SAILING RACES GREAT SUCCESS

Last week the Victoria Beach Yacht Club hosted the 1971 Canadian Intermediate Sailing Championship and the provincial champions of all provinces except Newfoundland and Prince Edward Island were on hand to pit their skills against each other and Lake Winnipeg.

Preparations for this regatta started on December 9, when our Club was asked to hold this event, and innumerable meetings followed to ensure that everything would be ready on time. The Goldeye Regatta, held in the last week of June, was used as a dry run for the Intermediate. More than half of our club members chaired the various committees required and others pitched in wherever help was needed.

The various crews who came to Winnipeg by air were picked up by our transportation committee and taken to the beach. Each crew was billeted at a member's cottage, where they soon became part of the family.

The actual competition consisted of one practice race and six actual races, with each crew having the right to eliminate its worst race. The practice race was sailed on Monday morning and the first race to count Monday afternoon, followed by two on Tuesday, two on Wednesday, and the final one on Thursday morning. The conditions varied from heavy winds and seas to light, so that the visitors had an ample test of their skills.

The Club had arranged to borrow twelve Fireballs for the regatta and in an effort to equalize conditions for all, a draw for boats was held before each race on the understanding that no crew could sail the same boat twice. The crews rated the boats early, so a keen interest developed in this phase of our operation. As a side light, the race committee noted that the oldest boat available won three of the six official races.

The competition was extremely keen, with the winner not being decided until the results of the last race were known. More than one VBYC senior member was heard to say that he was happy he was not sailing against that kind of competition each week-end.

The week wound up at the Curling Rink on Thursday with a buffet dinner (hosted by the Provincial Government) and awarding of prizes. There was very little time for sitting around.

No account of this regatta would be complete without reference to the contributions of two non-Club members.

Sam McKinley came from Dauphin, complete with two Fireballs and a set of tools. The Fireballs were soon in competition and Sam worked from early Saturday to late Friday ensuring that the boats were always ready for the races. Many thanks, Sam.

Iain Smith of Western Sailcraft acted as our Chairman of July and spent a great deal of Friday sorting out the rights and wrongs of protests and breakdown claims. An unenviable task that was well performed.

It is impossible to list all those who assisted in this event but the members of the Victoria Beach Yacht Club would like each one to know that their contributions were greatly appreciated and essential to the success of the regatta. We trust that our visitors enjoyed their stay at Victoria Beach, and we know that our Club will be better for having arranged the Championship.
