

## Fire! Buckets! Alexandra Beach!

"My heart was in my throat!" "I didn't hear the fire bell, did you?" "The hose scarcely made an impression on it." "That brush on the bank is a serious fire hazard." "Lucky it just rained." "Mrs. Wallace rang a bell." These are some of the thoughts voiced.

Fire is the most terrifying thought a Victoria Beach cottager can have. This combined with wind is doubly terrifying. Sunday afternoon July 21st we had both of these. The day was wild. Winds gusting to 65 m.p.h. Fire began in the dry brush on the cliff. About six people were seen below. Was someone foolish enough to start a bonfire? Doubtful. Even the most unthinking could scarcely do that. The wind was so high it would be difficult to light a fire. Could it have been a cigarette carelessly thrown away? Perhaps someone knows, and feels guilty.

Most parents know that one spark, one cigarette, one match, is all that is required to leave our beautiful island a charred mass of burnt timber. But how many young people realize the danger of tossing away a cigarette without being absolutely certain it is dead? How many realize the potential danger of playing with matches, or lighting dried straws and watching them burn while holding them? As parents it is our responsibility to impress upon our young people the seriousness of the situation.

A flash fire could totally demolish all buildings and vegetation. Almost surrounded by water, many people would be trapped. Cynics said, "Some fire — where could it go?" But every fire starts small. In spite of the recent rain, the fire had dried out the area ahead. It started in the dry brush on the cliff, but spread over the bank. Green grass was burning with large flames. Where could it have gone? Ahead, wiping out the whole area. Nothing could have stopped it but people — or very heavy rain. We had the people. A large group of young people were assembled for a birthday party. They turned out to swell the numbers in the forming bucket brigade. The word spread quickly. The wonderful people of Victoria Beach answered the call, and came quickly bearing buckets. In less than half an hour some 300 people were assembled on Grassy Point. As Charlie

MacRae put it, "It resembled a huge cocktail party without drinks. Everyone was there."

The Herald congratulates the cottagers of Victoria Beach for their quick action.

### DOGS ON THE BEACH

Everyone loves his own dog, but perhaps it has not occurred to you that other people may not. Many complaints have come into the Herald about dogs on the beach. For newcomers to the beach, you will find on your yellow information to Residents sheet, Bylaw 384 — "Dogs must not be allowed to run at large, and must never be taken on the beach unless on a leash." Actually in the heat of the day, you are doing your dog no favor by taking him to the beach.

Most owners are considerate enough of their friends and their dogs, to leave them at the cottage. Others, however, feel that their dog bothers no one on the beach. This may not be the case. One crossing of a towel with sandy flying, one splash, one dog fight, or one call from nature is enough to irritate the most patient sunbather. Furthermore it is against the law. There is also a dog pound. If you are a guilty party, take heed! This law is going to be enforced. Fines are from \$3.00 to \$12.50. Seven people have been bitten on the avenues (as reported to police by July 18) by dogs who never bite. Exceptions cannot be made. If you own a dog, you have a responsibility to keep it in your own yard, or on a leash. Don't be the one who feels he should be privileged. Saturday evening there were three dogs loose at the Children's Masquerade in the Clubhouse. Can you picture what would have happened had a dog fight broken out among all those children? Perhaps one was your dog. You cannot be sure unless your dog was on a leash or in the cottage.

The problem has become overwhelming. Something must be done, and done quickly.
