## Strike set for Wednesday morning

For the first time in its 76 year history there will be a strike at the Pine Falls newsprint mill.

The Steel Workers Union has been without a contract for more than a year but only recently have begun negotiations.

Those negotiations have broken down and the Union has formally notified Tembec that they will be withdrawing their labour effective, 8:00 in the morning on Wednesday, August 30th.

The Company is requesting pension cuts that would apply to existing members and members already retired and other concessions, some of which the Union says would conflict

with the Employment Standards Code.

The Union is looking for an increase in benefits and wages in line with that accepted by Eastern Mills. (Historically the Pine Falls Union has always settled for the Eastern Mills agreement). The Union are also trying to negotiate language to protect and help their disabled members.

The Employment Standards Act has provisioned for a mediator to be appointed by the Provincial Government. If the mediator is not able to resolve the dispute then a strike will take place Wednesday morning.

## George Harbottle to run again

RM of Alexander Reeve, George Harbottle, has announced that he will be seeking a third term as Reeve. He had said in May that he would not be seeking re-election in October, but he told The Echo that there are too many projects underway that he wants to see through to completion.

He is optimistic that funding

will be approved this fall for a \$4 million dollar water treatment and distribution facility to provide state-of-the-art quality water for the communities of Great Falls, St Georges, Powerview, Pine Falls and Broadlands. It will replace several coop or individual water supplies on the Winnipeg River some of which are on Boil

## Billion dollars in gold!!

Four hundred people showed up to celebrate the official opening of the San Gold Resources mining operation in Bissett last Wednesday, August 23.

After a ribbon cutting ceremony at the head shaft they moved to the curling rink for lunch and a live video of the pouring of the first gold - two bars - worth about half a million dollars each. Later, when the gold was delivered to the curling rink, many people took the once-in-a-lifetime opportu-

nity to have their picture taken with their hands on a million dollars in gold.

The new mining operation is the result of the vision of one man - 74 year-old Hugh Wynne, founder and Chairman of San Gold Resources. The full story of the Wynne family saga is worthy of a novel, but briefly, Hugh Wynne and his father found gold about two miles from the San Antonio gold mine in the early forties. With gold at \$35 an ounce there was little incentive to develop the deposit and noth-

ing much happened until recently when Wynne began drilling again to further define the ore body. As drilling continued it appeared that the find was a viable ore body but the price of gold was being kept artificially low by European national banks selling of their gold reserves.

The first Bissett mine, the San Antonio mine, began production in 1932 and shut down in 1968 after producing 1.36 million ounces of gold. In the 1990's Rea Gold purchased the

# Fatal vehicle/ pedestrian collision

The RCMP in Powerview are investigating a fatal motor vehicle/pedestrian collision that occurred shortly after 10:00pm Wednesday, August 23rd, 2006 at Sagkeeng First Nation.

A 12 year old boy from that community was struck while walking on the main road, Highway #11, by a westbound car that was attempting to pass another westbound vehicle

that had slowed for the pedestrian traffic on the road.

The boy was pronounced dead at the scene.

A 38 year old Sagkeeng First Nation resident has been taken into custody.

Alcohol is suspected to be involved.

The investigation is continuing with the assistance of the RCMP Traffic Analyst.

Water Advisories. Powerview and Pine Falls are currently supplied by water from the Tembec Newsprint Mill. Tembec have given the municipalities notice that the service will be discontinued in a few years. Harbottle has been pushing for an adequate water supply for these communities for most of his previous eight years in office.

He is also keen on seeing the East Beaches Wellness Centre get underway. He is anxious to get the Centre's business plan so that he can take it to council for consideration. He hopes that The RM of St. Clements will participate. In conjunction with this is a Public Works garage opposite Traverse Bay Corner in the same general area as the Wellness Centre. # Billion dollars in gold

property and spent about \$120 million on a new head shaft and mill upgrades. Costs were higher than anticipated and the company went bankrupt before producing any gold.

A South African Company, Harmony Gold, then took over, produced 110,000 ounces, but took the mine out of production as part of a program to cut back supply to force an increase in price. For the third time the small community had lost its major employer.

Enter Hugh Wynne. Wynne was confident that the price of gold would rise. Demand for gold exceeded production, only the selling of national gold reserves by European banks was keeping the price low. Wynne was confident that as soon as these countries stopped selling gold, and with the growth of a more affluent middle class in India and China and a corresponding increase in demand for gold jewellery the price of gold

would rise to a point where Mining in Bissett would again be a practical proposition.

