Swimming 1965

Summer has arrived at last and with it the swimming lessons provided to you by your Victoria Beach Community Club and Red Cross.

Back with us for another summer will be Janie Harvey as senior instructress, and Janet Carmichael and Barbara Guest as junior instructresses. Janie is in charge of the instruction program and all problems, complaints, and suggestions should be brought to her.

Registration for swimming lessons will be held on July 2 and July 3 from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon in the club house. Those persons who are not at the beach for the initial registration days may register with Janie Harvey at any other time throughout the six week program. A Victoria Beach Community Club membership card must be presented at registration, or as soon as possible afterwards, to the swimmer's instructress.

Classes will begin on July 5 and will continue until August 13. There will be classes every day of the week, except Saturdays, Sundays and testing days. Each class is one-half hour long. On rainy days lessons are held in the clubhouse and it is important that swimmers come on these days as well. Tests are held every two weeks—on July 16, July 30, and August 13—and the swimmers are examined by a qualified Red Cross examiner.

The Red Cross divides swimmers into beginners, juniors, intermediates, and seniors, and our summer program will provide lessons for persons in all of these classifications. Beginners must be 5 years of age before they can start lessons. Seniors must be 13 years of age before they can take their test, but classes are available for those who are seniors but not yet 13. These seniors are urged to come to class in order to keep up their swimming and it is hoped that this year we will be able to have these seniors in a life-saving program.

Aside from the Red Cross swimming, our program also offers to those who are 14 years of age and older, and who have received their Senior Red Cross award, the Bronze Medallion Lifesaving classes. However, persons who are interested in this program will not be

able to register after the first week of instruction, since repetitive instruction is not possible in this area of the program. Lifesaving classes are an hour in duration and the test will likely be held after 5 weeks of instruction. The Bronze Medallion award is a prerequisite to lifeguarding and to learning to be a Red Cross instructor.

All adults are very welcome to participate in our swimming program. If any of you adults cannot swim at all, if you want to improve your strokes, if you are interested in lifesaving, or if you just want to keep trim, you are most welcome to become part of our classes.

As a further part of the summer swimming program we hope to demonstrate mouth-to-mouth artificial respiration on the beaches about once every two weeks.

Looking forward to having all you swimmers out for lessons again in '65!

Individual adults	12.50
Juniors and Students	7.50

Juniors in the age group from 10-15 years may play at any time on Monday through Thursday (holidays excepted) but on holidays, Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays, must be accompanied by a parent or adult player and may only tee off after 2:30 p.m.

Junior Sailing Courses

1965 JUNIOR SAILING INSTRUCTION COURSES

The Manitoba Sailing Association is setting up this year the first Junior Sailing Instruction Programme to be offered to club and non-club members in the Whiteshell, Victoria Beach and Metropolitan Winnipeg areas. The courses will be supervised by experienced trained instructors.

- Eligibility:** The course will be open to children of both sexes between the ages of 9 and 15, who will be required to pass a swimming test before acceptance.
- Syllabus:** Each course will be run for 2 weeks, with either morning or afternoon classes. Classes in theory and practise of sailing will be given ashore as lecture demonstrations, and afloat in International Cadets provided by the Association.
- Registration Fees:** \$15.00 per child.
- Safety measures:** Each child must bring a life jacket which must be worn at all times while afloat. They will be under the supervision of an experienced lifesaver.

Each course will be completed with an award of efficiency badges provided by the Canadian Yachting Association.


