## Cougar Spotted in Powerview

Sarah Borlase points to where she saw the wildcat last Monday.

Eight year old Sarah Borlase, who lives on Desilet Lane in Powerview, left some toys on the roof of her play house in the evening of April 20.

The next morning she remembered them and walked across the deck to get them. She saw something move in the neighbours yard.

She went back into the house to call her mother. "I saw something." Sarah told her mother, Mrs Borlase. Bonnie noticed the scared look on her daughters face. "What did you see?" she asked. "I saw a lion." She said.

It had gone by the time Mrs. Borlase got to the deck,

but there was no doubt that Sarah had seen a mountain lion, or cougar. Sarah, with her older sister Sydney, Googled cougar and found pictures of exactly what Sarah had seen. The same animal had also been seen by Danny Gelinis and by Linda Friesen at about 8:30 in the evening the night before in the bush east of Desilet Lane.

Cougars are notoriously shy of people and it is unusual for them to be seen in a populated neighbourhood, let alone to stay in the area overnight. It is not likely to have remained in the area very long. Stu Janssen, a trapper who lives in Great Falls, said cougars can travel comfortably at eight miles an hour all day, and can

easily travel a hundred miles in a day, so the likelihood of the cougar still being in the area is very small.

Asked about the possibility of there being a breeding population in the Belair Forest Janssen was skeptical. He said he had seen two kittens many years ago, but thought that most of the sightings were because of the large distances that cougars can travel.

A federal government publication, Hinterland Who's Who? Gives the eastern extent of the range of the cougar as the extreme south west of Saskatchewan. It appears that that is out of date, but cougars may still be only occasional visitors to this area.

2009/04/20

## Are We Turning Our Democracy Into a Theocracy?

At first glance that headline looks really, really far out. Government by a priesthood - like the Taliban once did in Afghanistan? Or is trying to do again in Northern Pakistan?

We are not even remotely moving in that direction. (One Ontario politician, with his eye on the Muslim vote, did suggest that Sharia be accepted, but he very quickly became an ex-politician).

It is not government by Mullahs that we have to worry about, but by the priesthood of a very new religion with very old roots. They have taken control of the press, browbeaten politicians, and have, a few months ago, succeeded in taking control of the White House, the US house of Representatives, and have almost got control of the US Senate.

I'm referring, of course, to the Greenies. The Greenies have become a powerful and probably unstoppable religious cult. They have a lust for power, and that power is being satisfied.

As a society we have turned our back on the faith that made our civilization the greatest that the world has ever known. Perhaps because of our very success, we have discovered that we don't need God any more and have failed to make a place for Him in our very prosperous society.

But "Man cannot live by bread alone..." Mankind has to have faith in something. Some can fill the vacuum by having faith in themselves - (Ego Deism - every man is his own god) - but few have that much ego. The vacuum

has to be filled - and the Greenies appear to have managed to fill the void with the worship of Mother Earth.

There is a web page dedicated to the climate change debate. It is called Climate Debate Daily, and every day features arguments for and against the man-caused global warming theory. Reading these two columns on a daily basis it is impossible not to notice the religious fervour of those on the left and the mostly balanced scientific reasoning of those on the right.

The fact is that there is no evidence whatsoever that man can change the weather. There are computer projections that say we can - and do, but their programming is not available to skeptics. Their projections have failed to come true time after time, but their self-confidence is not even dented just a little bit. I thought at one time that because we paid these scientists to tell us that the sky is falling down, we could hardly complain when they told us that the end of the world is nigh.

But I think I was being too cynical. They seem to really believe the end of the world is coming, and only they - the greenie priesthood, can save us from it.

As with other religions, we have to make sacrifices of course. We have to give up our automobiles, air travel, red meat, warm homes in winter and cool homes in summer, and of course, we have to make financial contributions to this priesthood,

so that they can spend all their time telling us how to behave to avoid the coming catastrophe.

Back to Climate Debate Daily. Yesterday, the opening paragraph on the Greenie side starts out:

"Simple messages, which make headlines and create doubt amongst the laity..... (Emphasis mine).

By the use of the word laity, (In the Catholic Church, those who are not priests or do not belong to religious orders), The author seems to be thinking of himself as part of the priesthood.

As a religion, Greenism has everything: a dogma that threatens the end of the world (which will be very hot); sacrifices; punishment; morality; and a priesthood.

