SWIM PROGRAM '78

We'll be getting into the swim of things on Monday, July 3rd, with the commencement of swimming and water safety classes in all levels of the Red Cross Program and lifesaving to the level of the Bronze Medallion in the Royal Lifesaving Program. Everyone from age 3 years old and up (you adults too!) are encouraged to enroll in our Program. Registration will take place on Sunday, July 2nd from 1:00 to 3:30 p.m. at the Clubhouse. A membership in the Victoria Beach Club is required at registration, as well as a 25 cent fee from those persons enrolling in a Red Cross category.

Once again this summer we have 3 competent, enthusiastic instructors ready to teach our Swimming Program. They are all certified Red Cross instructors who have also obtained advanced awards from the Royal Lifesaving Society. Tammy Bezte, who has taught at V.B. for 2 summers, will be our Senior Instructor. Assisting her will be Pam Wattis, who is returning for a second summer, and Kathy Martin.

Since we have introduced some changes as well as some additions to the Swimming Program this year, we offer you the following explanations:

Beach Juniors — for those who have passed Beginners but are a little leary about swimming off the pier.

Survival — this level is between Juniors and Intermediates. All those who just passed Juniors and have never been in Intermediates will enter Survival.

Adult Beginners — for all those adults who have never learned how to swim and would like to. This is especially set up for Moms and Dads with youngsters who can also learn to swim at the same time.

Advanced Adult — this is offered for those adults who can swim in deep water. All levels are being offered and we will be the only group on the pier at that time.

Bronze Medallion — there will be 2 sessions of Bronze, both 3 weeks long. If anyone is interested in taking Bronze Cross or Award of Merit, mention it at registration.

Leaders — this is the first time it is being offered at V.B. It is open to anyone 15 years or older, who has their Bronze Medallion and who is interested in learning about swimming techniques and teaching. This course is 6 weeks long.

Seniors — all senior classes are 45 minutes long this year.

Specialty Class — each week we will concentrate on a particular theme; e.g. canoeing, synchronized swimming, etc. The first week will be Water Games.

Swim for Fun — In the past few years, participation in "Swim to Gimli" has shown a rapid decline. This year we are encouraging all levels (from Juniors up) and age groups to come and swim lengths from 4:00 to 5:00 p.m. More advanced swimmers will swim off the large pier, while others can swim off the floating dock. The objective is to see if you can swim 5, 10, or even 15 miles over the summer. The days for swimming are up to you, with the main days being Monday, Wednesday and Friday. Tuesdays and Thursdays we will concentrate on Aqua Fitness. This is again open to all levels of swimmers and all age groups, particularly adults. Workout in Aqua Fitness will be given in both shallow and deep water, depending on ability. What a perfect way to end your day on the beach and a good way to get in shape!



COUNCIL CORNER (from the Reeve)

On behalf of the Council I would like to welcome all of you to another beautiful summer of relaxation at this unique resort area with a special welcome to those coming to Victoria Beach for the first time.

Perhaps the most common topic of conversation this spring at the beach has been, once again, a dependable water supply. This column will attempt to inform you about what we are doing in this area.

As most of you are aware, in 1977 Council decided to update the water pumping system. An engineering firm was asked to prepare plans for this project which Council approved. The plans consisted of two new pumps, a new pressure tank, a remodelled pumphouse and installation of new electrical controls, as well as 400 feet of 6-inch pipe to connect the pumphouse to the existing 6-inch pipe on Eighth Avenue.

The installation of this equipment was completed by May 11th, and we planned to place the intake in the lake, in order to have the system operating for the May long weekend. Unfortunately, due to high winds which made the lake rough, this was not possible. When the intake was installed after the long weekend, and the new pumping system was tested, some modifications were found to be necessary. By the time parts were obtained and installed almost two more weeks had passed.

I am happy to be able to tell you that the system now seems to be working well and I hope we can look forward to a steady supply of water all summer.

In the future, the Council intends to look at the feasibility of a permanent installation for the lake intake as well as an improved distribution system. Since most of the pipes lie above ground, they are subject to a great deal of wear and tear. A 6-inch pipe will be installed from Patricia Road to Arthur Road on Eighth Avenue. The system distributes water from the pumphouse as far south as David's store and east to Sam Ateah's house, and to the northeast as far as the Derksen subdivision on Olafson Road.

There are 753 ordinary connections to the water system as well as six mink ranches and the golf course. It has been calculated that the present pumping system will be able to handle all of the demands of anybody adjacent to the present distribution system. How much further the system can be extended will not be known until after the summer.

The water problem has been further complicated the past two years because some of our wells are drying up, and others are unable to produce enough water to keep up to heavy weekend pressure. We will try to remedy this in the future.

Many of you may not be aware that there are two other water supply systems under the jurisdiction of the municipality. One of them supplies water from a drilled well to a number of stand pipes in the Hampton subdivision, and the other distributes water to part of the Albert Beach subdivision. The water is bought from Bert Trainor and is pumped from his artesian well at Hillside corner.

The repair and maintenance of these systems is looked after by our Public Works foreman, Ken Thomas, and his assistant, Dennis Stuckey.

This last winter Council was petitioned by a number of Wanasing Beach residents to supply piped water to that area. We are now investigating this possibility.

To answer those who have phoned about brush removal, I can report that good progress is being made by Mr. Anderson, the refuse contractor who is removing the brush piles.

This corner of the Herald will be used each week to communicate to the residents of the municipality various facets of the business of the municipality.
