**VICTORIA BEACH MUNICIPALITY CARDIAC
 DEFIBRILLATOR FUND**

Over the past years, several physicians who have been employed by the municipality, as well as several members of the medical community who reside at Victoria Beach, have raised major concerns about the lack of certain items of modern medical equipment required to provide an acceptable level of care for the critically ill. Several physicians attending patients in the municipality have been frustrated because they have not been able to provide appropriate front-line care to patients critically ill from cardiopulmonary arrests, heart attacks, motor vehicle accidents, etc. One piece of equipment urgently required is a monitor-defibrillator. This portable machine enables the physician to diagnose severe heart attacks and heart beat irregularities as well as being able to convert lethal heart rhythms by electrical countershock. It can also serve as a transport monitor for the critically ill to higher level medical facilities.

During the winter of this year, a medical advisory committee was created to review existing medical equipment and make constructive suggestions to council regarding the present facility. In addition the committee set out ways to raise funds to purchase a cardiac monitor-defibrillator. Twelve thousand dollars is required for the purchase of this urgently needed equipment. Several approaches to raise the monies were entertained. Rather than raising taxes or placing a mandatory medical fee on the 1400 cabin owners in the municipality, it was decided to go the volunteer donation route. An initial donation of \$1,300.00 was received from the many friends of the late Victoria Wallace. A mailing was sent out with the tax notices to all cabin owners for additional donation. In total, as you have appreciated, \$4,000.00 or one third of the monies required for the machine.

Other agencies of funding have been pursued by Dr. Doug Coate thru the Manitoba Health Services Commission. Despite the City of Winnipeg Ambulance service now all being equipped with defibrillators, support from this area does not appear promising in the immediate future.

This letter is a further appeal to the people of our municipality to send donations to help us reach our goal. In view of the immense generosity of a large majority of people to successfully raise over \$40,000.00 to build and upgrade the much needed tennis facility, I would think that

fund raising to purchase equipment of such a serious nature should not be difficult.

The people of V. B. municipalities deserve emergency care at a level acceptable to modern day medical standards. Please be generous. This equipment is of utmost importance. Please send your donations made out to the R.M. of Victoria Beach, 304-281 Portage Ave., Winnipeg, R3B 2M5, and specify that it is for the Cardiac Defibrillator Fund. A tax receipt will be issued.

I asked about the sale of milk and learned that the milk marketing Board has changed the rules. There are no more rebates but there is restricted pricing and still the cost of refrigeration and bags. The margin of profit is very small per litre.

As to prices, if one looks at comparable stores like Len's at Albert Beach or the one at Grand Beach there is little difference, I'm told. And one must remember our store is open slightly more than 2 months of the year while the one at Albert Beach is open the 12 months.

Then as to produce, The problem is one of warm air. Our store has two fans to move the air around but no air conditioning and no cooler to keep the produce fresh. Fruit and vegetables arrive in excellent condition but by the second day have dehydrated. There is much waste and therefore loss of revenue. So little quantities. Also, I learned goods cannot be returned at the end of the season. They are auctioned off!

I asked about hired help, and I notice all of it - some 7 boys and girls - are sons and daughters of V.B. residents. In round figures these people earned \$7,000 last summer. Longer opening hours would increase this overhead item.

Now the problem with my looking at the situation is that some readers might say "sour grapes" of Fred and I know that is not deserving. My curiosity prompted my original comments. I believe we are fortunate in having this couple provide us with such clean conveniences.

Thanks to Joe Maloney for providing a new Canadian flag at the Yacht Club on July 1st.