David Suzuki, Canada's Greenie High Priest, a year ago called for his opponents to be put in jail. A scientific advisor to President Obama called trains taking coal to generating stations "Death Trains". Robert F. Kennedy Junior, described President Obama, (who is a Greenie himself) as an "Indentured servant to the coal industry".

## NDP & Liberals Vote to Waste more Money on Ineffective Long-Gun Registry

There is no doubt that the Liberal-initiated long-gun registry has been a boondoggle.

Even the Auditor General has stated that it has wasted taxpayers' money and contains data that is unreliable.

That is why I was so disappointed last week when three of Manitoba's four NDP MPs supported a Bloc Quebecois motion to maintain the long-gun registry, as did Liberal MP, Anita Neville.

Curiously, Churchill NDP MP Niki Ashton was in the House of Commons one minute for voting on other matters but was nowhere to be seen when it came to voting on this particular issue. And NDP MP Jim Maloway voted with the Bloc even though he claims he would like to see the long-gun registry repealed.

There are a lot of ways

that this money could be more effectively spent. The simple fact of the matter is that criminals don't register their guns.

The long-gun registry was not designed to keep firearms out of the hands of dangerous people. As all of the law-abiding firearms owners know, in order to legally acquire a firearm, stringent security and background checks must take place first. It is only after a firearm is legally acquired that it can be registered. If a dangerous person manages to slip through the cracks at the front end of firearms acquisition, the registry does nothing to fix it at the back end.

Our government continues to believe that the licensing and training of gun owners is a much better way to ensure that people are fit to own firearms. The long gun registry does nothing to

## Pension Plans

I recently asked a question in Question Period relating to the Pension Plan at the University of Manitoba. The value of the Pension Plan fell by 15.7% from the previous year due to the dramatic fall of the Stock Markets. In order to sustain the existing pension payouts to employees, the University's Plan needs an investment return of at least 6%. Anything less than 6% will mean that the capital of the fund will be required to be drawn on to make pension payments. This creates a huge problem for the Plan because maybe a year or more later when the investment returns go back to 6%, there would be less money in the Plan to earn income to meet its monthly pension obligations. The University of Manitoba has no money to make up the shortfall of funds necessary to sustain the Plan when investment returns go below 6%, and in my question, I was trying to determine how this shortfall would be made up. Would the employees be required to pay more toward their Pension Plan or would the provincial government make up the difference because of the falling investment returns?

In answer to my question, the Premier clearly indicated that when there is not

enough revenue generated by the Plan, then the Province would participate by helping replenish the value of the Plan. This means that the Province will put money into the Plan and share in the loss. This is of great concern to me and it should be of great concern to you. There is no similar protection for the vast majority of Manitobans who have no registered Pension Plan, or who may have a private Pension Plan such as an RRSP. As all of us know, the value of most private Pension Plans like RRSP's have all but evaporated with the fall of the stock market, but we don't hear anything from the Premier with respect to helping those Manitobans. This is completely unfair - because those with no Pension Plans at all, and those with only RRSP's, will be paying, as all Manitobans will, to subsidize the value of all government related Pension Plans.

## Fed/Prov Fund to Target First Nations Development

Provencher MP Vic Toews welcomed the federal contribution to the First Peoples Economic Growth Fund (FPEGF) to establish a fund that will support First Nations involvement in major resource and energy projects in Manitoba. "This innovative new fund will include investments from both the Government of Canada and the First Peoples Economic Growth Fund. It will maximize the benefits of our investment by leveraging capital from the private sector and other partners," said Toews noting that Manitoba Hydro will also provide

assistance through its Affordable Energy Fund. The Government of Canada will provide \$3 million to help establish the fund through the Major Resource and Energy Development (MRED) Investments Initiative, a pilot program run by Indian and Northern Affairs Canada. These investments are designed to help Aboriginal businesses partner in some of the most important economic developments and energy projects in the country. The First Peoples Economic Growth Fund was developed as a joint initiative between the Government of

Manitoba and the Assembly of Manitoba Chiefs. The fund is an independent not-for-profit corporation designed to provide debt and equity financing to viable First Nations business proposals in Manitoba. The fund was established in December, 2007 by the Assembly of Manitoba Chiefs and the Provincial government, with \$20.5 million over five years from provincial gaming revenue. Maximum contributions, (Loan and equity) cannot exceed \$200,000 or fifty percent of the cost of the project. Only for-profit enterprises are eligible. The federal government contribution to the fund will enable more resource and energy projects to be funded.

