## BIRDS ON THE BEACH

Due to the variety of habitat found at Victoria Beach, the area supports a large bird population. The marsh along the causeway is home to gulls, black birds, sparrows and the like, while the forested cottage area hosts numerous flycatchers, warblers, and juncos, birds which are more often heard than seen in the dense foliage.

Perhaps the birds on the lake are most obvious to us and without a doubt every V.B.er knows the American White Pelican. More of these huge birds breed in Manitoba than in any other state of province. They winter in the southern United States and Mexico and start arriving in Manitoba in mid-April. Most nest in colonies on small islands in our large lakes and they may feed as much as 100 or 200 kilometers away from there. No pelicans breed in the immediate vicinity of Victoria Beach.

Pelicans are masterful fliers. On migration they make extensive use of thermally rising masses of warm air — to carry them upward. When flying in formation they use air currents produced by the bird immediately ahead of them to give them lift.

Next time you see a string of pelicans flying low over the water, watch the leader. When it stops flapping and starts gliding, number two will follow suit a fraction of a second later and so on down the line. When the lead bird starts beating its wings again, so will the rest — one after the other.

With the pelicans we often find Double-crested Cormorants. Superficially these birds look like large black ducks, hence the name "Crow Duck" — think of the lake by that name in the Whiteshell.

They are, however, not related to ducks and have no close relatives at all in our province. Like the pelican, they are fish-eaters, but the fish are caught by diving under water. Swimming cormorants can be recognized because their bodies are usually largely submerged and the longer, slender bill is held up at an angle. Cormorants arrive at about the same time in spring as the pelicans and often breed in the same colonies.

The common merganser is a duck that breeds regularly at Victoria Beach. Fortunately, their young have hatched by the time most people arrive during the July long weekend. A female and her brood frequented Arthur and Patricia Beaches during and after that time. On June 30 there were eight downy young, some of them riding on their mother's back. On July 2, seven juveniles were left, one of which was hopelessly lost. When they are so small, the young have little chance of survival when they stray from the mother bird. A large gull would have no difficulty in dispatching the tiny ball of fluff.

The merganser is shaped somewhat like a cormorant, but is a bit smaller and largely greyish with a rusty, crested head. The male is a black and white bird, but not being much of a family man, he has already left the female long ago, shortly after mating.

Gulls and terns patrol the shoreline. Terns look like oversized swallows with long narrow wings and forked tails. They are all white, except for a black crown. Most often we see the Forster's Tern wheeling and diving from some height to catch a little minkie. Occasionally its larger cousin, the Caspian Tern, can be spotted. It is almost as big as a Herring Gull, with a massive, red, dagger-shaped bill. The Herring and Ring-billed Gulls that waddle along the shores are less elegant than the terns, lack the black crowns, and have a tan bit of black in the wingtips. Please, don't call them sea-gulls — many of these birds will never see the sea in their lives!

So, check out the birds next time you're at the beach!

## Editor's Note

I asked Rudy to write this article for the Herald because just about everyone who comes annually or occasionally to Victoria Beach takes an interest in the many interesting birds that can be seen as one lessensail on the sand. Mr. Koes is a well-known authority on birds and is co-author of *Birds - Guide to South Eastern Manitoba* and wrote the Manitoba Section in *Bird Findings Guide to Canada*, as well as numerous articles and periodicals on this most interesting subject.

Mr. Koes is a member of the Manitoba Naturalist Society and is teaching at Gordon Bell High School in Winnipeg. Rudy has been coming to Victoria Beach with his family since the early 70's. About Victoria Beach, he says, "I just love it!"
