### Our Summer Resort

Victoria Beach came into the picture comparatively late. The Lake of the Woods area, Detroit Lakes and the various resorts on the west side of Lake Winnipeg were well established by the beginning of the century because they could be reached easily by rail. In 1900 the Victoria Beach Company was formed and offered lots for sale but few cottages were built as access was only by water. It was not till 1915 when the Canadian National Railway extended its Grand Beach line to Victoria Beach that settlement began in earnest.

Forty-five years earlier the peninsula now known as Victoria Beach had been on the main line of travel from the east. In 1870 Col. Wolsley's force coming to restore order in the Red River Colony, stopped at Elk Island on a beautiful August evening. For two hundred years before that the Winnipeg River-Lake Winnipeg-Red River route had been traversed by fur traders, French, Nor'-Westers and Hudson's Bay Company's men. They had not been blind to the beauty of "Indian Portage" as Victoria Beach was then named.

### In The Old Days

One of these wayfarers wrote prophetically in his diary: "I am filled with admiration for the pure white sand which lies deep along the shore, this beautiful (Patricia) bay, guarded by pine and birch where will some day be a spot of great delight for the dwellers of the future on the great plains."

In 1800 Daniel Harmon, N.W. fur trader from Vermont, wrote of the abundance of berries to be found here and in 1857 the scientist Henry Hind mentioned the fine sand cherries. The old name, Little Elk Island, came from the abundance of Elk and Deer still to be seen on occasion.

The early campers, wishing to preserve the pristine beauty of the area, petitioned the provincial government not to build a permanent road which would encourage casual tourists. A few years ago a compromise was reached. No cars are allowed to travel through the camp site but they can be parked at the outskirts. The government has built a good all-weather highway up to this point. In consequence railway travel to the Beach has declined.

Whatever the means of transport, the beauty of Victoria Beach attracts increasing numbers of campers. The clear air, the spruce and birch trees, the rocks, the beaches safe for children and the abundance of wild life in this sanctuary continue to tempt the city dwellers from their asphalt jungle.


