Some Personal and Happy Memories  
of Life at Victoria Beach, 1921 to 1960  
James R. Mitchell

**A Special Experience-continued**

One of his tests, which I have always remembered and pose to young children, was: "We have two parents, four grandparents, eight great grand-parents, and so on, but assuming we all started from Adam and Eve, where is the turning point from multiple ancestors to go back to only two people?"

I also recall having an argument with Mrs. Young who insisted I go to bed at nine o'clock, which was definitely not my habit then! She won. There was no daylight saving time then so I did not have to go to bed in the daylight.

In those days it was the custom to try and sell the return half of the rail ticket. The CNR would never entertain the notion of issuing a one way ticket for seventy-five cents, or even a dollar. I managed to impress Mr. Young by my ability to sell his "stub" for fifty cents, thus making his trip to the Lake only seventy-five cents. In theory, it was illegal, but the railway never made any attempt to stop the practice.

**The Newspaper Services**

In this modern day of rapid communication of news by radio and television, it is hard to believe that the only way, back in the twenties and thirties, to obtain news was by the newspapers which had to come on the trains. Both the Free Press and the Tribune kept an active and competitive delivery service at the lake resorts to keep their customers and to provide the news service. Consequently, getting a job as a newspaper carrier was sought after eagerly by the boys who spent the summer at the Lake. Rewards were given for "starts" and payment for deliveries was a little higher than in the city. Collecting had to be done every week because of the weekly turnover of some cottagers, both renters and owners, so it was the responsibility of the carrier to get his money before the customer's departure. A weekly subscription was twentyfive cents.

Both newspapers had an agent at Victoria Beach. They were senior teenagers and university students. They got a fee for every newspaper sold, and, besides providing home delivery, supplied the stores. A hustler could make a lot of money, especially when the Free Press had a good morning newspaper that would arrive on the noon train and could be delivered entirely by the agent. The Tribune agent was not as lucky.

The evening newspaper was more popular however, but, due to the late arrival of the train at 8:45 p.m. (before daylight saving time) it was necessary to distribute the papers quickly. Hence a cadre of lads delivering by bike in the dark. I must confess I was never associated with a female delivery "person". No one wanted a paper delivered later than an hour after train arrival. Most Fridays the papers came on the through train, arriving an hour earlier, but the CNR occasionally fouled up on that.

I started at the age of eleven with a very small route with the Tribune. Next year, under "Pinky" Thurston, I had a better route with the Free Press, and the following year I started to deliver for his successor, John Teakles ("Tea-kettle"), later a Rhodes scholar. When I was sixteen John turned over the agency to me. After an interview with Mr. Cameron, the circulation manager, I was hired.

That year the Free Press discontinued its morning paper. Nevertheless, I did quite well financially, although not as well as John who had really pushed the morning paper. It was quite fascinating talking to Mr. Cameron, a very friendly man and not the least bit

gruff as one might expect, and the man directly responsible for shipping the newspapers, Mr. Trivonoff, who was well known, in the amateur boxing circles, and, I believe, was awarded a Hall of Fame citation.

It was a real hassle when the train arrived. First, we had to coax the baggage man to give us our papers at once so we could start selling on the platform. Sometimes he held back so the CNR "newsies" could get onto the platform before us and get rid of their unsold papers. Most of the baggagemen were as great as long as we followed their rules of safety. It was a temptation to grab the bundles of newspapers before the train had stopped if they had been placed at the open door.

I wore a bright red beret so people would recognize me. (The beret came from Paris, a gift from Edith who had studied there.) One or two carriers were given the privilege of selling on the platform - the roster was rotated - while I counted out each carrier's supply. Roger Smith was my right hand man and actually had a bigger route than mine, but I preferred Sunset, 1st, 2nd and 3rd avenues, the stores and the busy Victoria Beach Inn. I could do all that and be finished by 9:45.

It was up to me to estimate my daily requirements but I was encouraged not to run short and was allowed a limited number of unsold papers without charge. The big deal was Saturday. The papers arrived on the afternoon through train. I paid two cents for every paper for the Saturday papers up to the number I had ordered for Friday. Over that order I paid five cents. The Saturday paper was always popular and we could count on considerable extra cash sales. By overestimating my Friday order in a discreet manner and obtaining the Saturday papers for two cents, I could sell a lot of Saturday papers at ten cents. Weekday papers were five cents, and, as I noted before, a weekly subscription twenty-five cents. At the height of the season weekly orders were about 250 and Saturdays 300 or more.

