### In Loving Memory of VICTORIA BEACH CARPENTER- CONTRACTOR J. ALBERT LARSON

Born in Stockholm, Sweden on June 4, 1888  
Died in Winnipeg, Manitoba on March 29, 1979

Albert left Stockholm, Sweden as a young man of 17 and arrived in the United States in 1905 where he worked on farms and on grain elevators over the next few years. While working on a farm with a young couple Albert concentrated on learning English to the point where he felt he was fluent enough to emigrate to Canada, which he did in 1909. Again he worked on the railway crews building grain elevators and alternately worked on farms. He quickly decided that the life he led was not for him and that he would prefer to be his own boss. The next few years were spent in achieving that dream which he continued throughout his lifetime. His first homestead was at Belair Siding about 1912, where he cut and drew cordwood for horse and sleigh from one mile north of Belair (now at Belair Siding) in the Amanda Siding (now the location of the Birchwood Hotel). The horse and sleigh were used because there were no roads or highways at that time. He kept himself busy building and maintaining fish sheds, ice sheds and the mill. He was advised by Gene Turcotte that there was some danger in using the tracks as a road. Albert replied with his dry humour that the horse and sleigh might not get off in his time but he sure would. No such incidents arose however.

Over the years as business improved Albert moved into the Victoria Beach area and worked as a carpenter-contractor using a cottage on 7th and Alexandra as a base. The cottage, while it had its own well, was not winterized. Albert found it a good base for his "batching" of tin snuffs, when called by Albert, G. S. (a very large Swede, 6 ft. 5 in., 240 lbs.) and Frank Olson would sit in a tent and play cards to while away the time. In one of these games they might be up as much as 15-25c one Sunday and the next down by 20-30c. The result of one game for Albert was a lot of 220-Rib, which subsequently became the base for his carpentry business (one room office) and later his residence when he married.

Albert and Gene Turcotte worked as a team over the years and learned from each other. Together they built many of the public cottages at Victoria Beach, Grand Beach, Belair, Hillside, etc. The Victoria Beach grocery, bakery, and railway station were only a few of the public buildings put up by this team in Victoria Beach. The Grand Beach railway station and the first dance pavilion were other buildings this team put up over the years. As well they were instrumental in forging the trails to Victoria Beach and Grand Beach which later became roads and railway tracks.

Gene lived and still does, at Traverser Bay, some 6 miles from Victoria Beach. Every Sunday and evening he would walk from Traverser Bay and back (1½ hours each way). As Gene tells it, some mornings he might oversleep and then he would have to "step on it" to be on the job by 7 a. m. He was never late either.

After winning the lot at 220-Rib, Albert built the one room office and rented out the cottage at 7th and Alexandra. After one winter he built on a room and outfitted it as a kitchen complete with fireplace (now used as the living room). A verandah was added on the following year with front steps and a small kitchen at the rear.

In the late 1920's Albert married a Winnipeg woman by the name of Florence Melmoth who used to spend her summers down here with her family. They spent the summers at Victoria Beach and the winters at Winnipeg. A son was adopted but died shortly afterwards, much to the sorrow of the young couple. Flo became ill and after a

lengthy illness died, leaving Albert a widower after only 5 years of marriage. Albert returned to Sweden for awhile and then made Victoria Beach his home again.

In 1941, Albert married Hilda Pauls, whom he met at Victoria Beach during his stay in Canada from Germany in 1925 with her mother and 3 brothers. Albert now had a 5 year old stepdaughter Shelby, from Hilda's previous marriage. In 1943, a son, Albert W was born, much in the joy of both parents and his stepmother. Albert W was now 55 and very proud to have a son.

Changes in the house at 220-Rib were now needed again. The front verandah was closed in and a front bedroom and dining room were created, with the office becoming a second bedroom and the roll-top desk being moved to a corner of the living room where it remained until Albert's retirement in 1966. The small kitchen at the rear was expanded and a back porch was added many years later by Albert and Frank Olson.

Albert was sought after as a carpenter and contractor and built hundreds of cottages at Victoria Beach as well as doing repairs and maintenance on hundreds more. While roofing one of the cottages at age 75, he fell and landed in a pile of old roofing and boards on the ground. He got up, climbed back up and finished the roof before going home for the day. The fall, however, left him somewhat stiff and he retired in 1966 at the age of 78, after over 50 years of working in this area. The cottages he built and worked on remain a living memory to the high quality and standards that he set for himself and maintained on every job he undertook.

In 1970-1, Albert began to require a closer proximity to medical care and at that time Albert Jr. and wife Irla bought the homestead at 220-Rib, while Albert and Hilda moved to a trailer in Sunnys Harbour Trailer Court. The trailer was later moved to the White Horse Trailer Park in St. Francis Xavier. The next few years saw the need for increasing medical care and Albert moved from the Misericordia Hospital to Heritage Lodge in Winnipeg, where he spent the past few years.

He was a devoted husband, father, father-in-law, and grandfather.

July, 1978 saw Albert Jr. and wife Irla return as fulltime residents, and open up Larson Welding Ltd. Albert was very pleased that his son was to carry on the Larson name and to maintain the high standards established by himself with his carpentry work.

