GRAND AGGREGATE WINNER!

Each summer, the beach's finest athletic performances are scored for the grand aggregate trophies for men and women.

Based on a scoring system of 10, 8, 4 and 1, for first, second, third and participation respectively for each of six events throughout the season, recipients of the trophies are chosen. The six events are the 200 and 800 metre swims, the bicycle and cross-country races, the tennis and golf tournaments. To qualify for the trophy one has to have participated in at least four of the events, since it is awarded for over-all athletic performance.

Guest's came from British Columbia, Alberta, Saskatchewan, Ontario and many from Winnipeg and surrounding areas.

Friends they had not seen for years met to share this special occasion. A very interesting program was put on by Winnipeg friends, grandchildren and family, depicting the life of Pete and Phyllis from birth until the year 2000. It was an evening long to be remembered. They received many beautiful cards of congratulations, lovely gifts, gifts of money, also one hundred and thirty three golden Bibles were placed throughout the province in their honor.

Pete Paulson was born in Victoria Beach in Bay View. In 1925 his father & mother retired to Balsam Bay. Pete & Phyllis were married in 1930 in Winnipeg and resided in C. Hallswood until about 1933. When the depression hit they moved to Balsam Bay, built a log home on the lake front and resided there until war broke out, when Pete served in building airplane hangers in Winnipeg and other places.

After the war was over he started his own business Paulson Construction and remained in this business until 1970, when he decided to semi-retire. He purchased property in 1971 and built his home here in Victoria Beach. In 1972 he became one of the councillors on the Victoria Beach Council where he remains until the present. Mr. Paulson was one of the pioneer workers in the building and supporting of Faith Bible Camp. Mrs. Paulson has always been interested in children and young people.

She served faithfully in Faith Bible Camp, first as Teen Councillor and later as the Camp Mother. The Camp Committee presented her with a Level 1st in March 1976 for 25 years of faithful service. Mrs. Paulson also has a Young People's Group every Friday night in her home, where a number of Young People gather for games, a sing-song, a Bible study, and a snack time. The Young People all enjoy a good time together.
