**FURNITURE FACTS**

When looking for new upholstered furniture, or when determining whether to reupholster your existing furniture

**REMEMBER "THE 4 P's"**

• **FOUNDATION** (Frame & Springs)

The frame is the base on which your furniture is built. If the frame isn't strong it won't take the stress put on it by the springs. Therefore you might not be getting the proper amount of spring support in your seat or back. If it isn't solid, the crap tailored look the furniture will have when it is new won't remain.

Look for or ask for a frame made of 100% hardwood that is dowelled at all joints of stress & corner blocks. A frame made out of good hardwood (birch, elm or ash) that is cut to the proper thickness will produce a heavy piece of furniture. Grab an arm and give it a lift. You will get the idea.