Hilda now lives in a senior citizen's apartment in Winnipeg, daughter Shelby and grandchildren Kerry and Karmel also reside in Winnipeg. A niece, Karin Thiblen of Stockholm, Sweden complete the family left to mourn his passing.

A service was held in St. Michael's Anglican Church, Victoria Beach, on Saturday, March 31, 1979 at 2 p.m. with Canon Whitford of Pine Falls officiating and Lee Sorenson at the organ. Pallbearers were longtime friends and neighbours: Iorne Anderson, John Atch, Greg David, Glen Halgren, Al Salens and Bert Tranor.

Those who knew Albert well, will remember him as a gentle, kind man, proud of his Swedish heritage, and with a very sense of humour accompanied by a twinkle in his blue eyes. We who knew and loved him are better for the experience and mourn our loss.

### I NEVER PROMISED YOU A ROCK GARDEN

Many people are reluctant to start growing a rock garden, because so little is published about it, but I have found it a fascinating hobby. Of course it is not for those of you who are short on patience. You would perhaps do better to start with bedding rocks. I prefer starting from scratch. By that I mean scratching around the yard and finding rock sprouts. They will not be found in flat, sandy spots, but rather in small, lumpy areas covered with moss. Scratch away the moss and you will find a rock sprout. You remember of course that a "growing rock gathers no moss", so you will have to keep your rock free of moss.

Digging around your rock also tends to make them grow faster. In fact, if you dig a deep trench around your rock sprout you may find you have a big rock in no time. That method is a bit too easy and some of the fascination of rock growing is lost. I prefer a small amount of digging, and plenty of watering. The more you water it, the more it will grow. If you don't believe me, look at the large rocks I have in the back lane.

That business of pet rocks they had a few years ago is absolute nonsense, though I have seen some toll over, they always required some help. They do appreciate a few kind words now and again though, much like plants.

I have often considered starting a rock nursery, but that is very hard. Bedding rocks do not grow nearly as well as those grown from scratch. No roots, I suspect. I have often brought stones and rocks from the beach and they never seem to grow.

By my method I can't promise you a beautifully laid out rock garden, or instant results, but if you have faith, dig and water well, in time you should have a few good rocks.

Note: The Victoria Beach Municipal Council has asked for your opinion on a proposal to the Municipal Office from rented premises in Winnipeg to a yet-to-be-constructed facility at the Beach. What follows is a hypothetical news report from the V.B. Herald of August 21, 1968. Any resemblance between the fictional characters in this account and real councillors, living, dead or slated out of office, is purely coincidental.

The Minister of Municipal Affairs, the Hon. Peter Parsiminy, represented the Premier of Manitoba yesterday at the Official opening of the Victoria Beach Municipal Offices. Constructed at a cost of five million dollars, the new facility makes the municipality the envy of every town in its size in North America. The ample council chamber, with its luxurious contemporary furniture in flamingo pink nautigahue, specially imported from the Ukraine, was prudently planned to accommodate up to twenty-six councillors in the future. The Chief of Police, the Chief of Public Works, the Chief of Police, the Fire Chief, the Building Inspector, the Sanitary Engineer, the Predator-control Officer, and the heads of the departments of Public Works, Recreation and Amateur Sports, Accounting, and Land Disposal. The council gallery, with space for three hundred persons, is furnished with comfortable wooden benches, for the convenience of the frequent numerous delegations which appear to petition Council. Adjoining the mahogany courtroom are the Magistrates' offices, the office of the Chief of Police, trained in black and blue, the grey and rust and the overnight detention area. The latter was constructed primarily for those persons apprehended for offences under the Liquor Act, and is furnished in steel and porcelain. The office of the Reeve, complete with private washroom in silver and black, with gold Italian fixtures, is elegantly furnished in African ebony and red Moroccan leather. It adjoins the printing and accounting departments which are, of course, equipped with the latest in equipment and computer facilities. In the basement of the structure is parking space for 700 cars, four horse wagons, three dump trucks, two street graders and a limousine with air conditioning. A separate structure on the same grounds houses the fire department, the radio-communications service, and a fully-equipped Health Services Centre. This has a staff of four doctors, sixteen nurses, thirty-two nurses' aides, sixty-four orderlies, and one hundred and twenty-eight clerical workers. It can accommodate up to five patients, except on week ends, and during the summer. Plans to add an indoor sports centre with gymnasium, swimming pool, curling rinks and an ice hockey arena were abandoned temporarily for lack of funds.

The present facility, which will have an annual operating cost, exclusive of salaries, of \$214,000, was financed by a

five-year loan from C.M.H.C. of \$200, a public bond issue on the New York market, which raised \$1,491,000, and a \$100 million increase in property taxes for the next two hundred years. An additional 400 mil increase was voted to accommodate municipal employees' salaries and councillors' convention costs.

Reeve Sier Spender of Wausau believes the expense to be well justified. "We have created jobs for 248 local residents," he stated in a recent interview. "It is high time that country folk started to enjoy some of the benefits which city people take for granted."

The present Municipal Office in Winnipeg will be retained as an information centre for the convenience of summer residents who live in that city. It is expected to continue handling their calls at the rate of thirty-five a day at the present annual cost of less than \$4,000.00.

At last count, 319 cottages were up for sale, and 118 others had been appropriated for non-payment of taxes.
