FURTHER NOTES ON THE "CANINE KILLER" VIRUS

After further contact with a Winnipeg Veterinary clinic, the following information was brought to light. The disease was prevalent in Ontario last year and the year before on the west coast. It is possible that the disease spreads through dog shows. The disease is similar to cats with distemper and so far the only vaccine for the dogs is the "Feline distemper" shot, which will only afford about 90% protection for dogs. However it is the only shot which is being given at the present time.

The disease is passed through the stool and then becomes airborne, so that animals may pick it up by sniffing a stool. Therefore if you are concerned about your animal not picking it up, carry a doggy bag when you and your animal are out for a walk. This will decrease the amount of litter available and help to protect all dogs. It has been recommended by the vet that you keep your dog on a leash or confined to your own yard, especially while this disease is so prevalent.

Young puppies, young dogs and older dogs are especially susceptible to this strain and must be caught very early. In these animals the incubation period may be from 4-6 days. There is a very great danger of dehydration in the very young and the older dogs. In healthy dogs of middle age, the incubation period may be from 3-12 days. In either case the damage is internal and unless caught early, death may result.

The symptoms are:
1st day — decreased appetite and vomiting
2nd day — diarrhea AND VOMITING
3rd day — blood in the diarrhea, and vomiting
4th day — dehydration, and vomiting

If you are exposed to the disease, be sure to wash your clothes in hot water and Javex, wiping your shoes with the same, wash hair with a strong shampoo, before exposing yourself to your pet. If in doubt call your vet, about any unusual symptoms noticed in your pet.

WATER SAFETY WISDOM FOR PARENTS

1. Watch children whenever they are near water. Bathubs, wells and cesspools have caused fatalities when small children have been left alone for a few minutes.
2. Arrange for your children to enroll in classes to learn safe swimming. Make sure that you also know w ater safety procedures. Remember — young folk move quickly — watch them at all times!
3. Plastic toys are fun but HAZARDOUS in the water. The slightest breeze can carry them into deep water.

4. Don't allow non-swimmers to use inner tubes or inflatable supports, false confidence in these supports may cost their lives.
5. Remember — raft building, rock climbing and "show-off" activities bring many risks.
6. Even after small children learn to swim — they must still be supervised at all times
7. Do not permit swimming in unfamiliar waters. A responsible adult should check a new area for drop-offs, currents, a safe firm bottom and water purity. Remember, too, tidal waters can cut off your retreat.
8. Don't swim in the dark — it's VERY dangerous.
9. To go boating or swimming alone is risky. A child or adult may panic when no help is near. Always have a "buddy" with you.
10. Never over-estimate swimming skills — your own or others.
11. Know and teach the use of simple and safe "teaching assists." Helping someone in trouble in the water is easy — lie flat, extend and arm, leg, paddle or clothing to reach the person in difficulty. Learn how to throw a buoyant support or rescue line.
12. Plan ahead to prevent boat accidents. Don't overload a boat — it's dangerous and unnecessary. If the boat capsizes, stay with the boat and "hang-on." A boat can be seen more easily than a swimmer.
13. Life jackets can only be effective in the water if they are securely tied in advance.
14. When overheated from excessive activity, stay out of the water. Cool down before you go in.
15. Know how to administer rescue breathing. Make sure every member of your family knows this simple method of resuscitation which has saved thousands of lives.

We want you to enjoy your holiday and we know your dog is part of your family but if you care about Victoria Beach and your neighbors you will exercise strict control of your pets.


