They were towed into the pier by a fishing boat, and the plane was transported by truck to Selkirk for repair.

Our globetrotter, Dorothy Garbutt of 307 Fourth Ave., has just returned from a three-month South American Safari aboard the Norwegian freighter *M.S. Stranger* of the Westfal-Larsen Line. Included in the cruise's ports of call were Buenaventura, Guayaquil, Lima, Valparaiso, Valdivia, Concepcion and Punta Arenas, the latter being the most southerly city in the world. Up the east coast the ship berthed in Buenos Aires, Montevideo, Rio de Janeiro, Port of Spain, and Cartagena, after which it passed through the Panama Canal and on to San Francisco, from where it set out three months earlier.

While in Brazil she took a 700-mile trip along the Pan-American Highway from Paranaguá to Rio, visiting on route Sao Paulo, said to be the fastest growing city in the world and Santos, the great coffee capital.

On her return to North America Dorothy spent several weeks visiting relatives and friends in California, Vancouver, Victoria, and Salt Spring Island.

In all her travels she says she has yet to find any place as uniquely lovely as Victoria Beach. Welcome home, Dorothy.
