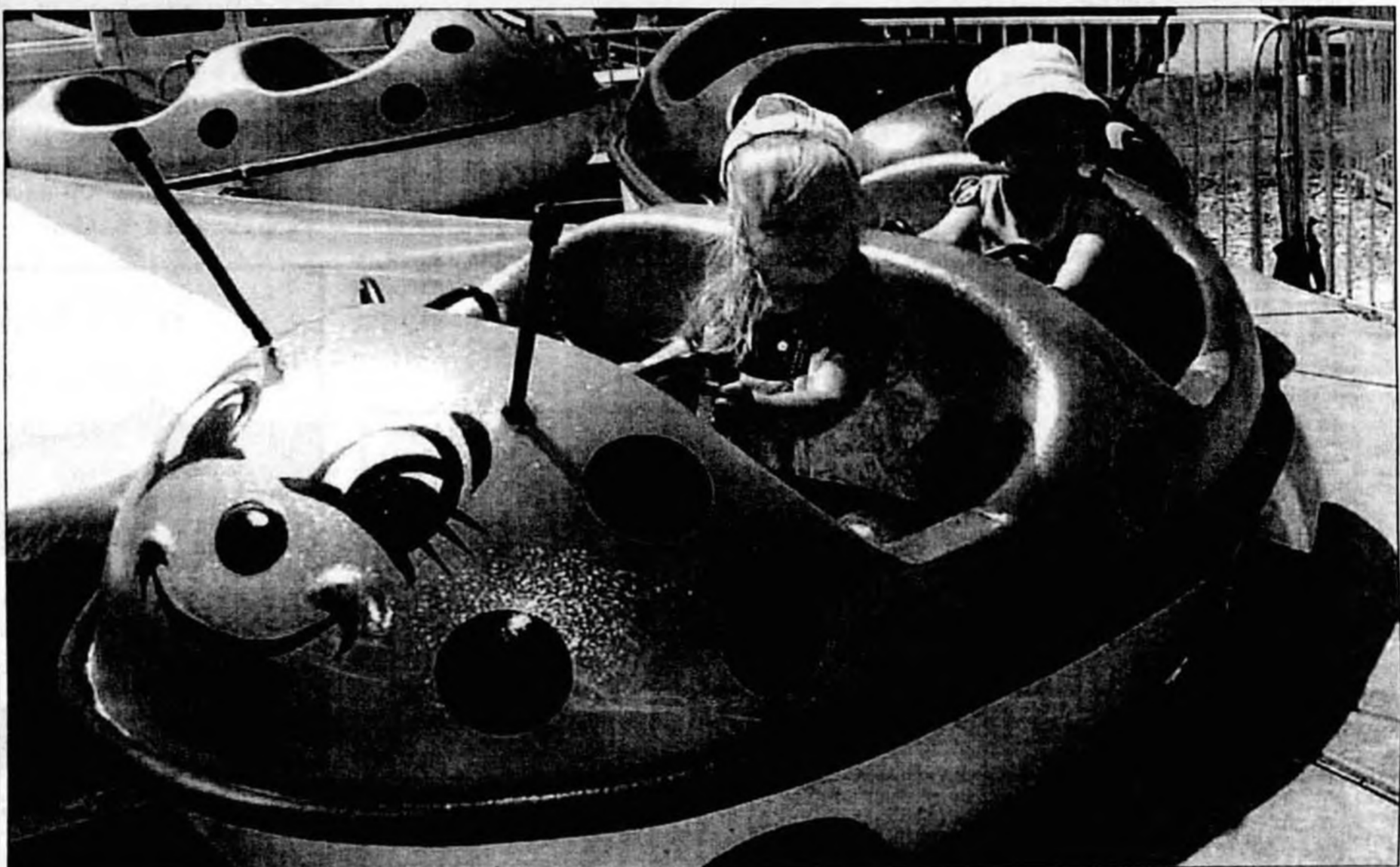
## Americans renege on Softwood Lumber Agreement

The United States and Canada came to an agreement on the five-year-old softwood lumber dispute last April. The United States had, in spite of the Free Trade Agreement, been imposing tariffs of up to 27% on softwood lumber exports to the United States. Over the term of the dispute the total collected from the illegal tariffs has reached US \$5 billion - money taken from the Canadian softwood lumber industry.

Under the terms of the agreement 80% of the tariff will be returned to Canadian producers. The balance, about US\$ one billion, will be given to their US competitors. Also under the terms of the agreement, if the US price for lumber drops below a certain price, the Canadian government will impose an export tax on Canadian exports. Canada will also be restricted to only 30% of the US market.

At the time many Canadian companies were less than enthusiastic about the deal, but agreed to it to put a stop to US tariffs on softwood lumber - the US had, in effect, been illegally

# Americans renege on Softwood Lumber Agreement

taking money out of the pockets of Canadian sawmills – and their employees.

Those Canadian companies that reluctantly agreed to the deal in April are even less than enthusiastic now. The agreement calls for 95% of Canadian producers agreeing to cancel their lawsuits against the US government for recovery of their money. At press time it appeared that the 95% figure would not be reached and that far more than five percent of Canadian companies would not accept the deal as it was finalized and initialed last week.

The problem was in the small print. Two things went wrong. First negotiators tried to finalize the agreement before the meeting between Stephen Harper and George Bush later this week. It is a complex deal, and there was just not enough time to put the agreement into acceptable le-

gal terminology. The second was that the US industry would not accept the deal and kept trying to modify it in the details. It appears they have succeeded. One of the problems lies in how the time when Canadian exports reach 30% of the US market is calculated. The effect of these clauses would be to reduce the 30% figure substantially over the long term.

