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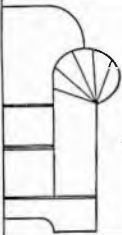

Irresponsible Parking

It has come to my attention and observance that we have a growing parking problem at the parking lot. Although the vast majority of those who use our lot have respect for other vehicles as well as their own, there are those who continue to be a hazard. One common problem is parking too close to the edges of lanes that are continually used. Not only does this create an obstruction for motor vehicles, bicycles and pedestrians, but it accelerates the risk and probability of a serious accident. To date there has not been a policy of towing such vehicles away, but it is among some resolutions being considered. Other vehicles are parked behind cars wedging them in. Should these owners suddenly need their vehicles, there is no means of contacting the inconsiderate drivers to have them remove their vehicles. Motorists that park parallel to the lanes are using up two spaces and during busy weekends the lot fills to capacity. Remember also that there is no reserved parking. Bicycles left in lots for those temporarily vacating the beach and returning later are taking up much needed spaces. These bicycles can be removed by those needing a spot to park although drivers are reluctant to do so.

All we ask is that you take care and responsibility when you enter, park inside or leave our lot because there are always children, moving vehicles and cyclists around. Our record has been good. We do not want to report an accident or injury because of some irresponsible parking.

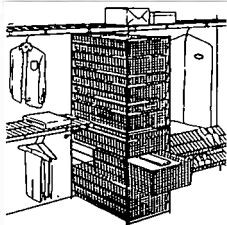
1990 Cash Calendar Winners
