

TO THE EDITOR

Dear Madam Editor:

Your recent issue with the letter from George Gartrell of Dryden, Ontario has been brought to my attention.

I know you share our concern for accuracy and perhaps you can help correct some misunderstandings on the part of Mr. Gartrell and others who may have read his letter.

Lake Winnipeg, in a state of nature, has varied in level literally from 708 to 718 feet above sea level since records have been kept. There are reasons to believe it has even been as high as 722 before records were started. The long term mean elevation is stated as about 713 and at the time this is written the lake is at 716.25. These are facts.

Manitoba Hydro has received a permit from the Manitoba Government to construct diversion channels and control works which will make possible the control of the lake between 711' and 715'. The actual operating pattern will be determined by the Manitoba Water Commission after public hearings have been held and submissions from interested parties considered.

Beach residents should be happy that Manitoba Hydro's Lake Winnipeg Regulation plan will stabilize water levels well within their natural range. If these controls were in operation now the lake would never have reached its' present level and in all probability would be at least two feet lower. The plan is a carefully engineered flood control program that will bring inestimable benefits to lakeside property owners.

Contrary to Mr. Gartrell's statement knowledgeable authorities in the resource area have endorsed the plan as being beneficial to fish and game. A stable lake level will be extremely valuable to lake shippers while the new diversion channels will open Playgreen Lake to commercial shipping. A simple lock at the Jen Peg control dam would give boats access to Cross Lake.

Critics might remember that all these benefits will be merely by-products to the efficient operation of the Nelson River and the Nelson is our one great energy source in Manitoba. The benefits will be obtained without cost to the taxpayer as the \$50 million cost will be met by Manitoba Hydro.

Mr. Gartrell, of course, is entitled to his opinions but he does his cause scant good when he twists or ignores the facts. Manitoba Hydro will answer all enquiries and will be pleased to provide speakers for any group interested in learning more about the Lake Winnipeg Regulation Plan.
