



Your response to the "first responders" bicycle registration fundraiser has been overwhelming! The campaign to buy equipment for our Victoria Beach Ambulance — and first responders began last Saturday. 500 "individually numbered" "non-removable" vinyl weather-proof stickers were purchased to be sold at the cost of \$4 each. Their purpose is to identify your bike if it is lost or stolen. The numbers are recorded at our local police station. The very first day we not only paid our costs to have these made — but we raised over \$2000! Special thanks to the most generous donations of special people (who will be recognized at a later date) and special thanks to the 200 people who purchased stickers — and now have "registered" bicycles.