He formed San Gold Resources to develop the new ore body. With the price of gold increasing, but still only about US\$300 an ounce, he cut a deal with Harmony. A new company was formed, San Gold Corporation. The assets of the new company included his own ore body, the Harmony Mine, and the 1,000 ton a day mill. Harmony would have a minor-

ity interest in the new corporation.

The price of gold kept increasing, just as Wynne was confident it would. Gold is now trading above US\$600. The Bissett property, viable at \$300 an ounce is very profitable at \$600. Also, as the price increases lower grade ore becomes viable, thus not only does the value per ton of the ore body increase, but the volume also increases.

San Gold continues to drill, and continues to find gold. Proven, probable and inferred reserves at the Rice Lake

Mine, (the old San Antonio mine) are about 600,000 ounces. The San Gold Mine reserves are about 200,000, and early results of exploration under the town itself are promising - perhaps another 100,000 ounces.

900,000 ounces at US\$600 per ounce (or \$700 Canadian) is only 630 million dollars - not the billion indicated in the headline to this article, but exploration is continuing, and the long-term trend in the price of gold is up. Before long it may very well be that Bissett is sitting on a billion dollars in gold.



## Reminder Notice of Public Hearing

### Applicant: The Manitoba Public Insurance Corporation

**APPLICANT:**

The Manitoba Public Insurance Corporation (the Corporation) has applied to The Public Utilities Board (the Board) for approval of the Corporation's 2007 base rates and premiums charged for compulsory driver and vehicle insurance. The application is being filed pursuant to *The Crown Corporations Public Review and Accountability Act* and *The Public Utilities Board Act*.

**RATE IMPACT:**

The Corporation is requesting approval for basic Autopac rates effective March 1, 2007, which would decrease its overall premium revenue by 2.6 per cent. However, the changes proposed for 2007/2008 affect average base premiums for each major vehicle use category as listed below.

These changes affect the major vehicle classes as follows:

Major Use	Number of Vehicles	Increase/Decrease
Private Passenger	654,877	-3.0%
Commercial	40,855	5.4%
Public	9,913	-2.4%
Motorcycles	9,476	8.4%
Trailers	112,659	-14.1%
Off-Road	36,306	0.0%
<b>Overall</b>	<b>864,086</b>	<b>-2.6%</b>

The impact of proposed rate adjustments on the total vehicle population is distributed as follows:

- 644,050, or 74.5% of vehicles to receive a rate decrease; most decreases are less than \$50;
- 53,439, or 6.2% of vehicles to receive no change in rate;
- 114,431, or 13.2% of vehicles to receive a rate increase of up to \$20;
- 34,032, or 4.0% of vehicles to receive an increase between \$20 and \$50;
- 11,954, or 1.4% of vehicles to receive an increase between \$50 and \$100; and,
- 6,180, or .7% of vehicles to receive an increase greater than \$100.

Actual changes to an individual's premium vary depending on the owner's claim experience, driving record, insurance use, territory and vehicle rate group. The cumulative effect of these variations on individual rates all fall within the dollar amounts described above.

No changes are proposed to fleet rebates and surcharges, existing driver's licence premiums or accident surcharges, other existing time payment fees or other existing service and transaction fees.

**PARTICULARS OF THE APPLICATION:**

The Corporation proposes the following rate adjustments for policies issued between March 1, 2007 and February 29, 2008.

- Experience-based rate adjustments ranging from +15% to -15% for individual classes, with the exception of mopeds, trailers (\$2,500 or less), and off-road vehicles.

- Combined classification offsets ranging from -3.3% to 11.1%, for all vehicles other than motorcycles, trailers and off-road vehicles, to achieve revenue neutrality.
- Capping all rate changes at 20%, except for an average increase of 94.8% for mopeds and an average decrease of 73.2% for motorcycles with a motorscooter bodystyle.
- Harmonizing rates between moped and motorcycles with a motorscooter bodystyle.

**RATE VARIATION:**

Rates for services by The Manitoba Public Insurance Corporation shall be reviewed by The Public Utilities Board under *The Public Utilities Board Act* and no change in rates for services shall be made and no new rates for services shall be introduced without the approval of The Public Utilities Board. Rates for services means in the case of The Manitoba Public Insurance Corporation, rate bases and premiums charged for compulsory driver and vehicle insurance provided by that Corporation. Upon any application to it, the Board may make an Order granting the whole or part only of the application or may grant such further or other relief in addition to or in substitution for that applied for, as fully and in all respects as if the application had been for such partial, further or other relief.

**HEARING:**

The Board will hold a public hearing at the Public Utilities Board Hearing Room, 4th Floor, 330 Portage Avenue, Winnipeg, MB, commencing at 9:00 a.m., October 2, 2006.

