

THE MILE OPEN SWIM

REPORT ON V.B. LIBRARY

For the Month of July 69

The library has been a busy place in the past month in spite of the good weather. Your committee is very gratified that V.B. residents are enjoying the books. We have some statistics for those interested in our progress. In July, 597 Books (312 children and 285 adult) were rented out to 309 people. 271 books have been returned and there are still 326 books out.

We would urge people to return their books before they leave the beach. We have not enough children's books and cannot afford to lose those we have.

To those who have arrived for August we say welcome. Come and see us between 12:30 and 1:30 and 7:00 and 8:00 on any weekday. Just look across the village green from V.B. Grocery and you will see our big green sign. Our junior librarians will be glad to help you.

We would like suggestions as to what improvement can be made and what books you would like to see in the library. Please write or give your suggestions to the librarian on duty.

The committee would like to thank these Junior librarians who have worked so hard through the past month. We would like to take this opportunity to introduce them,—Sandy Squire, Renee Sarchuk, Lorraine and Wendy Downs, Carolyn Page, Melody Goatcher, Susan Grant, Jan and Shawn Hughes, and Brenda Johnson. Without their help we would not be able to give the beach this service. Any other teen-age girls who would like to work with us would be very welcome. Just speak to Sandy Squire who heads our junior staff.

Miss Elizabeth Nutter from Manotick, Ontario, visiting with the Grants at 126 Birch Ave. will be the senior librarian for the first two weeks of August.

In conclusion we would like to thank all the donors of books too numerous to mention individually, and especially the Victoria Beach Club which has sponsored us this year for their generous donation of the five new book shelves and the municipality for the use of the building which they have taken a great deal of trouble and expense to fix for our use.



Cyclists!

Dear Madam:

I feel I must make some comments on an article by Harry Gibson in the *Victoria Beach Herald* of last week. He stated that of the total revenue of the municipality approximately 90 percent is contributed by summer residents and 10 percent is the share of the permanent residents, so in his view "Is it not logical to assume that the proportion of permanent and summer members on council bear some relation to this inequality?" This statement smacks of prejudice and resentment. Does he expect us to send half a councillor to make the percentage proportionate?

Mr. Gibson says: "In the uncontrollable area school costs have increased to 50 percent of the tax bill. Of this increase the council has no say." If council has no say, his argument is not valid since neither a permanent nor a summer resident council could change this.

I would like to remind anyone who shares his views, (if we are quoting percentages), that the permanent residents and our two councillors live here 100 percent of the year, while Mr. Gibson and the city councillors live here less than 10 percent of the time. Also this is a place to live, not a business corporation, and I believe it should not be operated on a shareholder basis. Look at a map and see what land area is owned by cottagers, and what percentage is the concern of permanent residents. Just because I take a holiday in Winnipeg or even own another house there does not mean I can run the city.

Over the years I have been surprised and aggravated by remarks of cottagers about paying school taxes when their children do not attend here. I don't understand how they can begrudge our children an education. I notice on our tax bill that we are paying for many of their exclusive services such as water, garbage collection, police service, and men cleaning the cottage area. For many years we have paid a high price for municipal office space on Portage Avenue. It would be much more logical and practical to have the office on municipal land at Victoria Beach. We have many well-educated residents here now that could run it too, although Mrs. Zolna does do a marvelous job. Those who own property could surely come down once to pay taxes and voting could be held on a long weekend when those concerned would be here. Council should realize that times have changed and what was good in 1915 is outdated now.

I am proud to say we have no welfare recipients here, a rare thing indeed and I would like to point out that the permanent residents have rarely been a burden on the municipality. We are self-supporting, and taxpayers should appreciate this. Also, we pay the sales tax which helps to educate city children, as well.

Personally I feel that we should not vote on the basis of where a candidate for council resides but rather on his character and abilities and interest in the welfare of others.

This sea was mine, all mine.


The sunset was beautiful to behold.
