Take notice that a meeting of the Electors of the Rural Municipality of Victoria Beach will be held in the Police Constable's office (near station) on Wednesday, July 28th, 1954, at the hour of ONE O'CLOCK (daylight saving time) in the afternoon for the purpose of nominating the following candidates:

The time for receiving nominations shall be between the hours of one o'clock and two o'clock (daylight saving time) in the afternoon and all nominations shall be made in writing by a proposer and a seconder who shall be duly qualified electors of the municipality. Each nomination shall be accompanied by a written acceptance by the candidate named in such nomination.

THESE 10 RULES HELP STOP POLIO

Health authorities say evidence indicating a polio epidemic for Manitoba this year has not yet developed but that it is still too early to say with certainty what will happen.

Dr. Nelles Silverthorne, chairman of the committee on child and maternal health of the Health League of Canada, has compiled this list of 10 rules for parents of children who might be susceptible.

1. Special attention should be given methods of sewage disposal, especially in threatened areas.
2. In areas of threatened outbreak, swimming pools and beaches should be closed.
3. Flies should be rigorously excluded from all centres where food and beverages are handled.
4. Cleanliness should be demanded in anyone handling food — anyone in restaurants who handles money should not handle or prepare food.
5. Foods or fluids should be cooked or boiled to destroy the virus of poliomyelitis.
6. Eating in fly-ridden places or places where people are suffering from an unidentified disease should be avoided.
7. All persons should always wash their hands before eating.
8. All fruits and vegetables should be thoroughly washed, preferably peeled and cooked during the polio season.
