



The New Fifth Hole

Anyone who has been on the golf course this year is well aware that a new fifth hole has been constructed. The hole which was the inspiration of Sam McMorris was a two year project. It was begun in the fall of 1989 when Jim Chapel cleared the land. During six days in July a crew of V.B. youth aged 13 to 17 under the supervision of John Evans spread 235 yards of top soil and laid 9000 square yards of Kentucky blue grass sod, quite an amazing feat.

The hole will now be 275 yards, a par 4 with a slight dog leg to the right. The existing green will be used. Its elevated grassed tee box will be the first at the beach.

Two rows of sprinkler heads have been installed so this fairway should always be green. (Our other fairways have only one row of sprinkler heads and thus have brown patches if special care is not given). The grass is lush and green and the root system seems to be well established. By 1991 the new hole will be in use and our course will be a par 30.

(For the non-golfers — no we didn't want to be unique and have a ten hole golf course. The existing fifth and sixth fairways are so close that golfers are constantly hooking or slicing their balls and landing on the wrong fairway. Now we should all be safe from our fellow golfers straying balls.)

Council Corner

Many residents have asked why they have not yet had a bill for water for the 1990 season. Council has been waiting for the Public Utilities Board to set the rates for the 1990 season. On Aug. 8, the Public Utilities Board had a public meeting, when they heard presentations regarding the water rates. They have advised us that we will hear from them in about one month, following which, the municipality will send out water bills to all ratepayers.

Cottage owners are reminded to disconnect their water connection, no later than Thanksgiving.

Come on any Monday at 2 p.m. sharp and enjoy our new super sorting tables that our Public Works employees made for us. Thank you for your continuing support.


