During the weekend of August 5-6, a member of the Provincial Environment Department from Selkirk arrived in Victoria Beach and placarded some of the wells with handpumps, saying the water from these wells should be boiled before using. This was because he had received reports from the laboratory where we send the water for testing that there were too many bacteria in the water.

The municipality was not notified of this action, and had not received the reports from the laboratory. On August 8th this information was publicized through the media. On August 10th, the reeve received an apology from the environment department in Selkirk, because the municipality had not been notified of the action that was taken. Some of the wells now have metal placards on them requesting boiling before use. These wells do not have enough water in them to dilute the bacteria to a safe level and even chlorinating may not make them satisfactory. Many of them have only six to twelve inches of water.

The water in the water distribution system, which includes the stand pipes, is not affected — only the water from the wells with hand pumps.

Canine Corner
Grooming Tip
To keep your dog clean between baths and professional grooming visits, brush frequently. This keeps the hair in good condition by stimulating the skin and removing dead hair. Do not skip from one area to another. Do each section thoroughly. Moisten coat by using a spray bottle filled with water before and during brushing. Damp hair is more manageable. Work mats and tangles loose with fingers and wet tooth comb. After bath blot gently to prevent matting. If you have to give your dog a pill, first give it a little bit of peanut butter. Then give it a little more, but this time with the pill in it. If your dog chewing on something it shouldn't be? Put a little tabasco sauce on the article. Most lost dogs are found within a 10 mile radius. Be sure to contact your nearest schools, ask your vet, contact radio, newspaper and humane society and put notices on all available bulletin boards at supermarkets and malls.