**PROCEDURE:**

The Board's Rules of Practice and Procedure will apply to the conduct of the General Rate Hearing. Copies of this document can be viewed on the Board's website <http://www.pub.gov.mb.ca/> or are available upon request to the Board by writing to the Secretary or by calling 945-2638 or 1-866-854-3698 (toll free).

**PARTICIPATION:**

Parties wishing to submit a brief or to express comments to the Board, but who do not wish to participate in the entire proceeding, are known as presenters. They should advise the Secretary of the Board of their intention to appear at the public hearing by no later than September 25, 2006.

"I am hoping for a dazzling season," quips Lighting/Stage Manager Barrie Burnett.


After all the performers have been signed on, it will be time for the publicity committee to begin the printing of bro-

## Open House

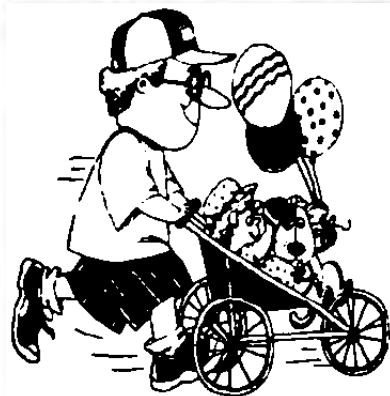

## Report from Legislature

### Crisis Management

Everyone will agree that the best way and the only way to manage is through long term planning. Set your objectives for the long term, and then slowly but surely take real concrete steps to realize those objectives. Waiting until there is a crisis and then trying to fix the problem at that point is not a solution, because it will then cost more and will not be fixed for the long term.

The NDP is clearly in crisis management mode. Our roads are deteriorating badly - this does not come as news to anyone! The roads in this Province have been crumbling and have not been properly maintained for years. Our government needed to address this 5, 6, even 7 years earlier - instead it chose to ignore the problem. No matter whom I speak to across the Province, the issue that keeps coming up time and again is "crumbling roads." If there had been proper management and long term planning, the NDP would have ensured that road maintenance and road re-construction would have occurred on an orderly basis. If this would have happened, our roads would not be in the poor condition they are today. Instead, the NDP chose to ignore what was very obvious to the rest of us.

A recent poll of Manitobans indicated that the biggest concern of Manitobans was our crumbling roads. What is the immediate reaction of the NDP? The

Premier announces that he will take \$100 Million out of the Rainy Day Fund for roads. He is now in crisis management mode. Instead of planning for a long term fix to the problem, he attempts to fix the problem for the short term by taking money out of the Province's savings account. We don't need a short term fix - what Manitobans want is a long term solution to the problem. What Manitobans want is a sure footed strategic approach and one which will guarantee a long term solution to our crumbling roads.

It's estimated by the Manitoba Heavy Construction industry that Manitoba needs to spend more than \$3 Billion over the next 10 years to renew our provincial road system and to address the problem of crumbling roads and bridges. The one-time knee jerk reaction by the NDP will not do it. The reaction by the NDP begs the question - where has the NDP been for the last 7 years? Why didn't they see this coming?

## Be Bear Smart

If you live, work or vacation in our province's great outdoors, you should know how to stay safe if you encounter a black bear.

### BEARS ARE PREPARING FOR HIBERNATION

Manitoba's black bears are eating more and as they forage for food, the potential for interacting with humans increases. Here are some tips to keep you safe and to lessen the likelihood that you will encounter a bear at your home, cottage or campsite:

- Never feed or approach a bear.
- Remove all birdfeeders from your property.
- If you have fruit trees, remove all ripened or fallen fruit in the morning and before dusk to discourage scavenging bears.
- If you're out picking fruit or berries, remember bears are attracted to these foods. Remain vigilant.
- Double-bag your garbage and place it in bear-resistant containers, a secured building or a fenced-in area.
- Don't burn your garbage. Bears may be attracted by the remains.
- Don't compost any food items. This can attract bears.

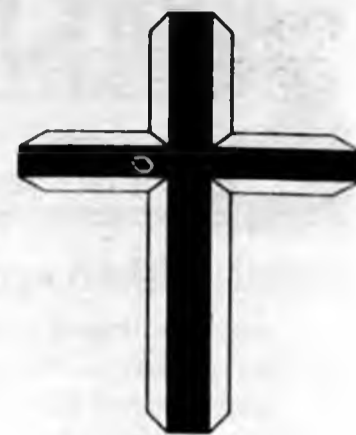

## More Than A Crutch!

# Tips to help avoid conflict with bears

Manitoba Conservation reminds people with homes, cottages or campsites in or near bear country to be bear smart.

