Aunt Vickie's Recipe Corner**THRIFTY HAM CASSEROLE**

1 8 oz. pkg. small flat noodles

1 small green pepper, chopped

2 small onions, chopped

1 tbsp. butter

1-1/2 10 oz. cans mushroom soup

1 19 oz. can tomatoes, partially drained

2 cups leftover ham, cut into 1 inch cubes, or 2 cans flaked tuna

Potato chips, crushed

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. Cook noodles according to the directions on the package. Sauté green pepper and onions in butter. Mix soup, tomatoes, ham, onions and green pepper together. Place half the noodles in a two quart casserole and cover with half the soup mixture. Repeat layers. Top with crushed potato chips. Bake for 30 minutes. Yield: 6-8 servings.

ROCKY ROAD FUDGE

2 cups semi-sweet chocolate chips

1 can sweetened condensed milk

2 tbsp. butter or margarine

2 tsp. vanilla

1 pkg. Kraft miniature marshmallows

2 cups baking peanuts

Melt chocolate chips, butter and milk in a large pot. Cool. Add the vanilla, marshmallows and peanuts. Butter 9x13 inch pan, add mixture and let set. Cut into squares.

Victoria Beach Spawns Top-Calibre Boardsailors

Feel the breeze? The wind is coming up and off they go — the King Edward and Connaught Beach wave-assault teams! Their brilliantly coloured sails provide a spectacular sight as they whiz by — "getting air" and doing duck jibes.

The varying winds and waves on Lake Winnipeg provide a wide variety of conditions and we have one of the best locations in Canada for the development of boardsailing skills. Many of our youth spend hours on the lake, honing their skills in the exciting sport of windsurfing, which will be an Olympic event in Seoul this September, with 56 countries represented in boardsailing, the highest in any event.

Several of our youth have participated in training camps and regattas this summer. At the "MIST" camp and regatta for sailors 16 and under, Mathew Heiman placed 3rd, Pat Jones 4th, and Kelly McCaig 5th. A large Victoria Beach contingent, managed by Bob Marshall, will be representing the Winnipeg region at the Manitoba Summer Games at Pinawa, August 19-21. There will be eleven boardsailors on both the men's and women's teams. On the women's team, V.B. is represented by Lisa Huget, Donna Mathieson, Amy McCaig, Deb McKibbin, Patricia Richardson and Donna Swystun. The men's team includes Mathew Heiman, Jamie Huget, Brian Matthews, Kelly McCaig and Scott McDonald.

Most weekends will find these young sailors travelling to regattas throughout Manitoba and abroad. Scott McDonald recently placed 3rd in the heavyweight division at the North American Regatta in North Dakota. The Manitoba Championships at Grand Beach August 6th & 7th saw a number of V.B. youths excel. Mathew Heiman won the 16 and under category; Jamie Huget placed 3rd in the "B" Fleet and Donna Mathieson was 3rd in the female 18 and under. Murray McCaig, winner of the Governor's Cup at Gilmi this July, has just returned from a 2-week training camp for boardsurfing in Lorient, France. For the next three weeks, Murray will be participating in the Canadian Division II Championship in Aylmer, Quebec, the Canadian Olympic Regatta at Kingston (C.O.R.K.) and the Mistral North American Championships in Collingwood, Ontario.

In all, it has been a great summer for our "board heads" — hearty congratulations to all of them.



Letter to the Council

To the Reeve and Members of Council
R.M. of Victoria Beach
Dear Sirs and Madam:

Having very recently become a cottage owner at Victoria Beach, I am writing to question and express concern about the lack of lifesaving equipment at both the Government Pier and on the beaches. As a newcomer I admit I am not aware of the background to this situation or with whom the responsibility for such equipment would rest, but I am sure that the concerns of the residents of Victoria Beach must also be the concerns of Council.

As a mother of three young children involved in swimming lessons and a toddler as well, I am frequently on the pier, as even the four year olds have had classes there. The swimming instructors deserve nothing but praise for their hard work, dedication and enthusiasm. The children enjoy their lessons so much that the pier and deep water swimming have become of great interest to them. This interest, combined with the already aesthetic attractions of the pier make it a very popular spot for both young and old. The more the pier is used, the greater the potential for accidents. Low water conditions have increased the danger of a fall into the water. Climbing out of the water again would appear to be almost impossible even under favourable weather and water conditions.

For these reasons I feel it is imperative that life preservers with ropes attached be readily available at various locations both on the main pier and smaller docks. Ladders should also be maintained from the deck surface to below water level on all sides of the pier. If the responsibility for such equipment is that of the Federal Government, then a request should be made on behalf of the Municipality. One near accident occurred recently when a child inadvertently stepped backwards off one of the small docks. She landed, by chance, in a boat. Such a fall from the main pier could have been fatal.

During this, my first "whole summer" spent at Victoria Beach, several "old timers" have warned by family of the danger of undertows, even under moderate weather conditions depending on wind direction. No one has been able to explain why life saving equipment is not available on any of the beaches. If experience and low water conditions have proved that the main beaches are safe, would not the more hazardous areas warrant such equipment?

I ask you to consider the concerns expressed in this letter. Accident prevention concerns us all.

P.S. Pollution of the water around the pier and smaller docks due to the use of the area by boats could be the subject of another investigation. Boats have been seen releasing water containing what appears to be raw sewage into the lake while docked. The presence of such sewage, plus the oil and gas in the water makes one wonder whether the docking of boats and swimming lessons for young children are compatible uses of the same area.
