

## TO THE EDITORS

In the July 4th Herald you printed the rules for the tennis courts, one of these is "Juniors (under 18) may not play on week-ends if adults waiting." WHY NOT? Whatever plausible arguments can be advanced, I feel that the real reason is that "adults" do not have as much patience as "Juniors" and since "adults" set the rules, it is simple to eliminate some of the competition by forbidding "Juniors" to play. "Juniors"! The term itself is a disgustingly patronizing euphemism which fails to conceal the basic premise that children do not have the same rights as people do. But this is false. Children are people. Under club rules they are members of the club, they may play on the tennis courts, that is their right. But because they are children (under 18) this right can be taken away if their presence causes an inconvenience to adults, who may have to wait longer for a game. How would adults react if they were told that they couldn't play on week-ends, because the courts were reserved for people over forty, or fifty, or with red hair, or without any, or with any arbitrary characteristic imagination can devise. They would quickly find other adults to make the rules, and call it the democratic process to boot! I suppose that most of your readers will consider this to be a wild over-reaction to a rather unimportant matter. I think, how-

ever, that it is significant as an example of an attitude which is very common. "Children can be treated differently from people, for no reason other than adults' convenience". I believe that children are people, and that they should be treated as people. Ask your kids if they think that children are people. If they are young enough the chances are that they have become so used to being treated as non-people that they will consider this normal — that is until the time they see the evident truth that they are people, until they recognize the injustice and the hypocrisy of adult rules, until they become, in adult vocabulary, "alienated". That bothers me, but what bothers me even more is that they may continue to consider it normal, and may grow up to be exactly like us. I hope that they don't. But if they don't, I'm selfish enough to hope that they don't hold a grudge — they'll be paying our pensions with their taxes in a few years!


