follow road to the meadowland where signs will point to the direct path to the lake. Once on the beach bear right to Sandy Beach.

Warning: Wear stout shoes and socks as there is POISON IVY enroute and swampy area to cross. Place all litter in the can provided.

**BEACH CLEAN-UP**

Prior to July 1st, Club House, Arthur, Patricia, Alexandra, King Edward Beaches were cleared of fallen trees by Public Works. As of July 1st these beaches were thoroughly raked and checked for debris by Beach Boys hired by Parks and Recreation. These boys are paid \$5.00 a week and are responsible for a daily morning inspection of their assigned area. They bury dead fish, pick up litter and water carefully for glass bottles, old cans and dangerous debris. No one can say these boys are overpaid at the rate of the debris they remove from their area.

We welcome your suggestions in all areas of Parks and Recreation. This is a new committee and as such we ask for your patience and co-operation in the many operations which have been started.



**REACHING ASSISTS**

In August 1966 The Royal Life Saving Society of Canada published a lifesaving manual of six volumes. The following is an excerpt from volume three: Water Rescue.

The reaching assist is the basic form from which all non-contact rescues are developed. The rescuer remains in a position of safety while extending his reach to assist the swimmer in difficulty. In all reaching assists the following rules should guide the rescuer:

- EXTEND your reach, with any object which is light, can be extended accurately and which is speedily available.
- TALK to the subject to calm and instruct him.
- SECURE YOURSELF either by keeping back from the water's edge, with centre of gravity as low as possible, (rescuer on shore), or by maintaining a firm grip on the shore, (rescuer in water).
- DRAW IN GRADUALLY—pull the subject to safety with a firm continuous motion; avoid the sudden pull which may cause the subject to lose his grasp.
- SECURE THE SUBJECT. See that the subject has a firm grasp of shore, dock or boat; make contact, and assist the subject from the water, if he proves unable.





Each cottage should have one of these cards posted for quick reference and information regarding Police, Fire Precautions, By-laws, etc.

**Village Green:** Foot paths — Centennial Path — leads from Birch to Gibson Drive. Pine Path — leads from Pine and Center to Gibson Drive. Bicycle path — Centennial Path has been widened and divided into a bicycle path on the west, foot path on the east.

**Donations** — Almey and Royalty apple trees will be planted on either side of Centennial Path. **Litter** — Many refuse cans have been placed in the park areas. The beauty of the park will be enhanced by the use of these cans, and the cost of the park maintenance would be lessened if parents would instruct and encourage their children to place all paper wrappers and bottles in these cans. Two litter cans have been placed on the Fifth Avenue Path, and one at the Tennis Courts. We are certainly not "litter-free" yet but I must report an obvious improvement thanks to little people who have voluntarily enlisted in the "CLEAN-UP" campaign and to responsive holidayers.

**Through Traffic:** must use Eighth and Gibson Drive.

**Pine Road:** is NOT a through street south of Eighth. Vehicles that are permitted to use this street are, Police, Doctor and Municipal vehicles, taxis and delivery trucks on official business.

**Parking Lot for Permit Holders:** Permit vehicles must be parked in the area off Gibson Drive, opposite the Honeysuckle Hedge when drivers are shopping on the Village Green.

**Memorial Drive:** the new name for the street in front of the V.B.G. store, between Birch and Center.

**Avenue Paths:** Pedestrians are urged to use the foot-paths on the avenues, to be alert and co-operative with permitted vehicles and bicycles on the roads.

**BEACHES:** The summer resident Beach Boys who are trying so hard to keep the beaches clear of litter, dead fish and glass are: Bay Beach — Phillip Squire; Club House — Bob Murrell; Patricia — Robert Woodrow; King Edward —
