**Soft Drink Container Recycling:
Good for the Air We Breathe**

We all know that recycling preserves resources and reduces waste going to landfill, but there is another benefit to recycling. Recycling of used soft drink containers helps us breathe a lot easier.

Recent studies indicate that for every 100 pounds of aluminum soft drink cans recycled, emissions to the atmosphere are reduced by 4 pounds. Similarly for every 66 pound of plastic soft drink bottles recycled, emissions to the atmosphere are reduced by .06 pounds.

These figures are based on the reduced manufacturing time required to make new products out of these recycled materials versus using virgin materials to make new products.

Based on the materials Manitobans recycled through Manitoba Soft Drink Recycling in 1989, emissions going into the atmosphere were reduced by over 23,000 pounds.

Beverage containers are only a small part of the waste we generate every day (less than 1%), but they are a big part of the recycling solution.

Keep up the good effort, V.B.ers!



The play facility shown on the cover of the last issue is a new facility which was built June 23, 1990 as a result of a perceived need for additional play facilities for the age group 2-12. Come out and enjoy a weekend of fun tennis on new courts — as a participant or as a fan. Let's beat last year's entry of 157.




