N-E-W-S

We heard last week, from an authority on newspapers, a new version of the word "news". (The Oxford dictionary defines it as the plural of "new").

It seems many centuries ago in England, that villages were so small, and because of the lack of printing facilities, that the elder from each family met at a nightly council to discuss the events of the day and to govern the village. Hence news was passed down to the family level.

As villages grew, elected representatives replaced family elders, and the results of such meetings were posted, as well as being spread by the town crier.

As communities became even larger, they were divided into four districts, to localize interest, and bulletins were posted in the town square under the headings North, East, West and South. The first letters of these districts formed the word "NEWS" as we use it today.

The Civic Service last Sunday was conducted by Rev. Harry Atkinson. Mr. Atkinson was one of the founders of the summer services and recalled when they were first held in Falls' Store.

His text was taken from Hebrews 11 and the 2nd Book of Kings. Taking the words of David when he heard his son was dead "I wish I were a shepherd again rather than a king."
