Helpful Hints on Painting

—that seasonal occupation of "week-day widows" at the Beach.

As I groped about at 6:00 a.m. Monday morning assisting my sleepy male back to the office to win another week's bread for our idyllic existence at Victoria Beach, he casually remarked, "By the way, there's a pot of cream enamel paint which you may use to paint the old wooden chairs, but only use that red-handled paint brush of mine."

In this fragment of conversation lies the first helpful hint.

Do your painting during the week when hubby is seventy miles away. It is no good doing it under his experienced eye; I know from many a painful experience.

First, twelve years of schooling taught me to hold my paint brush in the artistic manner, which is not correct but very difficult to change.

Secondly, I like to dip all the hairs (and there are very few on the paint brushes my husband allows me to use) of the brush deep into the paint.

Thirdly, since we seem to have gallons of turpentine, it surely doesn't matter if I seem to sprinkle myself liberally with paint.

A fourth helpful hint emerges at this point—try to paint outside if possible—you have much more freedom for the full indulgence of your artistic abilities.

At the parking lot, as I tried to wave a cheery goodbye, he shouted:

"You can paint the front door too."

This absolutely stunned me. We have a new front door—a glorious piece of streaky plywood. Are front doors so easy to do that I could be trusted with ours? Or are they so difficult he would rather I—than he—

made a mess of it. This required some deep psychological pondering. There was obviously a catch in it somewhere. And this is my fifth helpful hint. Always consider the psychological implications of the painting jobs a husband may assign. Don't commit yourself rashly to all and sundry.

On the Wednesday (Friday would soon arrive) I began on the chairs. Luckily there were four of them, so I was able to improve my techniques with each one.

After the first one I developed severe abdominal cricks from crawling around on the grass trying to paint the underside of the legs. By the time I reached the third I made a remarkable discovery. Start at the bottom, not the top. Turn the bottom up. Thus by balancing the chair upside down on the top of a spoke, I could
