Lake Winnipeg was the only highway to the North during the days of the fur-trader. Furs were taken across the lake to the Nelson River, to York Factory, and then by ship to Europe. Clothes, food and supplies were brought back the same way. But that was a long time before this was a resort.

Since then we have run the gamut from the railroad to the 'plane, to the road and travel by motor and bus. The port was quiet. Now as though searching for a more leisurely or quieter pace, visitors are using the port again. There have been several yachts there this season. Probably members of the new Winnipeg Yacht Club.

Members sail from their clubhouse on the Red River. They sometimes travel up to Hekla Island to Manitogogan or Riverton and around via Victoria Beach. There are many lovely sails.