The second problem has been that a clause has been inserted effectively making the seven-year agreement a two-year deal.

Many Canadian companies are in financial difficulties as a result of the dispute and the illegal actions of the US lumber industry and are in need of financial help. A two-year agreement is not something that the banks would look very favourably on if any of these companies went to the bank for interim financing while they wait for their money.

At press time the agreement was still in place but there was every indication that it would begin to unravel before next weekend.

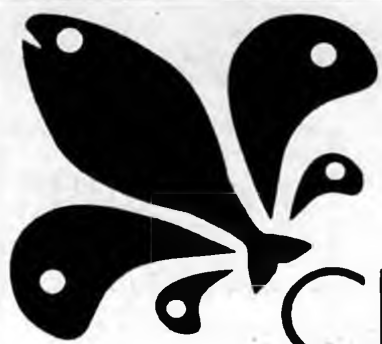

## Volunteer of the week

This week's volunteer is in the process of raising \$100,000 for a new Powerview School Playground.

Denise Cyr has lived in Powerview all her life. She attended Powerview School from Kindergarten to Grade Twelve and graduated with the Class of '83. She took a medical secretarial course at Red River and worked in the Pine Falls doctors office for eight years. Since then she has worked for Physiotherapists, first, Jenny Beturin and now with Celeste Boisson at Blue Water Physiotherapy.

Denise Cyr sat on the Board of Directors of Pine Falls Pre-School where she served as treasurer. The Pre-School, (for three and four year olds) rented space in the Pine Falls School but otherwise was not part of the Pine Falls School.

About a year ago Denise decided to do something about the Powerview School playground that has seen better days, (the swings have been there since she was at school). The Sunrise School Division, like other school divisions, no longer funds school playgrounds or play ground equipment, so she set up the Powerview School Playground Committee last September, and, with the help of Cindy Beck as Secretary, and Melinda Pluchinski as Treasurer, went to work.

Playground is not inexpensive. The committee soon found that they were looking at a cost of more than \$100,000 to replace the existing facility and build an up-to-date, safe, properly designed playground. Because of the huge cost they have decided to approach the project one step at a time, in three phases.

Phase 1, with a large playground structure, slides, monkey bars, climbing poles, an activity centre, etc., for youngsters of five to twelve years old, will cost about \$60,000. Denise hopes to have phase 1 completed by the fall of 2007, in time for the beginning of the school year.

Phase 2, with swings, see saws, and another small climbing structure will cost a further \$25,000. A 2008 completion date is hoped for.

Phase 3 will include another small play structure for children of two to five years old. It will cost another \$25,000 and will take another year to complete. The timing for the entire project depends, of course, on fundraising, but the committee



is hoping to have the project completed on schedule, with a completion date in 2009.

Mrs. Cyr said she could use help in fundraising. Those wishing to contribute directly can get a charitable receipt if checks are made out to the Sunrise School Division and identified as being for the Powerview School playground.

# Wings of Power – Still Growing Strong

I haven't written an article in quite a while and people have been asking me questions like "what's new at Wings?" and "there seems to be a lot of changes over there; what's going on?"

Well there have been a lot of changes, most of them physical ones. This has been a little disruptive for our programs and inconvenient for people wanting to shop in the thrift store, use the CAP site or drop in for coffee. We apologize for this inconvenience and thank everyone for being so patient with us.

The change process has been ongoing and started back in April 2003 when Wings of Power received Primary Health Care Transition Funding through NEHA; part of this

3 year funding included \$50,000 in capital funds to be spent in year 3 (2005-2006). In 2005 the Diocese of St. Boniface sold us the building for \$1. A \$20,000 Community Places grant was also approved last year. As with many capital projects, the process has seemed long and slow, but we are finally seeing much of the work come to completion. Some of the improvements, such as our new electric furnaces and HRV unit, may not be very visible to the public, but others like improved lighting, new windows and doors are receiving complements. We still have a few more projects waiting to be completed with this round of funding, but we are hoping to have things completed by the fall.

Another exciting change for us is the acquisition of new of-

fice and program space next door at the old Tourism House. The town is graciously renting the space to us and we have called the building "Theresa House" in honour of St. Theresa's Mission and the importance it played in the history of its parish and the town. Our Spread Your Wings program has already moved in. Spread Your Wings provides mentorship, job shadowing opportunities, teaches life skills, and offers workshops that teach Workplace Essential Skills to unemployed youth in the Blue Water region. In order to be eligible for the SYW program, youth must be between 16-29 years of age and

not completed high school.

Theresa House will also become the home base for our recently expanded One to One program. The One to One program offers day programming for developmentally challenged adults, allowing them opportunities to work and volunteer in their home community, as well as participate in fun and challenging activities that will allow them to continue to grow and succeed. Wings of Power is currently hiring staff for the One to One program, if you are interested please see the ad in this week's paper.

We are very excited about these changes but with the ad-

dition of space comes the need for furnishings. Wings of Power is looking to furnish a small sitting room and a crafting area for our One to One participants at Theresa House. Anyone having any of the following items that they would be willing to donate (in relatively good shape please) can call 367-9641 or 367-2492 - a small couch or loveseat, a wing chair (or similar sized chair), coffee table, small computer desk and chair, kitchen table and chairs, desk lamp.

We will be open as usual throughout the summer. Our hours are Monday – Friday 10 a.m. until noon and 1 – 4 p.m. We hope to see you soon!
