**TO THE EDITOR**

In the August long weekend issue of the Herald, "Council Corner" indicated some thoughts have been expressed to move the V.B. Municipal office from its present location in Winnipeg to Victoria Beach itself, and invited comments from rate payers.

In discussing this proposal with several other fellow rate payers, I am not certain that the extreme importance of a decision on this matter has surfaced in everyone's mind and for that reason, I ask the following questions of Council:

1. What are the advantages to the summer residents who have historically been able to do their business in Winnipeg?
2. How would the total capital and operational costs compare with our present situation?
3. Victoria Beach has the highest tax structure of any summer resort area in Manitoba. Would this not tend to aggravate an already contentious situation?
4. Would our present Secretary Treasurer move to Victoria Beach on a permanent basis?
5. Would we require additional clerical staff, if, as rumored, a General Manager to administer all operations of the municipality was hired?
6. If, as rumored, a "mini" Shopping area was constructed along with Municipal offices, where the existing summer Police building is located (opposite Parking lot), would this mean the end of the "Bakers", "Grocery Store" and Moonlight Inn in the Village Green location?
7. If so, what happens to the historic meeting place for Summer residents to socialize, etc., when all you have left are the "Tennis Courts", which cater to a small proportion of our population, in comparison to the "Bakers"?
8. What happens to our daily supply of "Cinnamon Bun" and the quaint and indescribable pioneer-type feeling this area constantly provides?
9. Do we really want "modernization" at V.B., or do we want to keep it as it is and has been for you, your mother and dad, your Grandmother and your Grandfather, and on and on and on?

A few of these questions may seem irrelevant, however, they do relate in total to the things that make Victoria Beach unique.

If Council still feels that this move is desirable, then we feel that it's important enough to be decided on by the rate payers through a Referendum.
