**SWIM PROGRAM '77**

We'll be getting into the swim of things on Monday, July 4th, with the commencement of swimming and water safety classes in all levels of the Red Cross Program and lifesaving classes to the level of Bronze Medallion in the Royal Lifesaving Program. Everyone from age 3 years and up (you adults too!) is encouraged to enroll in our Program. Registration will take place on Sunday, July 3rd from 1:00 to 3:30 p.m. at the Clubhouse. A membership in the Victoria Beach Club is required at registration, as well as a 25 cent fee from those persons enrolling in a Red Cross category.

Once again this summer we have 3 competent, enthusiastic instructors ready to teach our Swimming Program. They are all certified Red Cross instructors who have also obtained advanced awards from the Royal Lifesaving

Society. Christine Donovan, who taught at V.B. last summer, will be our Senior Instructor. Assisting her will be Tammy Bezte, who is also returning for a second summer, and Pam Wattis.

**COUNCIL CORNER (from the Reeve)**

Here are a few notes of interest on municipal happenings.

We have recently received approval from the Province for a labour grant of \$10,400 for non-budgeted summer projects. Much of the work will involve the removal of dead trees from right-of-ways, but will include the painting of Community clubhouses and renovations to our Public Works building.

Election day is Friday, July 29. This is an important election as under revised Provincial legislation the total Council, including Reeve, are to be elected for a three-year term. Anyone interested in serving the municipality is encouraged to obtain nomination forms from the Secretary-Treasurer. Nominations must be filed July 19 at the Winnipeg office.

Gordon Monsen is our new Public Works Superintendent and has been busily engaged in ensuring all is ship-shape for the summer season. As Gordon is a working Superintendent, he is often difficult to contact by telephone or by visiting the Public Works shop. For this reason we have extended the hours at the office located adjacent to the Parking Lot so that during July and August the office will be staffed six hours a day, including weekends from 10 to noon, 4 to 6 and 7 to 9. Messages concerning Public Works will be recorded at this office and picked-up twice daily. They may also be 'phoned there (754-2322). This office will also be open weekends during June and September, 7 to 9 p.m. on Fridays and the same six hours as shown above on every Saturday and Sunday.

I would like to pass on a thank-you to those taxpayers who took the time to write kind notes upon receiving my newsletter of June 6. Letters have been received from five Provinces. I doubt if there are many resort areas of our size in Canada that can boast of keen cottage owners spread across the country from Quebec to Vancouver Island.

Communicating with rate-payers is an important function of your Council. This is particularly the case with our municipality, it being primarily non-resident owned with an office 70 miles distant. I believe we have considerably

improved communications over the past two years. To continue encouragement of rate-payer participation, our Council meetings of July 19 and August 16, will be held at the Beach.

Last weekend a most unfortunate event occurred which has been a recurrent problem in our area. With most mink ranches closed-up for economic reasons, commercial fishing has returned as the main source of income for the few permanent residents we have left. Our fishermen are plagued by unthinking or non-comprehending, 'weekend' boaters, who are either ignorant of clearly flagged buoys marking the extremities of fish-nets, or choose to disregard them. Several nets filled with our most valuable local natural resource, were totally destroyed. Some nets were dragged over a quarter-of-a-mile from one 'gang' of nets, through another. Surely this is inexcusable. While we believe we know the culprits, prosecution is difficult. Suffice it to say that a close watch is being kept and we will spare no effort in prosecuting an offender.

There have been several complaints of motorized vehicles on our beaches. As a consequence a new By-law has been passed prohibiting such operations. Copies are posted in all stores and at the Post Office. NO motorized vehicles of any description, at any time, on any beach or upon any publicly-owned property. Our Police Department has been instructed to rigorously enforce these requirements.

We have continued complaints re pet animals, mainly dogs, roaming the Beaches. A By-law requiring animals to be on leash is flaunted by some irresponsible rate-payers who attach a short leash to their dog's collar and allow them to drag it about. I am prepared to prosecute any such incidents and, if found necessary, stiffen the wording of the by-law and its penalties.

Any suggestions for improved municipal services will be welcomed at either our Beach or Winnipeg offices, or preferably through your attending a Council meeting. Don't forget July 19 at the Sport's Club on Pine Road.