## Poweview Student Visits the Dominican Republic

A few years ago, I decided I wanted to travel and do some sort of humanitarian work. My parents embraced the idea of building houses for the less fortunate, and we now have the Winnipeg River Missionary Project. What began as my own personal trip became an entire community endeavor.

When I first made the decision that I was definitely going to the Dominican Republic, the support that I received from the community and the Sunrise School Division was amazing. The community opened its heart with its incredible generosity, and the school division embraced my journey as their own. The staff members helped me set up a blog so that the students and community could keep up with me and know everything that was happening. They also provided me with all the tools necessary to do so. I would like to thank all of the staff for their support and encouragement. The community is also to thank because without them we

would have never been able to raise the six thousand dollars (which we well surpassed) that was necessary to build one house. The trip itself started off a little rocky, with some flight delays and baggage drama, but we managed to make it to the Dominican all in one piece. We spent the first weekend in San Jose de Ocoa. On the Thursday night that we arrived two girls from Ile de Chene and StAdolph who were also staying in San Jose invited me to go out dancing with their group and some of the locals. It was an amazing first night. We went to a cor-

ner store and danced in the middle of the street. Children, women, men, everyone danced! I was glad I was able to get a taste of what real Dominicans do for fun because this was definitely not something I would ever be able to experience had I been staying in a resort. We worked our first day (Friday) on the compound where we were staying in San Jose. We travelled into the mountains on Saturday to visit the town and work-site where we would be staying all of the following week, and then we made the move to our home in La Demajagua on Sunday. We stayed in the local school. Men and women were all in one room. Our cook, Ellie, also stayed in our room with us. Our first day was slow going, due to the fact that there weren't any supplies on the work site. They ended up arriving around two in the afternoon, so we got working then. We would work hard during the day and head down to the "canteena" in the evenings after supper (about a ten minute walk from our school) for

music and dancing. We also had mass every evening, thanks to Father Dominic. On Wednesday, we took a break and headed up even higher into the mountains to have an authentic Dominican meal. Well, it was the best experience of the entire trip. We drove up in the box of a truck, how we normally got from point A to B, and then hiked down to a beautiful river. It was great until it started to rain just as we were ready to go home. Once the pouring rain subsided and turned into a mild drizzle, we decided to try and make it down the mountain. Unfortunately, the roads were so steep and muddy that we got stuck on the second hill. We were forced to walk down the mountain in the pouring rain. My friends and I went ahead with a few local boys and started our way down. We sang and talked and before we knew it, we were at least two miles ahead of the rest of the group. By dark, our group organizer had hopped on a motor bike and rode ahead to find us. Needless to say, everyone was freezing and cranky by

the time truck got out of the mud, which was a miracle in itself. A day or two after the trip we all decided that it was an experience we would never forget. It will be a story I will share with my children and grandchildren some day.

We worked hard the remainder of the week and then we said a tearful goodbye on Friday as we headed back to San Jose. Once in San Jose we went to the beach and visited with everyone at the compound before leaving.

We spent our last two

days in Santo Domingo, the capital city of the Dominican Republic. We had the opportunity to have lunch with the Canadian Ambassador, Patricia Fortier, who just so happens to be a Pine Falls native.

We visited the city with an amazing tour guide who not only brought us to the historical sites, but also showed us the real city, the Dominican we went to see. It was hard to imagine that there could be worse poverty than in the mountains, but as I was walking through the city, I had the realization for the first time during the


entire trip that I was in a third world country.

This trip has changed my life. It showed me who I am, and helped me realize the type of person I want to be. The way the Dominicans welcomed us in and offered us everything they had was incredible. Here were these people with barely enough food to feed their families and they were inviting us into their homes for lunch.

I have never felt so needed and appreciated as I did on this trip. The moment we arrived home, I wanted to go back. It's hard for me to live my life knowing how insignificant I am, and that I could be doing so much

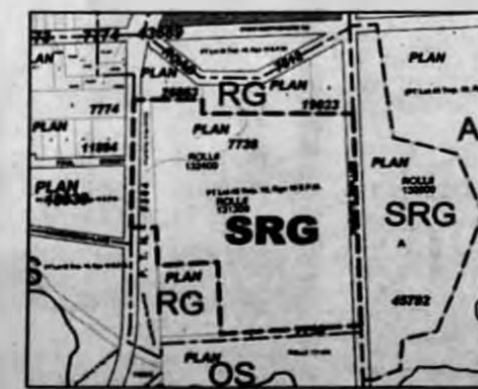

you here to water them regularly? Are there lots of deer & squirrels?" These last two questions are a really big deal here in cottage country where many plants are on their own through the week and where wild life roams free (as it should) but often into our prized garden beds.

