DISTURBED SLEEP

Though we have been holidaying at V.B. for over 20 years, for the first time we spent 2 weeks this summer in a cottage in the vicinities of 8th and Arthur, very close to the parking lot. Though we found it very noisy at times (by V.B. standards) particularly on weekends - what shocked me most was the apparent lack of supervision and security on the gate.

One night (in fact it was 2:40 a.m.) there was a noisy, brutal fight involving several youths. Frequently cars went up and down 8th and Arthur. Vehicles well into the wee hours of the morning and it seemed unlikely they were all taxis or cars allowed into the restricted area, and almost every night, certainly on weekends we could not avoid hearing loud, coarse, obscene language as groups of party goers made their way down Arthur from the parking lot.

Not once did I see or hear anyone in authority chastise, warn or even deal with the unpleasant events.

The reason I am bringing this to the attention of Herald readers is that for 15 years I have complacently assumed the safety and security of V.B. residents was guaranteed. Now I no longer believe this is so.

Whether the threat to the tranquility and safety of this unique summer community is coming from within or without, I firmly believe stronger supervision and policing is absolutely necessary. Yours truly,

AROUND AND ABOUT WITH THE EDITOR

Attended the swearing in of the Council. The ceremony was a silent one with the oath and declaration signing being conducted individually by Council, Fraser Campbell.

The Reeve asked that all stand for a minute of silent tribute to the two long-time summer residents who passed away this week, Victoria Wallace, mother of Doda Dennis, on Tuesday, August 10 and I. P. Ivanov who suffered a heart attack on the pier while fishing on Wednesday morning, August 12.

The Council changed hats for a session as a Board of Hearing regarding a requested variance to building standards. This request was made by a Mr. Ivanchuk and by Mr. Zelenski himself for EJEM sub-division. Mr. Deacon counsel for Doerken sub-division argued against granting the variance and a petition of 32 signatures was presented by a cottage owner, Mr. Dickson, on behalf of McTav Property owners.

The Board moved to continue the hearing at the next regular meeting of council in September giving time for study of the pleas.

Reverting back to council the Reeve heard about water problems. One cottage owner on Pine Road at the highest point, had had no water at all. Cottage owners in the Kennedy Division are being asked not to use lawn sprinklers during daylight hours.

References to mosquito abatement were heard, particularly larviciding. To be at all effective this would have to be done for some distance around the Municipality and in the lagoon area. The chemicals in use today would probably have an effect on the fish in the lagoon area. No decisions were made.

Mr. Ron Storozyk, past president of the Victoria Beach Club, welcomed the new council and new member paying tribute to the unselfishness of these people who give time and energy to a demanding task.

Council passed a motion to seek professional advice regarding an uplift for our water system so it will meet all demands of the near future.

Another motion (by John Ateah) was passed to hire additional help to clean the beaches if men could not be spared from Public Works. Two councillors will look into the dead fish situation.

Council approved the grant of \$500 for the Gull Course budget to allow for the development of a new green on the fairway now being cleared.

Attended the V.B. Club General Summer Meeting in the clubhouse last Sunday. There were 35 present. President John Lewis presented all volunteers with certificates of appreciation.

During the question period several concerns were raised bringing forth a healthy discussion. One concern was the heat in the clubhouse. It was hot last Sunday, and the suggestion of roof breathers was a good one. The ceiling fans do some good but are really only delivering the hot air collected above down to floor level. There is need for an escape route at the top. The Bridge group asked for inner screen doors and a fan.

Another concern was the timing of the masquerade. Several spoke against the 10 p.m. time and for the evening time as was in vogue several years ago. Others spoke of costumes evidently being ones used in the city or purchased ones. They asked that next year's event revert to the earlier practice of limiting costumes to materials found at the cottage.

A third concern was in respect of the adult and teen dances. There were too many in the clubhouse creating a fire hazard.

The under-aged were being given alcoholic drinks. An inspector would cause loss of liquor permits, smoking at dances, a fire hazard, and a displeasure to non-smokers.

One suggestion was to have a family dance with no liquor.

A TRIBUTE

Ivan Pavlovitch Ivanov died this week here at Victoria Beach. He can never be far from our thoughts as we walk through the Village Green past his 1970 Centennial Fountain, bequeathed to all of us here in his deep appreciation to Canada for the peace, security and happiness he and his family has found here.

Mr. Ivanov was born in Central Russia at the end of the last century. He always hoped to study Fine Arts, but the First World War and the Russian Revolution found him an officer in the Imperial Armies of the Czar. After the Bolshevik victory, he escaped and settled in Yugoslavia to rebuild his life there. However the Second World War and the Communist Regime of Marshall Tito, drove him to follow his daughter, Mrs. I. Kobesew to Canada and finally Victoria Beach.

It was my good fortune to find Mr. Ivanov at their cottage on Eighth during the summer of 1969. I admired his garden, his miniature castle and his many sculptured works of art. In spite of the language barrier we became instant friends and through Dimitri Ivanoff, we were able to discuss the possibility of a Centennial fountain. When I visited him in the spring I found he had spent the winter sculpting the 39 pound fish, the six frogs and the two fisher boys. All that was left to do was to build the fountain base and walls. In this end, beach boys and girls gathered stones from the beach, Public Works brought sand, cement and a hand mixer. The month of July that year rivalled this summer for sunny hot weather, but it did not stop 74 year old Ivan from toiling in the sun from eight until five Monday through Saturday. On Sunday August 2, nearly two hundred persons gathered on the Green to take part in the dedication of the beautiful fountain. Maria Kobesew, his granddaughter and interpreter read his remarks which concluded with "I hope everybody will enjoy and cherish my creation."

Thank you Ivan Pavlovitch and all your family. We will remember
