Sailing School News
The Mobile Sailing School, held over the last two weeks, has been quite successful. 13 students participated in the "Learn to Sail" program this year.

Applications forms for the "Optimist" sailing school are now available at the Yacht Club and 35 Gibson Drive (Ph. #754-8292). This program is designed for children from 8-11 years of age, and will be held on the weekend of July 25 & 26. Class times are from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. both days.

The registration fee for this program is \$35.00. Cheques should be made payable to the Victoria Beach Yacht Club. As there is only space available for 10 students, applications should be in as soon as possible.

The Optimist Program is approved by the Canadian Yachting Association. It consists of instruction both on and off the water. On land, the students will be taught how to rig and de-rig the boats. On the water, they will learn how to set the sails, tack, jibe, etc. in all, the students will receive 12 hours of instruction.

The Manitoba Sailing Association will provide 10 Optimist dinghies, as well as personal flotation devices for all the students. Students are to bring the following: bathing suits, windbreakers, shorts, towels, and lunch.


