Memorial Park

The Committee is very well pleased with the splendid condition of the Memorial Park grounds and the steady improvements that are being made from year to year.

The fencing and wiring were the first objective, then the backstop was erected, which is one of the best built that could be found on any baseball field. Last year we put up the basketball nets and the ends were made for quirts or horseshoes. The weeds were exterminated and the ground levelled. This year three portable stands or bleachers were made by the permanent residents as their contribution, each with a seating capacity of forty persons. These can be moved to the pier for water sports or field games and sports; the annual cutting of the grass, exterminating of weeds levelling of grounds were done by Mr. Cooke and his men as part of the municipality's contribution.

A "wiring bee" was held Tuesday, August 14th under the direction of Bert Trainor in order to repair the fence where the wire had been broken down. Watch for further announcements on future "bees," and please make an effort to lend a hand.

Owing to the wonderful co-operation of the Permanent Residents, organized baseball and football teams, the Municipality and the Victoria Beach Club,

these improvements have been made from year to year and the Victoria Beach Memorial Park is yours for sport and dogshows, games, etc. Let us continue with zest our interest and support in upkeep and improvement from year to year, ever remembering it is a Memorial to those whom we knew and loved, who made the supreme sacrifice, that we may live in freedom.
