THE Annual Victoria Beach Regatta will be held over the coming week-end and as has been the case for the past four years, the Club has extended an invitation to members of the Manitoba Paddling Association. A group of paddlers from the camping section of the Association will arrive Saturday with their canoes, to take part in the week-end of sport. Mr. Garth Willock of the Winnipeg Canoe Club will be in charge.

As the number of entrants in the various week-end events have, over the last few years, been disappointing, this year's regatta will see a reduction in the number of "organized" events to make way for a number of novelty events for those who just want to have fun. The Grand Aggregate Trophy will again be up for competition — 3 points for first, 2 for second and 1 for third; with the exception of the events listed above and marked with an asterisk, which will not count towards grand aggregate competition. The winners of the one mile and quarter mile events will be awarded points of 4 1/2, 3 and 1 1/2; though should anyone win points in both long distance events, only the greater of either of them will be allowed.

With the exception of the long distance swims where medals will be awarded, prizes will be given to all winners — first, second and third. Only "first" and "second" prizes will be given to winners of Tandem canoe races and "first" only to winners of Four-boat races.

Prizes will be presented at the Clubhouse on Sunday night at 8:30 p.m. to be followed by a weiner roast and sing-song led by members of the Manitoba Paddling Association. The weiner roast is open to all Club members and their guests.

Should it be impossible because of weather conditions to hold the regatta on Sunday, the programme will commence at 1:00 p.m., Monday.
