square fleecy interfacing
- scraps of 3/8 inch ribbon
- 1/2 yard white rickrack
- white pompom
- scraps of white yarn
- green fabric
- white iron-on fabric
- two 1/4 inch hearts
- black and red permanent markers
- rouge
- glue

Cut a pair of Santas (use the towel edge at bottom). Cut beard from fleecy (see broken lines in Fig. 1) Cut 2 holly leaves 3/4 inch long. From the iron-on fabric, cut the fact 1/4 inch larger than the broken oval in fig. 1.

Santa front: Iron on face. Edge-stitch on fleecy. Sew on ribbons (see photo) Draw face; rouge cheeks. With yarn, make bow, brows, and mustache.

Assembly: Seam Santa front to Santa back, right sides together and edges even, leaving bottom edge open. Turn right-side out.

Finishing: Sew pompom to top of Santa. Sew rickrack around the white fleecy. Glue on leaves and hearts.

# Sagkeeng Junior High School news

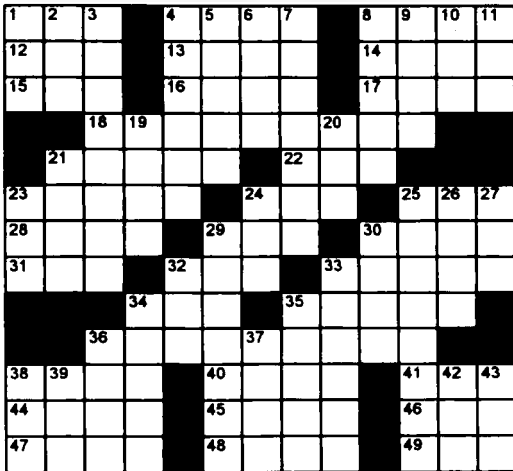

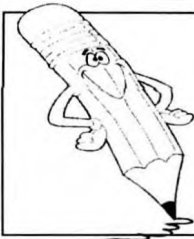
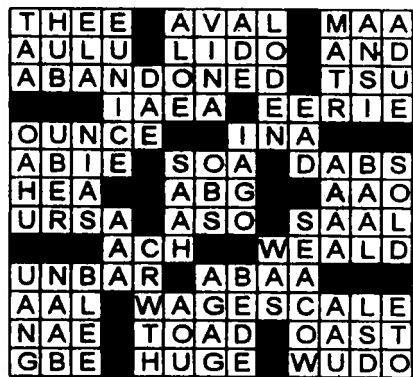
