Grants of \$500 each were given to the Victoria Beach Sports Club, Victoria Beach Club, Senior Citizens Club and the Faith Bible Camp.

All areas of the beach were reported to be running smoothly.

- Some of the concerns put to council are:
1. The affect of a proposed subdivision in Bayview on the bird life in the marsh. Could Council consider buying and preserving the land?
  2. Could dirt bikes be banned? Some families are still ignoring the by-laws that bikes must be walked to the trails.
  3. Did our new assessment have anything to do with the \$35,000 rise in our school assessment?
  4. Is the V.B. Grocers to be only a convenience store?
  5. It was recommended that Council buy a vegetable cooler for the store.
  6. Burning brush at the old V. causing some residents discomfort due to smoke.
  7. Signs on beach should say "dogs on leash" not "no dogs."
  8. Deep cuts on 6th Avenue.
  9. Bait trapping in swamp.

- The Merys Makers, as usual, served coffee, soft drinks and bakers sweets at hall time.

## THE PARTY'S OVER... OR IS IT?

It was a day of excitement, enjoyment and community spirit! Early Saturday morning the left and Gerry's team could be heard readily from my home on Pine as they hurriedly set up for the expected afternoon crowd.

I visited the Village Green about 1 p.m. and talked to Gerry. Denchley first: "How is it going, Gerry?"

"Fine, but our (second?) mustard pump is not working on the mustard bottles. Do you have something we might put that (second?) mustard on?"

"Sure Gerry, I'll bring you something. How about a 4 litre ice cream container?" Gerry smiled and I told him I would return with it shortly.

Crossing the Green I walked out, to see left Quinton who was busy with a crew setting up the stage for the afternoon's entertainment.

"How's it going, left?"

"I'm! Do you have a couple of boards we could use to help balance off the underpinning of the stage?"

"Yes, I believe I do. Come on over to my place if you want them."

With that I left the Green and visited the Clubhouse. George Mackay was busy repairing some of the benches and patching up the old floor boards for the evening's dance.

"How are you doing, George?"

"Good - just getting a few things done for tonight."

And that is the spirit with which those men and women who have undertaken various tasks for the V.B.C. take on these often formidable tasks.

It was about 2:30 and I walked home to get some chairs and a table and set up for the distribution of Herald's near the Centennial Park Flower Garden. By the time I got there the crowd was beginning to form. The skies were partly cloudy but the sun was strong and a light breeze moved gently through the Village Green.

As the entertainment began, the crowd relaxed and the Centennial Park became alive again, as it had many times ago when the weekend specials wheeled in looting their

welcome to all. Not since the last train pulled out in 1962 has the Village Green seen such activity and revelry.

Long queues formed in front of the Pork Barbecue stands and hungry holidayers paraded with their pork plates and goodies back to their chairs near the stage.

Well, I didn't run but on my first opportunity I let them know.

As the afternoon lapsed into memory, I left the Village Green and met Randy Clark our official photographer and drove down to Bert Franor's Landing Field. Warren Terfith of Huskey Gas Ltd. donated a plane to carry Randy and me off into the wild blue yonder to take some aerial photos for the Herald of what was developing on the Green.

Our pilot was Louis Ludwig who is also the Associate Director of Emergency at the Health Science Centre. Louis was a good pilot. I said to myself knowing that he had already flown across to us from Kamilo. I had nothing to fear.

And really, I didn't! It was a wonderful flight, three of four last sweeps over the peninsula, a little wing flapping over the Village Green and down we were. But not before my mind was entranced with the beauty of that which was below and which we daily pass without too much notice.

If you have not yet had the joy and the thrill of flying in a small plane high above this beach, try it. It's a pleasure and an experience you'll long remember.

After our flight we returned to the festivities at the park. The crowd was at its peak and the some 1000 birthday parties were having a super time.

The crowd around the stage was well into the swing of the music and songs but yet had the time to chat and smile as they mingled and renewed acquaintances. The Barbecue lines were thinning but there were still crowds there.

As the sun slowly wrapped the 10th in shadows about 7:05, Mrs. Doreen Hennings, Honorary President of V.B.C. Reeve Dr. I. Sam McMorris of R.M.V.B. and President George Mackay of the V.B.C. spoke to the party guests. Mrs. Hennings pointed out from me it was that the Centennial Park had developed into what it was intended to be by its builders and how so many of the small trees and shrubs had grown over the past number of years to provide us with both beauty and shade. Reeve McMorris wished the V.B.C. a Happy 10th Birthday and asked all of those present to continue on with the strong tradition of volunteer workers which had always worked so well for us. President George Mackay thanked the organizers and got a tremendous round of applause when he mentioned that a lot of people would like to see something like what transpired today happen every year.

The beautiful cake donated by Chuck Entfeld was cut and children of all ages, in a reasonably orderly fashion queued up to sample the birthday goodies.

As the crowd thinned, good byes were said, and many reluctant to leave, stayed on, perhaps not wanting the day to end or perhaps just enjoying the thoughts of it all.

As we walked across the Village Green later in the evening to the Bash 'n' Splash Dance all was back in order. The garbage barrels were neatly stacked and waiting Monday morning pickup. Anyone coming down late and missing the birthday party would not have known "that we had a party" and that the spirit of this beach is alive. And strong and we do like to get together like we did - every once in a while. Thank you V.Bers, you did it again!
