The new swim dock is working out very well. We feel it is a safer place for our children to be taking their lessons. Some guidelines to improve its safety are:

- 1) All bicycles are to be left in the bike racks across the road from the dock.
- 2) Only students taking lessons are allowed on the dock. Parents are asked to watch from the bank. Too many people on the dock at one time make it unstable.
- 3) Students are asked to wait along the walkway until their instructor is ready for them. They are to leave the dock as soon as their lesson is over.

By following these simple rules we will be helping our instructors to do their jobs.

Patrick Peacock is back as head instructor. Our new instructors are Tanya Shewchuk and Andrea Sampson. Lindsey Peacock will be teaching the minnow classes. As the new swimming convener, I look forward to working with them to help make our young people water-wise.

Earth Corps

Earth Corps will be bringing the Community Bicycle Project to Victoria Beach, starting the third week in July. Earth Corps is a non-profit environmental group based in the Winnipeg inner-city. The Community Bicycle project was initiated this year as an encouragement for motorists to try bicycling as an alternative transportation.

Earth Corps volunteers collect donations of used bicycles from the public, and repair and paint the two-wheelers. The 'white bikes' are then deposited at a variety of locations throughout the city, mostly in the core areas. There is no fee or restriction on the use of the Community Bicycles, other than encouragement to ride safely and obey all traffic laws. "All we ask is for people to leave the bike where someone else can borrow it," says Terry Madden, one of the founding members of Earth Corps. "The project depends on people helping keep the bikes in circulation!" Madden adds that Community Bicycles needing repair should be reported to Earth Corps.

How is the group funded? "We went door to door asking for things until someone said 'yes,'" answers Madden. Bicycle and office furniture donations, a lenient landlord and "lots of people who give lots of their time" are the essential ingredients. Canvassing the Winnipeg public for memberships and sponsorships has provided most of the cash. A \$3,000 grant from PLURA, an interfaith association, is the only outside funding received by the group for the Community Bicycle project.

Why the interest in Victoria Beach? "We feel it is an excellent example for the city of Winnipeg," notes Doug Pratt, the group's Canvas Director. "A program like the Victoria Beach community is running is very encouraging to us."

Aunt Vickie's Cookery Column

After a day in the sun, it's good to come home to an easy dinner. Although salad makings are not easy to keep, here are a few suggestions.

TRADITIONAL TOMATO ASPIC

1 tbs. gelatine (1 pkg.)
1/4 c. cold water
2 c. tomato juice
1 tbs. lemon juice (optional)
1 tsp. green onion, finely chopped
1 tsp. white sugar
1/2 tsp. salt
a few drops of Tabasco
dash of pepper, cayenne and celery salt

Soak gelatine in cold water for 5 minutes. Heat tomato juice to boiling; remove from heat. Add soaked gelatine; stir until dissolved. Add all remaining ingredients. Pour into mould or bowl and chill until set.

BRIDE'S SALAD

2 cucumbers, medium size
2 tbs. gelatine (2 pkg.)
1/2 c. cold water
3/4 c. boiling water
6 tbs. lemon juice
1 tbs. grated lemon rind
2 tsp. grated onion
1 tsp. white sugar
1/2 tsp. salt
dash of paprika

Peel and grate (or blend) cucumbers; there should be about 4 cups of pulp and juice. Soak gelatine in cold water for 5 minutes; dissolve in boiling water. Add lemon juice and rind, grated onion, sugar, salt and paprika; stir in grated cucumber. Chill until mixture begins to set. Stir and pour into mould. Serve with sliced raw vegetables — tomatoes, cucumbers, zucchini or green peppers.

VARIATIONS ON BRIDE'S SALAD

Mix ingredients as above. Then cool mixture and fold in 1 cup of cottage cheese or sour cream. Let set.