The MacDonalds agreed that "oregano, thyme, and rosemary cut fresh just before you cook" is their first choice of herbs. Mac's personal "faves are big red juicy tomatoes that smell like tomatoes and fresh cucumbers, lettuce, spinach and green onions". Jeanie likes most flowers and veggies, "marigolds, sunflowers, geraniums and zucchini" are tops, as well as "garlic dill pickles and hot, 'hot salsas' made from our own plants".

Right now Mac is working on growing apple trees hardy to our fickle climate. The MacDonalds are expanding and by 2010, they expect to have a glass greenhouse up and ready for production. The 500 square feet which will be additional to

the current enterprise, will add months of growth to the organic vegetable that they will grow for both personal and local consumption. I asked if they would do it again. The answer, "Yes and Yes again but only sooner!"

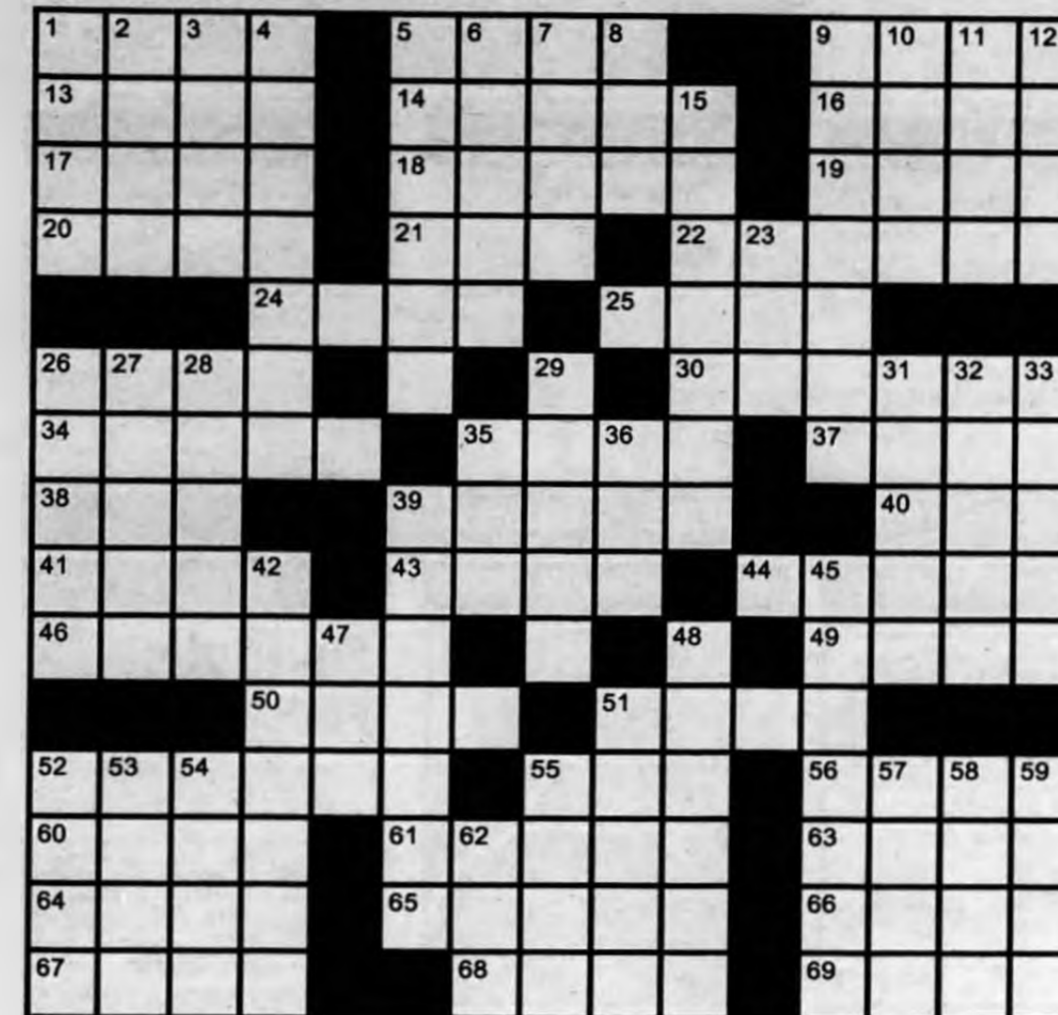
