John Henry Spinks of Suite 8 - 635 Mulvey Ave., Winnipeg, — better known to all and particularly the golfers as Harry, died at the Clubhouse, here at Victoria Beach, on June 9, 1973. Harry was 75 years of age. He had a severe heart attack in September of 1972 and had been in poor health since that time.

Aided by his wife, Alice, till her death several years ago and lately by his sister-in-law, Mrs. Florence Eaton, his greatest pleasure was running an efficient golf club and growing some of the most gorgeous begonias to be seen anywhere. The approach to the Clubhouse was always a picture with beautiful arrays of colorful blooms.

Until a few years ago, Harry owned a cottage at Victoria Beach. Looking at the well established shrubs and trees on this property, one can readily see his great love of nature. For many years he was the proud recipient of the prize for the best garden at Victoria Beach.

Harry had served in both world wars and was a member of the Masonic Order — receiving his 32nd degree some years ago.

Harry strived hard to run a tight ship, as they say — and did a remarkable job of keeping everyone in line, on the course. He will be missed by so many, after his eleven years of service at the Victoria Beach golf course.

He leaves to mourn him, four sisters, Mrs. Alice Hargraves, Winnipeg, Mrs. Madge Howe, Winnipeg, Mrs. Florence Hargraves, Thunder Bay, Mrs. Lillian Hargraves, Thunder Bay; three brothers, David, Walter and William, all of Winnipeg; and a daughter, Mrs. Grace Cerny, California, U.S.A.

May a degree of credit be given — at this time, to Mrs. Florence Eaton, who is carrying on at the golf club, here at Victoria Beach, on her own. Not only is she efficient, but is also a charming little woman.

BY-LAW NO. 893

A By-law of the Rural Municipality of Victoria Beach to prohibit the discharge of fire-arms within the limits of the Municipality.

WHEREAS Section 291 of the Municipal Act impowers the Council of the Municipality to pass By-laws for preventing the firing of fire-arms within the limits of the Municipality.

AND WHEREAS the Council of the Rural Municipality of Victoria Beach deem it advisable for the protection of residents to prohibit the firing of fire-arms within the Municipality.

NOW THEREFORE The Reeve and Council of the Rural Municipality of Victoria Beach and Council assembled hereby enact as follows:

1. No person shall fire a rifle, gun, revolver, pistol, pellet gun or other fire-arm anywhere within the limits of the Rural Municipality of Victoria Beach.

2. No person shall use a catapult, sling, bow and arrow or other weapon within the limits of the Rural Municipality of Victoria Beach.

3. Notwithstanding the provisions hereof during such times in each year as it is lawful to hunt migratory game birds under the provision of "The Wild Life Act", a person may fire a type of fire-arm commonly known as a shotgun, providing such firing is contained within the limits of that portion of the Municipality known as a marsh as defined by the Wild Life Act, or on dry land if within 50 feet of the waters of any such marsh.

To Our Taxpayers:

Much of your Council's activity in 1973 has been the aftermath of "The Fire That Nobody Saw." During the night of January 14, our public works building was reduced to ruins. Ironically, inside of it was our fire truck, with two thousand gallons of water. The truck and much valuable public works equipment were destroyed, also a grader and utility truck, alongside the building, were lost. The water tower and another small building on the site were not affected.

Late in 1972, we had re-negotiated fire insurance on all municipal buildings and equipment, increasing our coverage and, while you cannot cover all your losses in a bad fire, like this one, we now have in operation another fire truck, grader and utility truck, through fair settlement from the insurance company.

This settlement, plus a grant from the Provincial Government, under the PEP program, has enabled us to erect two concrete block buildings, just west of the old school house - one for public works and another for a fire hall - without increasing taxes. We made a modest offer to the school division for purchase of the school house. It has not been accepted yet, but if we acquire it, some renovations will give us another works and storage building.

It is our hope that eventually all our municipal works will be on this new site. Our big tank is still holding water, but it cannot last for many more years and, eventually, we will be able to sell the Eighth Avenue site for building lots.

The heaviest rain storm in memory of permanent residents, early this month, caused damage to private and municipal property. The rush of water toward the lake along streets like King Edward and Arthur Roads washed away portions of the banks at the foot of these roads, and repairs are necessary and in progress.

The Village Green has been beautiful in appearance during June, and the PEP program grant has enabled us to erect a new shed, of very pleasing rustic finish, for our Parks and Recreation Department, near the tennis courts - fulfilling one of Councillor Doreen Benningen's ambitions.

The golf course is in fine shape. The good grass on the first fairway shows the results of our installing an underground sprinkler system last year. Two other fairways will have these sprinklers this summer and the system will cover all the course, eventually. We regret very much that our efficient club house manager, Harry Spinks, passed away in his sleep, June 9th, at the beach.

Removal of brush from the streets has commenced, under a contract, and should be completed before the end of June. A number of wind storms, occurring since last summer, made this a heavier operation. It is becoming increasingly expensive to remove debris and garbage, particularly the latter, and your Council urges all cottagers to lessen the difficulties of garbage removal by careful wrapping and use of containers that can be handled easily.

Unfortunately for summer cottage owners, the rebate of school taxes, granted by the Provincial Government in 1972, is not being repeated this year - only the principal residence of a taxpayer qualifies for the 1973 property tax credit. We have been able to reduce taxes by one mill, but cottage owners are compelled to pay more tax this year than they paid in 1972.

Councillors Doreen Benningen, Sam McMorris, Jim Whalley and Jack Jonsson have done a great deal of work in your interest, with due regard for an economical operation.

A happy, safe and healthful summer to all who vacation at Victoria Beach!