On Monday mornings the carriers would report to me and pay for the papers I had given them and I would pay them for new "starts". The Free Press Company was very fair in reimbursing for these. I in turn would pay the Free Press, set up my new orders and expect another week.

Except for Saturday and Monday mornings, most of the days were free for fun and games. As mentioned earlier, I took over the management of the Clubhouse as well and had a willing crew help me with this until I finished my paper route. Then it was dancing until 11:30 or midnight and home to bed. No wonder I was always skinny!

Before radios appeared on the scene in the later thirties, "extra" newspapers used to come to announce some portentous happening. These were always fun but they lost their impact and ceased to be printed. Another perk with the newspaper was being the local reporter. This was also fun and gave me a chance to learn how to make up a story. We were paid by the line and by his position in the newspaper.

The story I remember best was a small brush fire that was reported by me, unintentionally, much out of proportion to its size, and, fortunately to my advantage, enhanced by some photos I persuaded the photographer to sell to Mr. Cameron who just happened to be at the Lake that week-end, and I was well paid with no complaints from the editor.

**Early Radio**

Battery-operated radios (tube type of course) appeared on the scene in the mid-thirties. The radio unit was fairly small but the batteries were either a series of large dry cells ("A" batteries) or a "wet" battery something like a car battery, but smaller, cheaper and not rechargeable. Either type was a nuisance but it was great to get

radio reception, and, with a long aerial strung up outside, we could even get Chicago in the afternoon and more American stations at night.

Several of my family and friends will remember how we (including Dad) were all gathered about the radio in the garden on a Sunday afternoon to hear Chamberlain's famous speech on his return from Germany in 1939. He stated that there would not be war in our time, only to see it declared soon after that.

The advent of radios did not affect the newspaper business, because in those days the papers contained considerable local news (other than police and court reports), excellent features and good editorials. The Free Press was always a Liberal paper, the Tribune a Conservative.

**The "Valtannis"**

Walter Thomas, referred to earlier, started a new venture in the mid-thirties by leasing a motor boat the "Valtannis" which could carry about forty people and he began charter trips to Pine Falls and to Black River (north of the Winnipeg River, but south of Manitowagon) which could be completed in one day. I loved these trips and hit upon the idea of chartering the boat for ourselves in late August, paying my carriers' way as a form of reward but persuading them to invite their families and friends to fill the boat. We would take picnic lunches, our bathing suits for swimming under the Black River Falls, and, on two occasions, two or three canoes so we could explore the river. The last time I looked in the Victoria Beach Clubhouse there was a large photograph depicting one of these trips. I also have several photos of a group of us in my files.

**The Ateah Family**

No story about Victoria Beach can leave out the relationship with the Ateah family. Their story is recounted most vividly in "Cedars of Lebanon" by Laela (Lily) Ateah (Trainor) Lester, the eldest daughter. It was published in 1951. Her sisters, Sophia, Freda, Louise, Pansy and Margaret were very close to the Mitchell family, and the brothers, Alfred, Eddy, Sammy and John were all involved in some way with us. Alfred was my hero.

Alfred's handsome Lebanese features, coupled with a height of over six feet, a tremendous physique and a very gentle manner made him a most extraordinary man. His wife, Grace, went to Dad for maternity care, and, as Alfred had no money then, he built beautiful curved stone steps for 311 First Avenue, incorporating very flat stones he brought back from his secret location in Traverse Bay. Later he built a large flat rock table for the garden that was about three feet square. It was mounted on a sturdy wooden base which I am now informed, has rotted and requires replacement.

He invited me to work on his mink ranch that he started from wild mink he had captured, and, as he gradually improved his finances would breed with good quality ranch bred mink. Eventually all his family became mink breeders specializing in different mutations of very high quality. I would pedal across the entire Victoria Beach peninsula to Traverse Bay and his farm. This route led up the present highway. East of the present turn in the highway where I heads west to the parking lot was quite marshy. Up to that point it was very sandy. Both conditions made it difficult going. It was an early morning trip and I would spend the entire day there doing various jobs but I had lined up for me. I invested some money in the ranch and in return he would take me to fur auctions in Winnipeg in the winter where he would sell his pelts and give me a cheque. He had asked him to stop the payments after I had realized two or three hundred percent on my small investment.