Black bears are beginning to increase food intake as they prepare for hibernation later this fall. People may see more black bears in the woods or near their homes as bears search for maturing seasonal fruits.

By eliminating and securing anything that emits a bear-attracting odour, bears will be deterred from being lured to residences and cottages in search of an easy meal.

To safeguard individuals and property:

- Never approach or feed a bear.
- Double bag garbage and place it in a bear-resistant container, secured building or fenced area. Be sure to seal it in a way that will not allow odours to escape. When bear-proofing, remember - if it can be pried open with a crow bar, it's not bear-proof!
- Clean garbage containers regularly with bleach or ammonia to stop odours.
- Take garbage with you when leaving your home or cottage, or ask a neighbour to put out the garbage for you just before pickup.
- When practical, freeze garbage in bags and put the bags in the container just before garbage pickup and not

the night before.

- Don't burn garbage.
- Don't compost any food items.
- Take down all bird feeders between April and November.
- Clean and store barbecues after each use.
- Feed pets indoors and keep food dishes indoors as well.
- Remove all ripened or fallen fruit daily in the morning and before dusk.

Bears are a part of nature but they are wild animals and must be respected for the danger they can pose to people. When in bear country, always assume bears are around even if no recent problems have occurred.

In May, the province launched a new education and awareness public safety campaign called Bear Smart, help-



ing people understand what they can do to deter bears from associating food sources with

people and dwellings.

## Rebuilding Lebanon with Principled Middle East Policy

It was a relief to the entire world when the violence between Israel and Hezbollah terrorists ended last week, after an agreement was reached to end the hostilities at the United Nations. The new Conservative government did not shy away from its principled stand on this most recent conflict in the Middle East. We were clear in maintaining that Israel was not to blame for this outbreak of violence and worked with our international allies to press for a sustainable ceasefire.

Now that the fighting has ceased, Prime Minister Stephen Harper has demonstrated that our government is willing to back up its principled stand with real help for those suffering from circumstances beyond their control. Citizens who have been displaced by the heavy fighting need help from the international community.

That's why the Prime Minister announced a new \$25 million Lebanon Relief Fund to respond effectively to relief, early recovery, and stabilization needs in Lebanon. The two-

year fund will be used to respond to requests by the Red Cross Movement, the United Nations and other multilateral organizations and non-governmental organizations (NGOs) to address needs in Lebanon following the ceasefire. It will also enable Canada to undertake targeted stabilization and reconstruction activities.

Canada is a leader on the international stage, and it's important that we lend our support to rebuilding efforts. It is representative of our commitment to long-term stability for the region. But equally important to long-term stability is the need to condemn terrorism. We must not forget that Hezbollah was the cause of the most recent fighting, prompting this response from Israel only after years of launching rockets into Israel and culminating in the unprovoked kidnapping of Israeli soldiers.

Just a few years ago, under pressure from Conservatives, the former Liberal government joined other Western democ-

racies in listing Hezbollah as a terrorist organization under Canadian law.

It is therefore distressing to now hear a Liberal MP call for Hezbollah to be removed from this list. Borys Wrzesnewskyj, the MP for Etobicoke Centre, was asked by CBC Radio on a trip to Lebanon whether he would be in favour of changing Hezbollah's designation as a terrorist organization, to which he replied, "Yes, I would be." NDP MP Peggy Nash echoed the remarks, saying "it is just not helpful to label them a terrorist organization."

It is difficult to imagine anything more damaging for the hope of peace than to encourage the very group that is intent on the genocide of the Jewish people and the annihilation of Israel. At the same time, it's become clear that when it comes to Middle East, the policies of the opposition parties aren't based on any firm set of principles, but on whichever way the political winds happen to be blowing. To preserve Canada's credibility, the Conservative government will not de-list Hezbollah. We will maintain a principled

stand against terrorism.

# Ask the Neighbourhood Mechanic

Recently Tom Hnatiw, the big fella from TV's "DREAM CAR GARAGE" was on my radio show. He brought up an interesting point. Cars today are so reliable people are avoiding maintaining them. The new stuff out there is low maintenance not NO Maintenance. The point we're making here is, don't avoid servicing your car just because it feels "OK". Check your owner's manual

for the service requirements on your vehicle. Remember in the "snow belt" we use the severe service schedule. Another TV mechanic once said, "pay me now or pay me later". A profound statement if I ever heard one.

