

# harness for a river

Lake Winnipeg's restricted outlets are too small to release surplus water quickly during periods of heavy precipitation. Because of ice formation they become even more restricted during the winter. As a result excess "carry over" of water frequently tends to compound the effects of flooding during a series of years of high precipitation. The new channels shown on the map will increase the minimum winter capacity of the outlets by about 300%.

Increasing the outlet capacity will have two beneficial effects:

1. It will make extra water available in the Nelson River during the winter time to generate needed electricity.
2. It will provide an important element of control of the lake level in times of flood.

A huge electrically powered dredge is now at work

on the new channels. The longest, eight miles in length, from Playgreen Lake to Kiskittogisu Lake will be completed first. Work on the Two-Mile Channel from Lake Winnipeg to Playgreen Lake will follow. A separate contract for the Ominawin bypass has just been awarded. When completed in 1974 these channels will resemble the familiar Greater Winnipeg Floodway.

Control of the outflow of the lake will be maintained by a structure being built on the west channel of the Nelson River just above Cross Lake. As there will be a twenty-four foot "head" or fall of water at this point it will also be possible to generate appreciable power. A generating station adjoining the control structure will have capacity similar to that of the Seven Sisters plant on the Winnipeg River. The control structure is scheduled for service by late 1974 with first power to be available in 1975.







GENERATING CAPACITY AND MAXIMUM DEMAND FOR ELECTRICITY IN MANITOBA

This graph shows the growth in the use of electricity in Manitoba and how this growth is being met almost entirely by hydro generation.

In Manitoba we've become accustomed to asking for and getting as much electricity as we want. Each year we use more and the reasons, of course, are readily apparent. It saves us work—in the home, in business and in industry; it helps keep us warm; it lights our way and makes otherwise dark streets safe to walk on; it cooks our food; it does the work of many hired men on the farm; it saves lives in hospital operating rooms; it provides entertainment and a countless number of other benefits. And because we

still have an abundance of water power to develop there has been little serious thought given to restricting its use.

For the next few decades Manitoba's electrical needs will be met from hydro sources. The regulation of the Nelson River by subjecting Lake Winnipeg to control will improve the efficiency of hydro-electric plants presently in service on the river and in time others that will be constructed.

Your Hydro has carefully examined the available alternatives to hydro-electric generation. Thermal generating stations burning fossil fuels? More costly and with undesirable air and water problems. Besides, by consuming vast quantities of coal, oil and natural gas we would be aggravating an already serious energy problem. Nuclear power? Also more costly and with some undesirable side effects. Perhaps our source when all available hydro sites have been developed.

The case for hydro generation may be summarized.

1. It's clean.
2. It's self-renewing.
3. At the present time it is the most economical method available to us.
4. It doesn't necessarily destroy other resources—with proper planning it may even enhance them.

Two-thirds of the energy provided by Manitoba Hydro is used for industrial and commercial purposes. In a developing province it seems reasonable to assume that economic growth will continue for some time and will be supported by the availability of abundant low cost hydro-electric power.
