

"Just one delicate orchid bloomed in a secluded part of the Royal Botanical Gardens, Kew, yesterday. It is one of the last known examples of its kind in Britain. The others—just six of them—are also in Kew, hidden from public view, their precise location seldom being disclosed. The only known wild specimens grew in Wharfedale, Yorkshire, guarded by a small group of naturalists, since 1901, and visited by them once in every five years. But after 66 years their secret has been discovered, and the orchids have been dug up by an unknown and unscrupulous collector. "It was a crime," said Dr. A. Rouston of Durham University, one of the orchid's guardians. Two hundred years ago, the orchids grew in several places in Northern England. They were first recorded in 1640, but by 1838 they were rare and by 1888 only three or four groups survived. This orchid produces tens of thousands of powder-like seeds, but only one or two will produce a new flower. They take up to two years to germinate and it is six or seven years after that before the plant produces a flower. In Austria and Switzerland it is protected by law."

The name of this orchid is the Lady-Slipper — (Cypripedium Calceolus) and it can be found growing near Victoria Beach, quite profusely.

Harold Hosford writing in the Winnipeg Tribune of July 15th, 1967, describes how he and a friend drove thirty miles west of Falcon Lake, and then wandered endlessly into the wilderness to a spot his friend knew in order to photograph a Lady-Slipper. He ends his story,

"If you're afield and find a clump of these gorgeous flowers, resist the temptation to pick them. Picking them, destroys them."

As with all our wildlife it is better to photograph than to kill.