I have a 2000 Mazda Protégé. I have never had it undercoated. Assumed it was done at the factory. But the other day when I was washing it I thought it looked rusty underneath. Is it worth it at this point to have it undercoated

now? I plan to keep the car for several more years  
Rosanne

Mazda is a good quality car and should give you at least another five years of care free service. Undercoating the vehicle will not only stop that rusty look, it will lubricate the suspension and other components mounted under the vehicle. I recommend an annual application such as Krown Body Maintenance. Krown uses an oil spray that is applied under pressure. The application is relatively cheap and is well worth the effort.

I replaced the engine in my 2001 Dodge Intrepid last summer. The car was inactive for months. Ever since that time it has a very bad smell whenever I turn on the air system. Same smell whether its heat or air conditioning. It seems worse in damp weather. Before I take it in to a mechanic is there something simple I can do?

Hard to tell what kind of smell you are encountering. If it's coming out of the heater assembly it's usually mould or mildew. Run the system. Spray an ammonia based cleaner into the vents at the bottom of the windshield. Shut the system

down and wait 10 mins. This should kill any foreign matter that is making it's home in your HVAC system. If the smell continues you may have to dismantle the system.

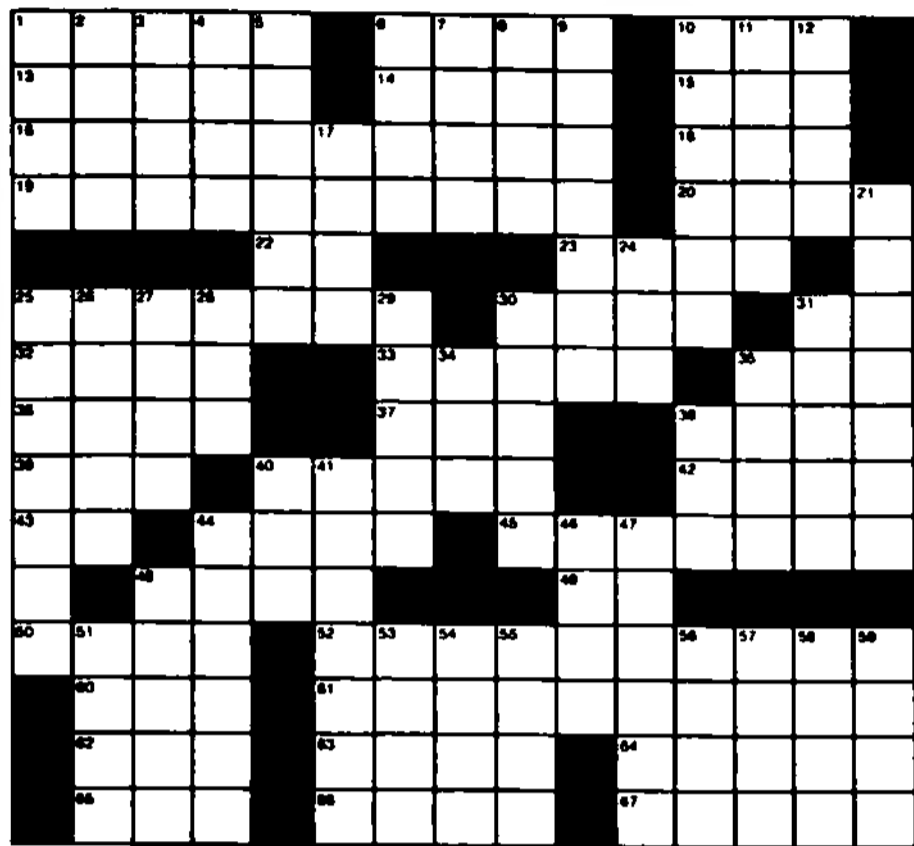

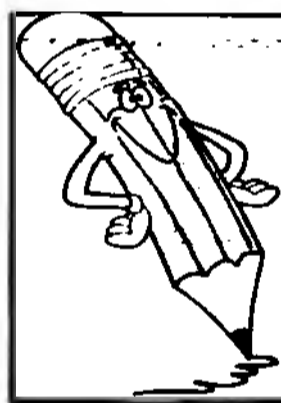

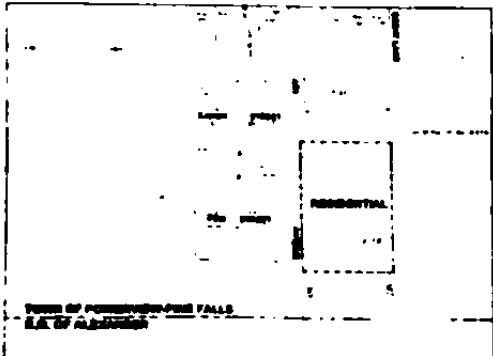
